



KANGANA RANAUT: 'WE NEED TO DISCOURAGE HOLLYWOOD MOVIES AS THEY ARE TAKING OVER OUR SCREENS'

Actor Kangana Ranaut on Thursday said that there is a need to discourage Hollywood movies and instead promote Indian stories from different languages. The 34-year-old actor, who was in the national capital to promote her upcoming movie Thalaivii, a biopic on late J Jayalalithaa, said keeping "our people and our industry" a priority is important to "make an Atmanirbhar Bharat". "We need to discourage American and English movies as they are taking over our screens. We need to behave like one nation. We need to stop dividing ourselves like North India or South India. We need to enjoy our own films first, be it Malayalam, Tamil, Telugu or Punjabi," Ranaut told reporters during a press conference. The actor said Hollywood has destroyed French,



Italian, German and other industries by creating a global monopoly. "This is what they are doing here also... We don't appreciate each other, and rather see the dubbed versions of Lion King or Jungle Book. But we will not give a dubbed version of a Malayalam film a chance. This will not work in our favour. We must keep our people and our industry our priority. This is the way to make an Atmanirbhar Bharat," she added. Ranaut's latest movie, Thalaivii, which was simultaneously in Tamil, Hindi and Telugu languages, is directed by AL Vijay and written by KV Vijayendra Prasad, Madhan Karky and Rajat Arora. Ranaut, who plays the former Tamil Nadu CM in the movie, said she had a different perception about politicians but it all changed after she took on the role. "We usually see politicians from a certain lens but in reality we don't know anything about their lives and how they become what they are... But when I took on this role, I realised how tough the job is and how much hard work it requires... I believe that we are often harsh towards politicians because of their political success," she said. At the press conference, the actor also addressed her quarrel with multiplex owners over the release of the Hindi version of Thalaivii. Major multiplex chains have declined to screen the Hindi version of the film in north India as they claimed that they were only offered a two-week window, while the Tamil and Telugu versions will be screened in theatres for four weeks before making their way to OTT platforms. Ranaut said multiplex theatre owners have different rules for films featuring big heroes. "We have seen in the past that they are very much okay with releasing big heroes and big studios' films. So this kind of gangism and groupism happens all the time... I believe that we should put our faith in single screen theatres," she added.

Scarlett Johansson-starrer is an inconsistent film



Overshadowed by Marvel's newest hero Shang-Chi and thrown under the bus by Disney, that opted to release this film simultaneously on screen and its streaming service, Black Widow's fate seems doomed from the start. However, this Scarlett Johansson vehicle bleeds itself and wears its heart out hoping to count.

The result is an inconsistent film that is deeply, almost poignantly, emotional at times and at others insistent on blowing things up, loudly and comprehensively. In the effort to both find space in the Marvel Cinematic Universe (MCU) and expand it, director Cate Shortland ends up stretching affairs well past a painful two hours.

The start is beautiful, precise and striking. A family of four, two loving parents and two close daughters, settled in Ohio, and loving all things American such as baseball and Bye, Bye American Pie song, is suddenly torn apart. The elder daughter, Natasha (played by a young girl with a striking resemblance to Johansson), is guarded and watchful — suggesting secrets that we are soon exposed to. The parents, it turns out, are Russian spies with the family as a front. They are led away, as are the girls, to separate camps where they are taught to be

We meet Natasha next when she has already been out of the Russian system, joined the Avengers, the Avengers have split up, and she is on the run. The younger girl, Yelena (Pugh), is now part of the new generation of Black Widows, fortified with chemicals to control them. If the science is a little dubious, so is the "cure" — an antidote packed in vials that Yelena has escaped with.

Despite the obvious secrecy of a system as one that Russian operative Dreykov (Ray Winstone) has perfected, with "Black Widows spread across the world", the two make-believe sisters make their way to each other surprisingly easily. Their reunion only picks pace and real warmth when the "parents" Alexei (Harbour) and Melina (Weisz) also come into the picture.

However, to earn its stripes as a standalone Marvel adventure, there are fights to fight, the world to save, and some enormous leaps of faith for us to swallow all that. There are also curious detours to side action that doesn't add much to the telling.

One wishes the film would remain with the four hearts that are the lifeblood of this tale, ably fronted by its four actors. Pugh, set to be the next entrant of MCU, threatens to almost steal the show. However, Johansson's Ionesome Natasha, seeking a family, somewhere to belong, fights with her heart — and in the very way Marvel has treated Black Widow, brings a heartbreaking pathos to the role.



Kangana confident 'Thalaivii' will woo audiences back to theatres



MUMBAI, (IANS) Actress Kangana Ranaut says 'Thalaivii' is the best film of her career so far and is confident that it will bring audiences back to the theatres.

'FEARED FAMILY'S SAFETY': ANGELINA JOLIE OPENS UP ON HER DIVORCE FROM BRAD PITT



Actress-filmmaker Angelina Jolie has claimed that she feared for the safety of her whole family' during her marriage to Hollywood star Brad Pitt, although she hopes they can "heal and be peaceful" in the future.

Jolie previously claimed that her former husband was verbally and physically abusive towards their children -Maddox, 20, Pax, 17, Zahara, 16, Shiloh, 15, and 13-year-old twins Knox and Vivienne - including an incident on a private plane involving eldest son Maddox, reports femalefirst.co.uk. In a new interview, the actress suggested she was scared for her children's wellbeing while she was married to the actor. Jolie was asked by The Guardian newspaper why she decided to write her upcoming book on children's rights, and she said that she "can't speak about' it because of her own legal situation. When asked to clarify, the publication reported Angelina "confirmed by nodding that she was alluding to her divorce and the allegations of domestic abuse she made against (Brad)". Jolie was then asked if she feared for the safety of her children, and the star replied: "Yes, for my family. My whole family."

Fourth Test: India win by 157 runs, take 2-1 lead in series



LONDON, (IANS) India pulled off a sensational 157-run win in the fourth Test against England, only their second-ever at The Oval and first at the venue after 1971, to take an unassailable 2-1 lead in the five-match series. This is also only the second time in history -- after 1986 -- that India have won two Tests on one tour of England.

They had beaten England by 151 runs in the second Test at Lord's last month. England had resumed the fifth and final day strongly placed at 77 without loss and even though they lost a couple of wickets in the first session, they had moved to 131/2 and looked good to draw the Test. However, within 35 balls, between overs 61.3 and 67.2, pacer JaspritBumrah (2/27) and spinner Ravindra Jadeja (2/50) turned the game in India's favour, sharing four wickets to spear the heart of England batting.

Jadeja removed opener Haseeb Hameed (63 off 193) through one that turned from the rough and clipped his off-stump.

defences of Ollie Pope (2) and Jonny Bairstow (0) in his successive fifty each. overs. Jadeja then picked Moeen Ali caught bat-pad.

England went from 141/2 to 147/6. A 35-run partnership between Joe Root (36) and Chris Woakes (18)

Yadav (3/60). India had picked six wickets in the session between lunch and tea.

They mopped up the tail quickly post-tea.

The victory was through a remarkable turnaround for India as they had been bowled out for 191 in the first innings. The top three batsmen shone and India, with contribution from middle and lower order took the total to 466 and set England a target of 368 to win.

It was too much for England to handle. Shardul Thakur was the silent performer who made the difference as he hit fifties in both innings and picked three crucial wickets. The first innings half-century took India to 191 and the second innings fifty helped him stitch a 100-run partnership for the seventh wicket with Rishabh Pant and took the lead beyond 300.

Rohit Sharma scored his maiden overseas Test century in the second Bumrah then hit England with a double whammy as he breached the innings. CheteshwarPujara and skipper Virat Kohli chipped in with a

BCCI SHORTLISTS THESE SIX CITIES FOR TWO NEW TEAMS FROM IPL 2022: REPORT

With the mega-auction slated before the next year's edition of the Indian Premier League (IPL) the BCCI has turned its attention to the sale of the two new teams, which will be added from the next season. Last week, the board invited the tender for the purchase of two new IPL teams and the 'invitation to tender' will be available till October 5. Now reports suggest that the board has put forward six cities - Guwahati, Ranchi, Cuttack (all East), Ahmedabad (West), Lucknow (Central Zone), and Dharamsala (North) - as their options for the two new teams considering the zonal imbalance and business opportunities in mind. The BCCI is aiming to take the cash-rich league to cities in the Hindispeaking region more so in the north belt to keep the pan-India balance of the most



popular franchise league in the world. With Chennai Super Kings, Royal Challengers Bangalore and Sunrisers Hyderabad already representing three of the southern cities in the country, BCCI has now made it clear that no city from the south will be included anymore even though the likes of Vishakhapatnam and Kochi were in the fray, but the pending litigation with the ex-Kochi side (Kochi Tuskers Kerala) worked against them. Also with 65 percent of the four billion minutes of viewership of the IPL coming from the Hindi region, the BCCI has gone the north, west and eastern way. Only Delhi Capitals and Punjab Kings are from the northern region as Rajasthan Royals based in Jaipur are considered from the central zone according to cricket mapping, which is why the board is expecting the IPL to expand beyond the capital city Delhi and Punjab in the north.

VICTORY AT OVAL HANDS INDIA LEAD IN WORLD TEST CHAMPIONSHIP

LONDON, (IANS) Subject to official confirmation from the International Cricket Council (ICC), the Indian cricket team will jump to the top of the all-important and prestigious 2021-23 World Test Championship (WTC) points table by virtue of their victory over England in the fourth Test at The Oval on Monday. Unless any points are deducted, India will earn 26 points and a percentage of points (PCT) of 58.33 per cent. Next in the table are Pakistan and the West Indies, both with 12 points and a PCT of 50 per cent each. Points available per Test match are 12 for a win, six for a tie, four for a draw and zero for a loss. The PCT allocated per Test is 100 for a win, 50 for a tie, 33.33 for a draw and nil for a loss. A five-Test series, which India and England are engaged in, carry 60 points, a four-Test series 48 points, a three-Test series 36 points and a two-Test series, which Pakistan and the West Indies recently concluded, 24 points. Prior to the outcome at The Oval, both India and England were docked two points each for slow over-rates. Thus, instead of their tallies being 16 from the first three Tests, they were 14. England's points will remain stationary, having lost the match.

TOKYO GOLD MEDALLIST PRAMOD BHAGAT ONCE HAD NO MONEY TO BUY RACKET



PATNA, (IANS) India's badminton player Pramod Bhagat, who won a gold medal in the Tokyo Paralympics in SL3 category, did not have enough money to buy even a badminton racket in early stages of his career. Bhagat, a native of Bihar's Hajipur town in Vaishali district had natural talent in sports. "He used to beat any person in the city during his childhood. When he was just five years old, he became a polio victim. As our financial state was not good and my sister Kishuni Devi and her husband Kailash Bhagat did not have a child, they adopted Pramod and took him to Bhubaneswar," said Rama Bhagat, the father of Pramod Bhagat.

"Initially we did not have money to buy a badminton racket for him. Then his uncle and aunt managed to buy a racket for him and he started training for the game," he added.

"Pramod completed his class 12 examination from Bhubaneswar followed by ITI. As he was continuously practicing badminton, he qualified for the Tokyo Paralympic games," he said.

Suresh Bhagat, the brother of Pramod Bhagat, said, "We are very happy with the efforts of Promod. He won the gold medal for our country and the state. At the same time, the sports infrastructure of Bihar is extremely bad. Hence, many talented players are unable to play in national events." Pramod Bhagat managed to beat Daniel Bethell of England in the men's singles (SL3) final on Saturday and won the gold medal for India.

PAKISTAN HEAD COACH MISBAH-UL-HAQ, **BOWLING COACH WAQAR YOUNIS RESIGN** ONE MONTH BEFORE T20 WORLD CUP

Pakistan men's national cricket team head coach Misbah-ul-Haq and bowling coach Waqar Younis have stepped down from their respective roles. They communicated their decisions to the Pakistan Cricket Board late on Monday morning. With the New Zealand side due to arrive on September 11 for the three ODI and five T20I series and the Pakistan side to assemble in Islamabad on September 8, the PCB has appointed Saglain Mushtag and Abdul Razzag as interim coaches for the series, with the team management for the ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2021 to be appointed in due course. "Misbah and Waqar were appointed in September 2019 and still had a year each left in their contracts," PCB said in its official statement.

Misbah-ul-Haq said: "The quarantine in Jamaica post the West Indies series provided me with an opportunity to reflect on the past 24 months as well as the schedule for international cricket ahead. Considering that I would have had to continue to spend considerable time away from my family and that too in a bio-secure environment, I have decided to step down from the role." "I understand that the timing may not be ideal but I don't think I am in the right frame of mind for the upcoming challenges and it makes sense for someone fresh to step in and take the side forward.

TOKYO BIDS ADIEU TO PARALYMPICS WITH MESSAGE OF CHANGE



TOKYO, (IANS) With a message of change, of inclusivity, of ability and super ability, of humanity and togetherness amidst music and dance, conducted by disabled artists, Tokyo bid farewell to parasportspersons from all over the world in a glittering ceremony that brought down the curtain on the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games.

The ceremony was themed on a youngster's awakening about the Paralympic Games, para-sportspersons, and their different abilities and personalities. He wakes up in a prototype of the Paralympic Games village, which resembles a miniature city, where parasportspersons start arriving, preparing, and participating in the Games and depicts how his approach towards the participants changes.

The concept underlying the closing ceremony was "Harmonious Cacophony," while the presentation was meant to convey the idea that Tokyo is a city where difference shines. The organisers referred to the theme as a "world inspired by the Paralympics, one where differences shine". The idea was to turn the focus towards the 1.5 billion people that are differently-abled and ready to showcase their abilities. The athletes, that were part of the parade, were asked to help prepare a huge tower that the artists finally placed upright to depict the harmoniously engaged people can make things possible. And the Indian contingent embraced the principle of change as for the first time in the history of such Games, a woman was the flag-bearer of the Indian contingent. AvaniLekhara led the Indian delegation into the stadium. She was the star of the Indian campaign -- the first woman

from India to win a gold medal in either Olympics or Paralympic Games. International Paralympic Committee (IPC) president Andrew Parsons declared the Tokyo 2020 Games closed, officially bringing down the curtains on the 2020 Paralympics.

In his address, Parsons reflected briefly on the difficult road to Tokyo 2020. "There were many times when we thought these games could not happen ... There were many sleepless nights.

"After eight amazing years, I can't believe our time is almost done. What a time, what a sport, what a Games. ... All I can say is, arigato, Tokyo!," said Parsons who hoped the 2020 Paralympic Games will encourage people to think of the 1.5 billion disabled people around the world and help create opportunities for them. Following the entry of national flags, the event introduced I'mPOSSIBLE -- an education programme developed by the Agitos Foundation, the IPC's development arm. A brief presentation saw three schools (two from Japan, one from overseas) and two Paralympic athletes are given the I'mPOSSIBLE Awards for their contributions toward inclusion. Before the harmonious cacophony commenced, the many volunteers who helped Tokyo 2020 materialise were acknowledged with a rousing round of applause. After the lowering of the Paralympic flag, the baton was handed over to Paris for the 2024 Games. There was a presentation by artists from Paris who welcomed participants for the next edition in three years. "Hope to see you there in Paris in three years," Parsons said. And the lights were slowly extinguished, to be lighted again in Paris in 2024.









Shastri, Arun, Sridhar test positive, won't travel for 5th Test: Report

LONDON, (IANS) Indian head coach Ravi Shastri, bowling coach Bharat Arun and fielding coach R Sridhar have returned positive results following their RT-PCR tests for Covid-19 on Sunday.

As a result, they will not travel to Manchester for the fifth and final Test that begins at Old Trafford on September 10.

"Ravi Shastri, Bharat Arun and R Sridhar, the head coach, bowling coach and fielding coach of the Indian team respectively, have returned positive RT-PCR tests for Covid-19 on Sunday. This will prevent them from travelling to Manchester for the fifth and final Test of India's tour of England, starting September 10 at Old Trafford," said a report in espncricinfo.com.

The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) is yet to issue an official statement on this.

Bumrah, and all-round performance by Shardul Thakur in the match helped visitors in defeating England by 157 runs to gain a 2-1 in the five-match series. This is also India's first win in Oval in 50 years. "Well, I think the best thing about both the games has been the character the team has shown. We are not looking to survive in this game, we are here to win. Really proud of the character the team has shown. It's quite relative to what you call flat. The conditions were hot and we knew were in with an opportunity when Jadeja was bowling in the rough. The bowlers were good with the reverse swing today. We believed we could get all 10 wickets, we had the belief," Kohli told Sky Sports during the post-match presentation. "As soon as the ball started reversing, Bumrah said give me the ball. He bowled that spell and swung the game in our favour with those two huge wickets," Kohli added praising Bumrah's six-over spell after the lunch break. Kohli admitted Rohit Sharma's innings was crucial but said that it was Shardul Thakur's performance with both bat and the ball, which had a major impact on this game. "I think you pointed his performance. Rohit's innings was fantastic. But, if you talk about impact performance, what Shardul has done in this game is something to remember for a long time. His two fifties deflated the opposition. I think he batted well in both innings." Shardul Thakur smashed 117 runs with the bat and picked up three wickets with the ball. With the conditions good enough for batting, England openers got the hosts off to a decent start, with both scoring fifties, however, Shardul came into the attack and got rid of Burns in his first over of day 5. Shardul Thakur who was part of the Indian quartet in scoring more than 50 runs in the second innings, also dazzled with the ball as he sent back Joe Root to the pavilion later.
