MUMBAI, (IANS) Actor Shilpa Shetty Kundra, amid an ongoing controversy involving her businessman husband Raj Kundra, has posted a cryptic message on social media about making mistakes. Raj Kundra has come under the radar for his reported connection to a pornography racket. He was recently remanded to judicial custody for several days. Shilpa on Thursday shared an excerpt from a book on her Instagram Stories.

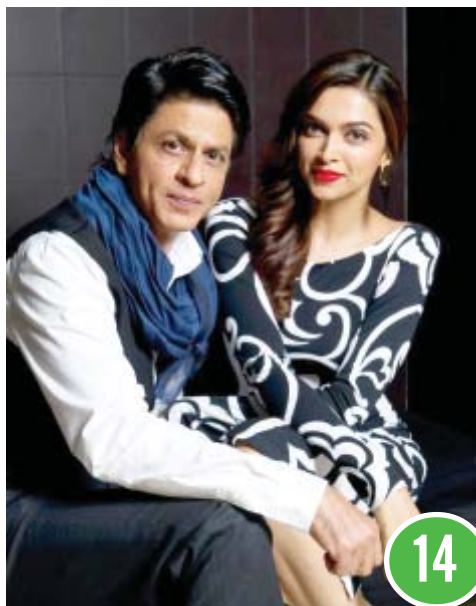

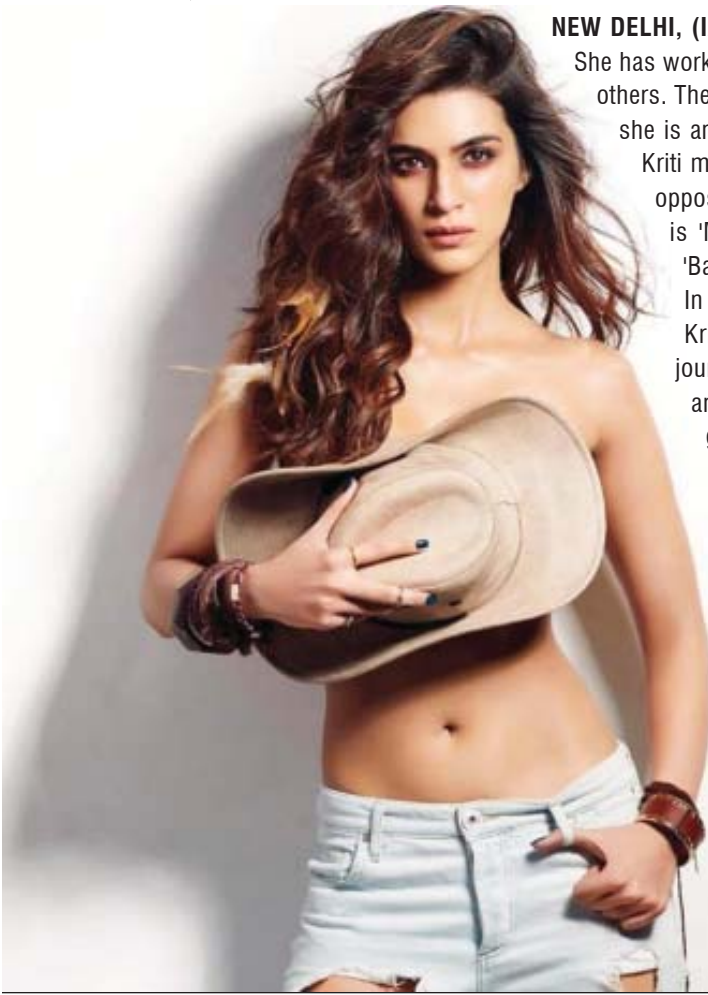

KRITI SANON: NOT SATISFIED WITH WHERE I AM, THERE'S A LOT MORE TO DISCOVER



NEW DELHI, (IANS) Kriti Sanon has found her feet in Hindi cinema in just seven years. She has worked on hits such as 'Heropanti', 'Bareilly Ki Barfi' and 'LukkaChuppi' among others. The actress does not want to stop as she says she is not satisfied with where she is and is sure that there is still a lot more inside of her to discover.

Kriti made her Bollywood debut in 2014 with 'Heropanti', where she was paired opposite actor Tiger Shroff. Looking forward, the actress, whose latest release is 'Mimi' has her diary full as her line-up includes 'Hum Do Humare Do', 'Bachchan Pandey', 'Bhediya' and 'Adipurush'.

In a chat with IANS, Kriti spoke about how she sees her journey in Bollywood. Kriti said: "I think my journey has been very fruitful and I believe that your journey should have an upward curve and a graph it shouldn't go stagnant at any point. There should be something that you are constantly learning and growing and I am not from a film background and I didn't think of becoming an actor for the longest time."

The 31-year-old actress, who secured a degree in Electronics and Telecommunication Engineering, added: "I am an engineer, who happened to find her luck in acting and found what she is meant to do. With Dimpy (her character in 'Heropanti'), I was still finding my way and mark I have always been a thinker so I tend to think and question a lot. I want to learn."

Kriti is also a "quick learner" and says she wants to grow. The actress said: "I want to become better than what I am already doing and that has always been a driving force for me. I am just happy to see that I have grown I have learned a lot more about my craft. I know a lot more emotions and acting as a process of a craft of mine."

"I am not satisfied with where I am, I am sure that there is still a lot more inside me to discover. So, that is what is exciting."

MANOJ BAJPAYEE ON WHY HE WON'T EVER STAR IN 'KAUN?' REMAKE

NEW DELHI, (IANS) Manoj Bajpayee has given many memorable performances, one being the thriller "Kaun?", which was released in 1999. The National Award-winning actor has revealed as to why he would not star in the remake of the film, if it is ever made.

"Kaun?", a psychological thriller directed by Ram Gopal Varma, also featured Urmila Matondkar and Sushant Singh in key roles. The film tells the tale of a serial killer and another individual locked up in the same house on a stormy evening.

ENGROSSING THRILLER UPLIFTED BY BIG B’S MAGNIFICENCE

“This decadence of human values and humanity has to stop.” Close your eyes and imagine who can best utter these dialogues in precise English, with the correct emotion and the perfect posture. A handful of actors, with Amitabh Bachchan topping the list. Think of ‘Chehre’ as a thriller with a long monologue attached to it, with the Bachchan baritone emphasizing the various ways in which justice has failed us as a society, whether it is rape, acid attacks, or terror. Or think of it as a monologue with a thriller attached to it. Either way, it is an engrossing movie, with Bachchan in fine fettle. Here’s the thing. A fairly ho-hum thriller can be redeemed by great actors. ‘Chehre’ has many of them. Dhritiman Chatterjee, who makes even the most mundane dialogue sound meaningful; Annu Kapoor, with his ebullience dialled down and his acting skills dialled up; Raghubir Yadav, playing a version of his best act, the sad clown; and Emraan Hashmi, who has left his serial-kissing image far behind and notches up solid performances every time he makes an appearance on the big and small screen. There’s even Rhea Chakraborty, as a mysterious housekeeper with more than a touch of trauma. But towering over them all is Bachchan, who still gets the kind of opening scene reserved only for reigning superstars, accompanied by thunder, loud sound effects, and dialogues such as: “Woh apne aap main hi toofan hai (the man is a storm in himself).” Accessorized with a beard ponytail, no doubt soon to be a fashion trend; a hand-knitted beret; and Tom Ford glasses that clearly help him see his victim better, he plays the prosecuting lawyer, intent on



proving Hashmi’s guilt in what starts out as a mock trial, but develops into something more sinister. The atmosphere adds to the unfolding enigma: snow, candles, a fireplace, and an agent who has a way with meat choppers. No wonder poor Hashmi looks terrified, his initial swagger deserting him as he realizes his past is going to catch up with him. Because it is a Bachchan movie, there has to be a message. The inherent misogyny of the plot is swept aside by the monologue, which seems an extension from the one in ‘Pink’ (2016), where again Bachchan played a lawyer. It makes a case for punishing those who get away by blaming or abusing the system. “We do not have justice here, we have judgment,” says Bachchan’s character, adding that in their court, “Lady Justice is not blind. In our court, she is able to see, hear, think and speak.” If he worried about encouraging a certain kind of vigilantism, Bachchan doesn’t seem to be too concerned. Such bloodlust, after all, is very much in tune with the national mood, which scoffs at candle-lit marches and flower-bedecked crime sites. The gang of four in the movie positions itself as a sort of after-trial court that steps in when the candles melt and the flowers wilt. Is it enjoyable? When is administering a strong dose of justice to slippery characters not enjoyable? Rumi Jafry, the director, keeps the pace going, with the screen characters knocking back drinks as easily as they unravel the case. Is it worth a visit to the theatre? Yes, just to remind ourselves that there is more to Bachchan than the KBC Uncle or Alexa’s voice.

Sunny Leone foresees good year with 'Shero', 'Anamika'

GURUGRAM (HARYANA), (IANS) International porn star-turned-Bollywood actress Sunny Leone sounded all excited on Saturday night about her next film, Sreejith Vijayan’s Tamil psychological thriller ‘Shero’, and the MX Player web series by Vikram Bhatt, ‘Anamika’. Fielding questions by journalists at a perfume launch, Leone said ‘Anamika’ “wrapped just yesterday”. Looking back at the 10-part web series, she said: “I am very excited it has finally been completed. It’s gonna be a good year. I call it a ‘working year’. which is perfect because we were all locked down. Vikram Bhatt, the director of the series and a member of the famous Bhatt family, has previously been known for his films ‘Ghulam’ and ‘Raaz’.



Pankaj Tripathi: Don't want to bore people by being too much in the media
MUMBAI, (IANS) Be it in web series, web films, or features, actor Pankaj Tripathi is one of the names who is ruling the hearts of the Hindi heartland with his work. While most of the actors, to maintain their visibility and popularity use media and social media extensively, Pankaj says he rather prefers to maintain a balance and distance from media unless he has a project, because he fears that his fans might feel bored of seeing him too often. Pankaj told IANS: “As an individual I like meeting people, travelling and explore different places and gather experience from life along with spending time with my family. That is typically me. So, when I am not shooting for my work, if I have to extensively be visible on social media or other media platforms, I feel, what if I am overexposed as an actor and what if my fans get bored of me?” “Since I started my career in acting from zero, there was a time, when I would really wish and pray that someone would notice my work, some film critic will mention my name and I will see my name in print, in the newspaper. Now that after a struggle of 10 years, I have got everything, I want to respect all the love I have got. Also, I am quite an organic person so cannot really wear a face of a celebrity. I love visiting my village, farming, travelling, watching films, spending time with my daughter etc.” Starting his career in 2003, after working in around 60 shows on television, Pankaj got his Bollywood breakthrough with ‘Gangs of Wasseypur - Part 1’ in which he played the character of Salman Qureshi. Since then there was no looking back and in the last two years during lockdown, he had several projects on release. Pankaj has appeared in films like - ‘Angrezi Medium’, ‘Extraction’, ‘Gunjan Saxena: The Kargil Girl’, ‘Ludo’, ‘KaaGaz’, ‘Mimi’. He also acted in web series like - ‘Mirzapur’, ‘Criminal Justice: Behind Closed Doors’. This year, Pankaj was honoured with the Diversity in Cinema award at the Indian Film Festival of Melbourne for his web series ‘Mirzapur’ Season 2, film ‘Ludo’ and short film ‘Laali’. Asked about when he plays a nice, positive character like that of a loving father in a film like ‘Gunjan Saxena: The Kargil Girl’, what does he search for in such character, and Pankaj said, “Honestly speaking, I think when it is a positive character and I know that anybody would fall in love with a father like ‘Anup Saxena’, I rather try to imbibe few good qualities from them. Me, being a father of a teenage daughter, I also want to be as supportive of her dreams. When I play any comic character, I feel happy knowing that when everyone is stuck and going through a tough time due to the pandemic, my comedy-drama films will offer them some comic relief.”

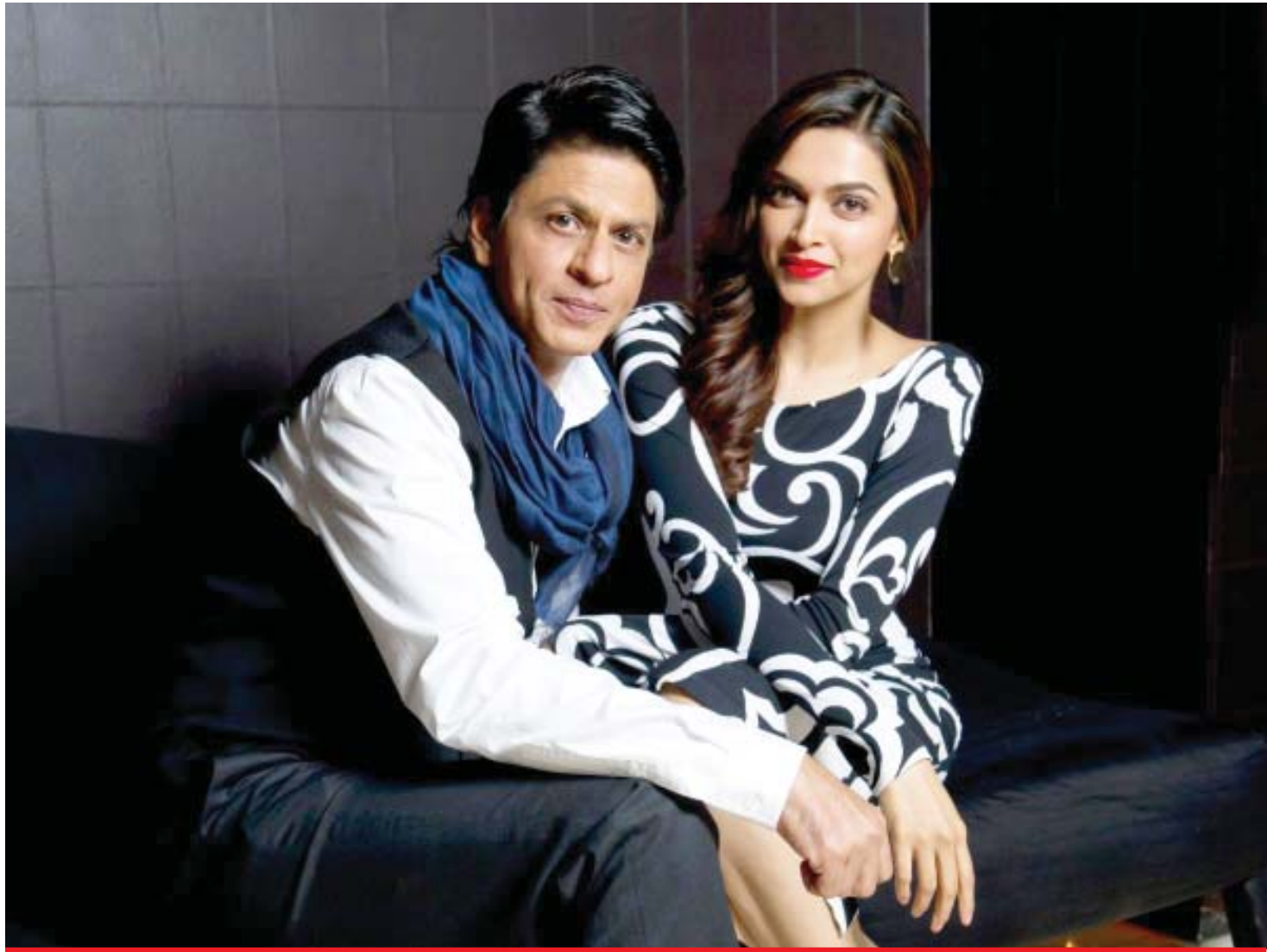

Adelaide and now Leeds, lowest score of Team India in Test innings

THE 78 ALL OUT IS INDIA'S LOWEST TEST TOTAL AGAINST ENGLAND SINCE BEING DISMISSED FOR 42 AT LORD'S IN 1974



In just less than a year, India have managed to register some of their most famous away wins, however, they came with a cost – having to add two entries to their top lowest scores of all time in Test cricket.

On Day 1 of the third Test, after winning the toss and electing to bat first, Virat Kohli and his men collapsed to 78 all out at Headingley on Wednesday. India had lost their last six in just 22 runs after being at 56/4 at lunch. It was their lowest Test total against England since being dismissed for 42 at Lord's in 1974. This was also India's third-lowest Test innings score in England.

England skipper Joe Root reveals plan to win series against Virat Kohli and team



England skipper Joe Root on Tuesday said his side would be required to keep India skipper Virat Kohli quiet in the next two Tests if they want to win the five-match series.

The five-match series stands level at 1-1, and now the fourth Test would be played at the Oval, London, beginning this Thursday. Kohli has so far gotten just one fifty-plus score in the ongoing series and James Anderson has managed to dismiss him twice.

"The credit needs to go to our bowling attack, Virat is a world-class player hence the credit needs to be given to the bowling group. We have been able to keep him quiet, it is an extremely good effort from our bowling group and it is something we have to continue if we have to win this series. We have found ways to get him out, he is a fine player and has done tremendous things in Test cricket, we will have to look at ways to get the best players out," said Root during a virtual press conference on Tuesday.

"Absolutely, world-class side like India led by Virat Kohli, I expect nothing less than a response. We would be naive to think otherwise, it is important that we do not get to deluded. We have gotten to the level playing field, we have to work harder now. If we find ourselves ahead of the game at any stage, we have to consolidate," he added. With the score reading 215/2 at the start of the fourth morning, India would have hoped to continue the remarkable comeback they had started scripting on the third day of the third Test at Leeds on Friday. But it wasn't to be as the England bowlers came out all guns blazing and wrapped the game up in the opening session itself on Saturday to

register an innings and 76-run win. "I think it was a brilliant performance, a nice template for us to work with really. The challenge is to replicate it and go one better. From a bowling perspective, I think we were flawless, we hit the right lengths early on and we managed to do it for long periods of time. With bat in hand, Headingley was our best outing till now and hopefully, we can go on," said Root. "I think more than anything, we are very pleased with how we have sort of grown into this series. We have worked extremely hard to make the series 1-1, now is where the hard work really starts. We will look to go again and keep getting better," he added.

Jos Buttler would miss the fourth Test due to the birth of his child, hence Jonny Bairstow would don the wicketkeeping-gloves.

"Jonny Bairstow, we all know what he is capable of with the gloves. He has done it for a long period in his international career, he has never let anyone down. His record is very good as a keeper, he is really looking forward to the challenge. Jos Buttler has been our number one keeper for a long period now and I think he has made the right decision to be at the birth of his child. We hope everything goes well and I hope he enjoys the moment," said Root. "You are always learning, I always look to learn and grow as a captain. But as a team, one thing we took away from the Lord's Test was that we have to be the best version of ourselves and we do things our way. We do not get sucked into playing someone else's game and we go about things in our manner. We did that in Headingley and it is important we implement that in the series," he added.

BCCI RELEASES TENDER, INVITES BIDS TO OWN AND OPERATE IPL TEAM



The Governing Council of the Indian Premier League (IPL) on Tuesday invited bids to acquire the right to own and operate 1 (one) of the 2 (two) new teams proposed to be introduced to take part in the tournament from the 2022 season, through a tender process. "The detailed terms and conditions governing the submission and evaluation of bids including eligibility requirements, the process for submissions of bids, proposed new teams' rights, and obligations, etc. are contained in the 'Invitation to Tender' ("ITT") which will be made available on receipt of payment of a non-refundable fee of INR 10,00,000 (Rupees Ten Lakhs Only) plus any applicable Goods and Services Tax," said the BCCI in an official release.

The ITT will be available for purchase till October 5. Interested parties have been requested to send an email at ittpl2021@bcci.tv to get further details for purchasing the ITT. The email requesting the ITT should have the subject line "ITT for the Right to Own and Operate One of Two Proposed New IPL Teams". Any interested party wishing to submit a bid is required to purchase the ITT.

However, only those satisfying the eligibility criteria set out in the ITT and subject to the other terms and conditions set out therein shall be eligible to bid. It is clarified that merely purchasing this ITT does not entitle any person to bid.

BCCI reserves the right to cancel or amend the bidding process at any stage in any manner without providing any reason.

VIRAT KOHLI IS A SKIPPER THAT ENGLAND AND AUSTRALIA FEAR, SAY BRAD HOGG

While India's performance is in question only after the third Test, overall the Men in Blue have put up an exciting contest against England. While India will be preparing for making a comeback, one person's form that has been questioned is that of Indian skipper Virat Kohli. He has been on a century drought and in the year 2021, Kohli has scored just 353 runs in 13 innings in Test match cricket. The 'run machine' has now gone more than 50 innings without a century in international cricket, with his last coming way back in the year 2019, against Bangladesh at the Eden Gardens stadium in Kolkata.

INDIAN CRICKETER STUART BINNY ANNOUNCES RETIREMENT FROM ALL FORMS OF CRICKET

Indian cricket Stuart Binny has announced his retirement from all forms of cricket. The all-rounder had represented the Men in Blue in six Tests, 14 ODIs and three T20Is. He scored a total of 459 runs and had picked up 24 wickets.

Interestingly, it was just days ago, after Team India had suffered a horrendous campaign in their third Test against England, that Stuart Binny's wife and Indian commentator had shared a photo of him on her Instagram.

The Indian all-rounder had batted brilliantly during the first Test of India's 2014 tour of England at the Trent Bridge in Nottingham. It was Binny's maiden Test cap. Binny had scored 78 off 114 deliveries before Moeen Ali took his wicket. His knock had comprised of eight boundaries and a solitary six.

JUVENTUS OFFICIALLY ANNOUNCE CRISTIANO RONALDO'S EXIT

For the last three days, Cristiano Ronaldo's departure from Juventus has been an open secret, with the Turin giants remaining mum about the status of the Portuguese superstar, even as Manchester United announced that they had come to an agreement to sign Ronaldo and bring him back to Old Trafford. On Tuesday, however, Juventus finally issued a statement, officially confirming the 5-time Ballon d'Or winner's exit from the Italian club. The club announced the details of Ronaldo's departure, with an initial •15 million transfer fee set to be paid over five years and another •8 million in add-ons included, pushing the total value of everything to a maximum of •23 million.

RAINING MEDALS AT TOKYO PARALYMPICS

INDIA’S MEDAL TALLY RISES TO 10



Javelin thrower Sumit Antil clinched India's second gold at the ongoing Paralympics, shattering the men's F64 category world record multiple times in a stunning Games debut performance on Monday. The 23-year-old from Sonapat in Haryana, who lost his left leg below the knee after he was involved in a motorbike accident in 2015, sent the spear to 68.55m in his fifth attempt, which was the best of the day by quite a distance and a new world record. In fact, he bettered the previous world record of 62.88m, also set by him, five times on the day. His last throw was a foul. His series read 66.95, 68.08, 65.27, 66.71, 68.55 and foul. Australian Michal Burian (66.29m) and Sri Lanka's Dulan Kodithuwakku (65.61m) took the silver and bronze respectively. The F64 category is for athletes with a leg amputation, who compete with prosthetics in a standing position. A student of Delhi's Ramjas College, Antil was an able-bodied wrestler before his accident which led to the amputation of his leg below the knee. A para athlete in his village initiated him to the sport in 2018. (Source: PTI)



Shooter Avani Lekhara scripted history on Monday as she became the first Indian woman to win a gold medal at the Paralympics, firing her way to the top of the podium in the R-2 women's 10m Air Rifle Standing SH1 event here. The 19-year-old from Jaipur, who sustained spinal cord injuries in a car accident in 2012, finished with a world record equalling total of 249.6, which is also a new Paralympic record. She is only the fourth Indian athlete to win a Paralympics gold after swimmer Murlikant Petkar (1972), javelin thrower Devendra Jhajharia (2004 and 2016) and high jumper Mariyappan Thangavelu (2016). Bhavinaben Patel on Sunday became only the second Indian woman to win a medal at the Paralympics after she signed off with a historic silver following a 0-3 loss to world number one Chinese paddler Ying Zhou in the women's singles table tennis class 4 final in Tokyo (Source: SAI)



Sundar Singh Gurjar also chipped in with a bronze, finishing behind Jhajharia in the men's javelin throw F46 final. The 25-year-old Gurjar, who lost his left hand in 2015 after a metal sheet fell on him at his friend's house, was third with a best effort of 64.01m. The Jaipur-based Gurjar had won gold in the 2017 and 2019 World Para Athletics Championships. He had also won a silver in the 2018 Jakarta Para Asian Games. (Source: Reuters)



Discus thrower Yogesh Kathuniya finished second as India surpassed its best ever medal tally at the Games on Monday. The 24-year-old, a B.Com graduate from New Delhi's Kirorimal College, sent the disc to a best distance of 44.38m in his sixth and last attempt to clinch the silver. Son of an Army man, Kathuniya suffered a paralytic attack at the age of eight which left him with coordination impairments in his limbs. (Source: PCI)



Two-time gold-winning javelin throw veteran Devendra Jhajharia clinched a stupendous third Paralympic medal, a silver this time. The 40-year-old Jhajharia, already India's greatest Paralympian after winning gold medals in the 2004 and 2016 Games, pulled off a new personal best throw of 64.35m for the silver. Jhajharia, who lost his left hand after accidentally touching an electric wire while climbing a tree at the age of eight, bettered his own earlier world record (63.97m) but gold winner Sri Lankan Dinesh Priyan Herath Mudiyansele (67.79m), who set a new world record, was too good for the entire field. High jumper Nishad Kumar clinched a silver with an Asian record on Sunday. The 21-year-old Nishad, who is a farmer's son in Himachal Pradesh's Amb town, cleared 2.06m to win the silver in T47 class. Nishad, whose right hand got cut by a grass-cutting machine at his family's farm when he was an eight-year-old boy, cleared the same height of 2.06m with American Dallas Wise who was also awarded a silver. FORMER IOC PRESIDENT ROGGE DIES AGED 79



MUMBAI, (IANS) Former President of the International Olympic Committee (IOC) Jacques Rogge has died aged 79, the IOC informed on Sunday. Rogge was the eighth President of the IOC, from 2001 to 2013, after which he became Honorary President. He was married to Anne and leaves a son, a daughter, and two grandchildren.

Rogge, an orthopedic surgeon with a degree in sports medicine, was also an accomplished athlete. Rogge was a Belgian rugby champion and represented his country. He was a 16-time Belgian national champion and a world champion in sailing. He also competed in sailing at three editions of the Olympic Games, in 1968, 1972, and 1976, in the Finn class, the IOC said in a release. After his career as an athlete, he became President of the Belgian and European Olympic Committees and was elected President of the IOC in 2001. After his IOC Presidency, he also served as a Special Envoy for Youth, Refugees, and Sport to the United Nations.

Remembering his life, IOC President Thomas Bach recalled: "First and foremost, Jacques loved sport and being with athletes - and he transmitted this passion to everyone who knew him. His joy in sport was infectious. He was an accomplished President, helping to modernise and transform the IOC. He will be remembered particularly for championing youth sport and for inaugurating the Youth Olympic Games. He was also a fierce proponent of clean sport and fought tirelessly against the evils of doping. "Since we were elected as IOC members together we shared a wonderful bond of friendship, and this continued until his last days, when the entire Olympic Movement and I could still benefit from his contribution, in particular on the Board of the Olympic Foundation for Culture and Heritage," he said in a release on Sunday.

The family has asked that their privacy be respected at this time whilst they grieve for their loss and that any communication during this period is made through the IOC.

Following a private family ceremony, a public memorial service will take place later in the year, where members and friends of the Olympic Movement will be able to remember his life and his great contribution to sport, the IOC informed.

WASIM AKRAM DENIES REPORTS OF HIM EYEING PCB CHAIRMAN POST



Former Pakistan cricket captain Wasim Akram took to Twitter on Tuesday and denied reports of him eyeing the position of Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) chairman prior to Ramiz Raja's nomination by Prime Minister Imran Khan.

Earlier on Tuesday, a well-known Indian newspaper posted the news and in reply to the tweet, the 55-year-old Wasim reminded them to stop spreading fake news and get their sources right. An irked Akram tweeted, "Please stop spreading such fake news. Get your sources right. PCB chairman's post is a specialised job and I was never interested in it. Thank God, I am content where I am in my life." The Sultan of Swing also went on to congratulate former cricketer Ramiz Raja for being nominated as a Board of Governors (BoG) member.
