PM TRUDEAU & ONTARIO PREMIER FORD SIGN \$10-A-DAY CHILD CARE DEAL



Ontario and Canada have signed a \$13.2 billion agreement that will lower fees for families and deliver an average of \$10 a day child care by September 2025.

Highlights of Ontario's better deal include:

- A federal investment of \$13.2 billion over six years with the province having secured more certainty around out-year funding. The deal includes an additional year of funding of at least \$2.9 billion.
- * The flexibility to allocate federal funding in a way that will allow the province to deliver an average of \$10 a day child care, including by spending the initial \$10.2 billion over four years instead of five.
- * Enhanced protection against funding shortfalls through a mandated financial review process in year three - the first of its kind in any provincial child care deal - to reconcile the actual costs of the new national child care plan with funding.
- * Reduction of child care fees through four steps of reduction to an average of \$10 a day per child five years old and younger by September 2025.
- * Parent rebates, retroactive to April 1, will begin in May.
- * Protection of all for-profit and non-profit child care spaces, helping to support predominantly female entrepreneurs across the province who provide high-quality child care services.



APPROVAL OF US PRESIDENT BIDEN'S HANDLING OF ECONOMY DECLINING: POLL


A new polls has revealed that the approval of US President Joe Biden's handling of the economy was declining as the cost of living has jumped to become Americans' most important issue, displacing jobs and the economy, voting rights/election integrity and the Covid-19.

The new NBC News poll said the other issues besides handling of the economy had topped January's survey, reports Xinhua news agency Sixty-two per cent of respondents said their family incomes are falling behind the cost of living, 31 per cent said they were staying even, and 6 per cent said their incomes are going up faster than the cost of living, according to the poll conducted on March 18-22.

Asked whom or what they blame the most for increasing inflation, a plurality of Americans, 38 per cent, pointed the finger at Biden and his policies.

Republican respondents made up the bulk of those with that opinion, said NBC. Another 28 per cent put the blame on the Covid-19 pandemic, 23 perc ent attributed it to corporations that have increased prices, and 6 per cent blamed the rising cost of goods and services on the Russia-Ukraine conflicts, it added.

PUNJAB TO APPOINT NODAL OFFICERS TO **REDRESS ISSUES OF NRIS**

Punjab NRI Affairs Minister Kuldeep Singh Dhaliwal on Tuesday said the government has decided to appoint nodal officers in all 23 districts for the ease of Non-Resident Indians (NRIs), besides setting up of special courts in Amritsar, Patiala, Ludhiana and Bathinda districts. Chairing a highlevel review meeting with officials of the NRI Affairs Department and members of the NRI Commission, he issued directions that the appointment of the nodal officers should be made in a transparent manner and working of these officers should be reviewed by the Deputy Commissioners on a regular basis. Dhaliwal said the government has continuously been working with full zeal and commitment to resolve the issues of Punjabis residing in foreign countries and requisite directions have also been issued to Special Chief Secretary of the department. Special courts will be set up in districts of Amritsar, Patiala, Ludhiana and Bathinda to resolve cases related to NRIs in time-bound manner and directions have been issued to the department to initiate the process, he added. Dhaliwal said the state would also coordinate with the Union government and embassies to resolve the problems of NRIs. The government would honour the NRIs who have done commendable work in various walks of life, he said.

PTI NOMINATES PERVAIZ ELAHI FOR

Usman Buzdar has resigned following the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insafs (PTI) nomination of Chaudhry Pervaiz Elahi as the next Chief Minister of Pakistan Punjab, Friday Times reported.

PAK PUNJAB CM

Special Assistant to Prime Minister Imran Khan on Political Communication, Shahbaz Gill, announced the Pakistan Muslim League (PML-Q) leader's candidacy on Twitter.

Gill also said that the PML-Q would support the government in the imminent vote of no-confidence against the Prime Minister, despite earlier remarks from senior leaders within the PML-Q, including MNA Kamil Ali Agha, indicating that it was 'too late' for the Prime Minister to cajole potential government allies, the report said. Later, Minister of State for Information and Broadcasting, Farrukh Habib, announced that Buzdar had tendered his resignation. Earlier on Monday morning, the opposition had filed a no-confidence motion against Buzdar in the provincial assembly. Parvez Elahi reiterated that his party is both a government ally and an independent party, while adding that he believed the opposition had garnered enough votes to pass the no-confidence motion.

PHYSICIAN BURNOUT NEARLY DOUBLES DURING PANDEMIC, **CANADIAN MEDICAL ASSOCIATION SURVEY REVEALS**

NEARLY DOUBLES DURING PANDEMIC

Preliminary data from the Canadian Medical Association's (CMA) National Physician Health Survey offers a concerning outlook on the health of physicians, battered from over two years of a global pandemic. The survey, conducted in November 2021, shows more than half of physicians and medical learners (53%) have experienced high levels of burnout, compared to 30% in a similar survey conducted in 2017. As well, nearly half (46%) of Canadian physicians who responded are considering reducing their clinical work in the next 24 months.

"We should be deeply alarmed that half of the physician workforce is considering reducing their clinical workload. The downstream impact to patient care will be significant as we are already experiencing access to care issues," says Dr. Katharine Smart, CMA president. "There is no question that the pandemic has greatly affected our health workforce. As we look to rebuild our health care system, we need to prioritize the people who work within it and call on all governments to take action now." The preliminary survey data has been released following an emergency meeting of close to 40 national and provincial health organizations representing Canada's health workforce. The organizations were united in their call for urgent action to address the worsening health workforce crisis, with key priorities focused on creating a robust source of data, implementing a national human health resources strategy and rebuilding Canada's health care system for the future.

Additional insights from the National Physician Health Survey reveal that: 59% of physicians indicated that their mental health has worsened since the onset of the pandemic. This worsened mental health has been attributed to: increased workload and lack of work-life integration (57%), rapidly changing policies/processes (55%), and other challenges. Nearly half of physicians (47%) reported low levels of social wellbeing, which has increased from 2017 data (29%). Emotional and psychological wellbeing have also suffered compared to prepandemic levels. The CMA National Physician Health Survey was conducted in the fall of 2021. The survey was open for five weeks and received more than 4,000 responses from Canadian physicians and

medical learners. A fulsome report will be published later this year.

INDIANS TO SPEND MORE ON TRAVEL BY ADOPTING NEW NORMAL POST-COVID: REPORT

on travel in 2022 compared to a typical pre-pandemic year, according to a report.

The American Express Travel: Global Travel Trends Report showed that Indian travellers are looking to adopt the new normal. Overall, Indians think travel will be less stressful this year than last year and many are looking forward to regaining control over their trips in 2022 after feeling overwhelmed last year.

The survey report is based on 3,000 travellers from seven countries including the US, Australia, India, Canada, Mexico, Japan, and the UK. It reveals that the motivation to travel for 48 per cent Indians is for discovering new experiences, 46 per cent for relaxing and 45 per cent for exploring new destinations. About 96 per cent agreed they like to eat and shop at local businesses to support the local economy.

"After two tough years, the travel sentiment amongst Indian travellers is upbeat where spending time with loved ones is a top priority," said Manoj

A whopping 93 per cent Indians are planning to spend more or the same Adlakha, SVP and CEO, American Express Banking, India, in a statement. "With the resumption of all regular international flights and the upcoming summer holiday season, we are seeing a surge in travel bookings amongst our card members for both international and domestic travel," he added. Majority of Indians agree they want to have a positive impact

per cent stated they would take a 'greencation' and 93 per cent are more likely to book travel with a brand that is committed to improving its environmental impact, ranking highest than their global counterparts. About 69 per cent of respondents agree they want to travel to their dream destination this year. Five in ten respondents shared they are willing to travel solo now to visit their dream destination.

Nearly 92 per cent agree that they are willing to book a trip for 2022 even

on the community they are visiting and want to travel to destinations where they can immerse themselves in the local culture. Travelling responsibly is of high importance for the respondents as 94

if they might have to cancel or modify it later.

CANADA FUNDS TO CLEAR PANDEMIC-RELATED MEDICAL BACKLOGS



The federal government announced it would provide an additional C\$2 billion (\$1.6 billion) one-time top-up to provinces and territories to reduce the backlog accumulated during the Covid-19 pandemic.

According to a statement issued by Finance Ministry, the Covid-19 pandemic has delayed an estimated 700,000 surgeries and other medical procedures, resulting in an increase of waitlists and backlogs, reports Xinhua news agency.

This amount is in addition to the C\$4.5 billion Canada Health Transfer (CHT) top-up provided since the start of the pandemic, the release said, adding that it would further help provinces and territories to

address immediate pandemic-related health care system pressures, particularly the backlogs of surgeries, medical procedures and diagnostics. It would provide doctors, nurses, and other health care professionals with the resources they need to ensure Canadians have access to the care they deserve. Provinces and territories would be able to use this funding to support their own unique circumstances, including strengthening the health workforce, the release said. In the last two years, pandemic-related direct transfers by the federal government to the provinces and territories total over C\$20 billion,

including C\$4.5 billion through CHT top-ups.

IS THERE A LINK BETWEEN COVID BRAIN FOG, CHEMO BRAIN & ALZHEIMER'S?



Several researchers have found a common link between people who have undergone chemotherapy for any life-threatening disease and

previously healthy people who have had a relatively mild Covid infection, and are now facing brain fog. A team from Stanford University was fascinated to find similar changes among patients in both groups, in specialised brain cells that serve as the organ's surveillance and defence system, the Washington Post reported. A malfunction in these cells known as microglia result in fuzzy thinking among cancer patients undergoing treatment. The same cells may also be impeded in Alzheimer's disease. There's a growing body of research that suggests similarities in the mechanisms of post-Covid cognitive changes and other long-studied brain conditions, including 'chemo brain', Alzheimer's and other post-viral syndromes following infections with influenza, Epstein-Barr,


"There is humongous overlap" between long Covid and these other conditions, Avindra Nath, intramural clinical director of the neurological disorders and stroke unit of the National Institutes of Health, was quoted as saying.

HIV or Ebola, the report said.

According to Stanford neuroscientist Michelle Monje, knowing the similarities gives the field of research into long Covid "a real foundation". She's optimistic that some of the symptoms people are experiencing post-Covid are reversible, and there's already talk about testing drugs in clinical trials to treat "chemo brain" for those suffering from severe Covid brain fog.

Another team of researchers from Harvard and Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine have highlighted how both in Covid-19 and chronic fatigue syndrome, too many oxygen molecules pile up in a cell - possibly resulting in inflammation that leads to cognitive issues. And an examination of brain autopsy tissue by a Columbia University professor from 10 patients who died of Covid-19 turned up a molecular change bearing the distinct signature of Alzheimer's, the report said. Researchers, however, are still in the early stages of defining Covid brain fog, the maddening feeling of slow thinking and confusion described post-infection by some people.

OMICRON SUBVARIANT BA.2 BECOMES DOMINANT STRAIN IN US: CDC



The BA.2 sub-lineage of the Omicron variant has become the dominant strain in the US, according to new data released by the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

The variant has been steadily rising in proportion due to its increased transmissibility compared to the original Omicron strain, Xinhua news agency reported.

The BA.2 variant represented 54.9 per cent of new Covid-19 cases for the week ending March 26, according to CDC data. This data is up from 39 per cent a week prior, and 27.8 per cent two weeks before. The BA.2 subvariant is thought to be about 30 per cent more transmissible than the original BA.1 Omicron strain, early study suggested.

- * Creation of approximately 86,000 new, high-quality child care spaces for children five years old and younger.
- * Hiring new early childhood educators and support improved compensation for all Registered Early Childhood Educators (RECEs) working in licensed child care.
- * Maintain Ontario's child care tax credit program that supports 300,000 families with expenses in licensed and unlicensed child care.
- * Work with municipalities to enrol 5,000 licensed child care centres and home child care agencies into the program between now and September 1.

"From day one, I said our government wouldn't sign a deal that didn't work for Ontario parents and I'm so proud of the work we've done with our federal partners to land an agreement that will lower costs for families across the province," said Premier Doug Ford. "Given how complex Ontario's child care system is, we wanted to get this right. Today, we're delivering a deal that will keep money in the pockets of hard-working parents."

As a first step, all Ontario families with children five years old and younger in participating licensed child care centres will see their fees reduced, up to 25 per cent, to a minimum of \$12 per day, retroactive to April 1, 2022. In December 2022, parents will see another reduction. In total, fees for families will be reduced in 2022, on average, by 50 per cent, relieving parents of \$1.1 billion in child care costs. Families will see further fee reductions in September 2024, culminating in a final reduction to an average of \$10-a-day child care by September 2025.

Additionally, this agreement supports the creation of 86,000 more licensed child care spaces to address increasing demand, including more than 15,000 licensed child care spaces created since 2019. To maintain the province's high quality of child care, the agreement also supports the recruitment of new early childhood educators, stable compensation for all Registered Early Childhood Educators (RECEs) working in licensed child care, including RECEs providing child care for children six to 12 years old.

"We have secured a deal for Ontario families that will significantly reduce child care costs for working moms and dads, and that starts today", said Stephen Lecce. Minister of Education. "We were able to deliver a deal for Ontario families that includes billions in additional funding and a longer agreement that respects parents and provides financial support for families."

To support the child care sector in implementing these new measures, and to ensure the costs of inflation are covered, Ontario is investing \$395 million to ensure RECEs for the 6-12 age group benefit from the wage increases committed to RECEs for the 0-5 age group, as the federal program does not extend support to workers or children age 6-12. To ensure a sustainable future that protects Ontario taxpayers and puts parents first, the Canada-Ontario agreement also ensures that the cost of implementing the agreement will continue to be monitored by Canada and Ontario with automatic review in year three of the agreement (2024-25). This automatic review mechanism is the first of its kind in any child care agreement in Canada.

Ontario will work with municipalities to enroll over 5,000 licensed child care centres and home child care agencies in the new program between now and September 1. Rebates to parents, retroactive to April 1, will begin in May, and will follow the enrolment of licensed centres and agencies into the new system.

Ontario families will continue to benefit from the province's child care tax credit program, which remains in effect. This program provides an estimated 300,000 families with up to 75 per cent of their eligible expenses for licensed and unlicensed child care in centres, home-based care, camps and other settings.

Ontario's agreement also recognizes its unique position of having the largest child care aged population in Canada and complements the province's world-class, fully funded, full-day kindergarten program for four- and five-year-olds. Over the course of the agreement, Ontario will be investing \$21.6 billion in full-day kindergarten.

Subramaniam was elected to the FedEx Board of Directors in 2020 and will maintain his seat on the Board.

Prior to this, he was President and CEO of FedEx Express, the world's

largest express transportation company. In addition, he served as the President of FedEx Express in Canada and in several other management and marketing roles throughout Asia and the US since he joined FedEx in 1991.

ONTARIO GOVERNMENT RAISING HIGHWAY SPEED LIMIT PERMANENTLY TO 110 KM/H

The Ontario government is raising the speed limit permanently from raising the speed limit to 110 km/h on a trial basis on the following 100 km/h to 110 km/h on six sections of provincial highways in southern Ontario. The change follows several speed limit pilots and consultations and will align posted speeds with other jurisdictions across Canada.

"Our government continues to find new ways to make life easier and more convenient for families and businesses that depend on highways to get where they need to go," said Caroline Mulroney, Minister of Transportation. "With road safety top of mind, these sections have been carefully selected based on their ability to accommodate higher speed limits."

Beginning April 22, 2022, the speed limit will be raised permanently to 110 km/h on the following sections of provincial highways in southern Ontario:

- * Queen Elizabeth Way (QEW) from Hamilton to St. Catharines (32 km)
- * Highway 402 from London to Sarnia (90 km)
- * Highway 417 from Ottawa to the Ontario/Quebec Border (102 km)
- * Highway 401 from Windsor to Tilbury (approximately 40 km)
- * Highway 404 from Newmarket to Woodbine (approximately 16 km)
- * Highway 417 from Kanata to Arnprior (approximately 37 km)

In addition to raising the speed limit permanently on sections of * Alberta, Manitoba, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Saskatchewan highways in southern Ontario, at the same time, the province is also and British Columbia have posted speed limits of 110 km/h.

sections of provincial highways in Northern Ontario:

- * Highway 400 from MacTier to Nobel (approximately 55 km)
- * Highway 11 from Emsdale to South River (approximately 45 km) There are currently six other provinces in Canada that have set their speed limits in excess of 100 km/h on select segments of certain highways.

QUICK FACTS

- * In September 2019, the government launched an online survey to gather public feedback when the higher speed limit pilots were introduced on certain sections of highways in southern Ontario. Of the 8,300 people that responded to the survey, approximately 80 per cent were supportive of the pilots and 82 per cent stated they support raising speed limits on more sections of 400-series highways.
- * The Ministry of Transportation has been monitoring all raised speed limit sections for safety and operations, and observations indicate that the sections with a raised speed limit have been operating as expected. Both the operating speeds and collision trends within these sections have remained comparable to other similar highway sections where speed limits remained unchanged at 100 km/h.

VOTING ON NO-CONFIDENCE MOTION AGAINST PAKISTAN PM IMRAN KHAN ON APRIL 3



Pakistan Interior Minister Sheikh Rasheed announced on Tuesday that voting on the no-confidence motion against Prime Minister Imran Khan will take place on April 3, Geo News reported.

Addressing a press conference in Islamabad, he revealed the muchawaited date, adding that debate on the motion, tabled by Leader of the Opposition in National Assembly Shahbaz Sharif on Monday, will begin on Tuesday. Rasheed said that the final decision would be taken at the last hour, adding that PM Imran Khan will "play"till the last ball. Reiterating his support for the PTI-led government, he stated: "I stand with Imran Khan" and hoped that voting will be held peacefully on April 3. He also said that the official notification will be issued after

the PM accepts the resignation of Punjab Chief Minister Usman Buzdar. "In politics, some people win even after losing," he said.

Following the power shows of the government and the Opposition, he said that all containers have been removed in Islamabad and all roads are clear. The Minister said that as he mentioned earlier Chaudhry brothers are with PTI. He, however, hoped that the MQM-P will soon announce their decision in favour of the government.

"Their decision will be a decisive one," he added.

"All those who have planned international conspiracies to remove PM Imran Khan will fail miserably," he said, adding that all eyes are on the Supreme Court's decision, Geo News reported.

CANADA'S TRADE MINISTER, MARY NG, BRIEFS CIF ON MISSION TO INDIA

Welcoming her to the meeting, Satish Thakkar, Chair, CIF, said, "All of us are here to congratulate our Minister for International Trade, Hon. Mary Ng, for her recent initiative that led to a breakthrough in the trade negotiations between our two countries. Thank you, Minister, it is truly an honour to host you this afternoon. We are confident that when negotiations are held in good faith, the vision for a deeper engagement shared by Minister Ng and others will become a reality soon."

Thakkar also extended the full support of CIF to her endeavors to get early agreements signed.

Minister Ng thanked CIF for the "tremendous work you've done to strengthen the relationship between Canada and India over the past fifteen years." She said, "Relationships are often built on a people-to-people basis. The strength of the diaspora community, I would say, is the foundation on which we keep building this bilateral relationship."

Minister Ng revealed that it was important to build a personal rapport between her and the Minister representing India, Minister for Commerce and Industry, Hon. Piyush Goyal. From Your Excellencies, they began to address each other by their first names!

She said, "My goal was of course to expand the bilateral trade to the fullest extent possible. What we were able to do while in India culminated out of the relationship that Minister Goyal and I have been cultivating really from the first day I was appointed as Minister of International Trade." Both sides were pragmatic in their approach during the negotiations and were aiming for an Early Progress Trade Agreement (EPTA). "I call it an EPTA because he and I are both practical individuals. We both want to get something accomplished. Once we take these important early steps, it creates confidence on both sides. We both agreed to negotiate an EPTA. This will be the first step toward a Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA)."

Minister Ng had early success in India as during the first round of negotiations, India agreed to drop the fumigation fees charged on pulses import from Canada. "That was an important issue for Canadian farmers, and I am very pleased we were able to resolve that issue," said Ng.

During her short stay, Minister Ng met with several senior Indian ministers who she felt held portfolios that could help support her efforts to increase trade and investment between Canada and India. Among the ministers she interacted with were: Minister of Finance, Ms. Nirmala Seetharaman; Ms. Smriti Irani, Minister of Women and Child Development; and Jitendra Singh, Minister for Science & Technology.

"We have more Canadian investment in India than business and trade. That usually is not the case in our other relationships. What it says is that the Canadian businesses, like the big funds, are confident in making an investment in India because of the range of opportunities there. There is also the fact that it is the world's largest democracy."

Ms. Sonia Sidhu, MP (Brampton South) and IqwinderGaheer, MP (Mississauga-Malton) attended the session as special guests and extended their good wishes to the trade initiative that would benefit both Canada and India.

A large number of CIF members shared their hopes and concerns with Minister Ng during a lively interactive session. Minister Ng addressed most queries and promised to follow up with the members on some key issues raised during the Q&A.

'PUTIN-ZELENSKY MEETING POSSIBLE ONLY AFTER AGREEMENT READY': OFFICIAL



Russian President Vladimir Putin and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky are likely to meet only after an agreement is ready for signing, Vladimir Medinsky, the head of Russia's negotiation team, said on Tuesday. Before the discussion of a possible meeting of the presidents, a treaty must be prepared and approved by the negotiators, and then endorsed by the foreign ministers, explained Medinsky, also an aide to the Russian President. This will be not simple especially because the meeting could be a multilateral one with the participation of state guarantors of peace and security to Ukraine, he was quoted as saying by Xinhua news agency.

PUNJAB TO DELIVER RATION AT DOORSTEPS



Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Monday announced a scheme to deliver ration at the doorsteps of the people across the state.

Making an announcement in a video message, he said the Aam Aadmi Party government's scheme is aimed at providing good quality ration 'atta' (wheat flour) and 'daal' (pulses) to the people packed in clean gunny bags. "You need not to stand in long queues or miss your dailywage anymore for getting ration and now our officials would check your availability before delivering the ration at your doorsteps," he said. Mann said under this scheme, an option would also be given to those beneficiaries who want to get ration supply from the nearby depots as per their convenience.

He said the people have to still stand in long queues for fetching ration even after 75 years of Independence, whereas now in a digital era, people can get anything delivered online within no time at their place. This people-friendly initiative would ensure the best quality ration at their doorsteps as "earlier our mothers had to go even two km for getting ration that too of substandard quality not fit for human consumption". "Our government has made an endeavour to provide healthy and hygienic ration at your doorsteps."

Mann said this scheme was earlier introduced in Delhi by the Arvind Kejriwal government but somehow was stalled by the Centre as it intended to make people stand in long queues for ration.

AMID POLITICAL SLUGFEST, IT'S A LONELY BATTLE FOR KASHMIRI PANDITS

In the din surrounding 'The Kashmir Files', Kashmiri Pandits seem to be fighting a lonely battle for justice. Yes, the movie has brought out a lot of empathy for the community, but the politics being played out over their plight is downplaying the fight for justice of every Kashmiri who has fallen to the bullets of terror.

Whether it is the BJP, Congress, Aam Aadmi Party, TRS, or the Trinamool Congress, the movie has become a tool to lash out at each other. All are trying to either score points or run one another down to portray a particular image for political benefits.

The BJP has given a push to 'The Kashmir Files' after Prime Minister Narendra Modi appreciated the film openly through his tweets and during his address to the BJP parliamentary party on March 16. He even said that "some people were trying to discredit the film which has depicted the truth".

Several BJP-ruled states, including Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Karnataka, Uttarakhand, Bihar, and now Goa, have made the movie tax-free.

When a similar demand was made in the Delhi Assembly by the BJP MLAs, Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal criticised the move of making the film tax-free, and suggested the filmmaker upload it on YouTube for all to see free of cost. Amid applause and tablethumping from the AAP MLAs present in the Assembly, Kejriwal attacked the BJP MLAs and said they have been on the job of putting up posters of the film. "Did you enter politics to do this?" he asked mockingly.

Soon thereafter, the BJP launched a scathing attack on Kejriwal. Posting a picture showing Keiriwal and AAP MLAs laughing in the Delhi Assembly, BJP general secretary B.L. Santhosh tweeted: "Never forget ... They are laughing people who lost their lives in J&K due to terrorism ... laughing at mothers who lost their children ,.. children who lost their parents ... security forces who were killed ... women who were butchered ... children who were shot at ... Shameless anarchists."

The BJP and the AAP have been at loggerheads over the Delhi municipal elections and both are using the 'The Kashmir Files' as the proverbial cannon ball.

Blaming the Congress for the plight of Kashmiri Hindus, Union Home Minister Amit Shah said in Gujarat: "'The Kashmir Files' shows how under the Congress rule, atrocities and terrorism spread in Kashmir."

Rahul Gandhi, who claims to be a Kashmiri Pandit, has not commented on the movie or even on the plight of Kashmiri Pandits. Several other party leaders, however, jumped into the fray. Senior leader Jairam Ramesh said in a tweet: "Some films inspire

change. 'The Kashmir Files' incites hate. Truth can lead to justice, rehabilitation, reconciliation and peace. Propaganda twists facts, distorts history to whip up anger and promote violence. Statesmen heal wounds. Pracharaks exploit fear and prejudice to divide and rule."

Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel, after watching the movie at a multiplex in Raipur along with his cabinet colleagues and party MLAs on March 16, said: "The movie portrays half-truths and only shows violence without conveying any message." Chief Ministers Mamata Banerjee and K. Chandreshekhar Rao, and many other leaders have been critical of the movie and the way the BJP has been promoting it.

The political parties are making the most of the plight of Kashmiri Pandits, but no one is actually doing anything to bring justice to them. The BJP has been showcasing the Kashmiri Pandit genocide to whip up the majority's passion, but on the ground there's been no

Thirty-two years after the genocide, no judicial commission or even an inquiry commission been formed to probe the exodus. In almost 95 per cent of the violent incidents perpetrated against the community, no FIR have been filed and even those where cases have been lodged, there has been no movement at all. The BJP-led Centre has failed to come up with a plan for the return and rehabilitation of the community.

The plight of the Kashmiri Pandit community is yet another poll

plank for the BJP and the ilk, but even those who champion the cause of humanity are failing to sit up and take note. Not any of the civil society groups of the country or the plethora or

human rights bodies have taken up the cause of the beleaguered community.

'The Kashmir Files' box office collection crossed the Rs 200 croremark on March 24, becoming the biggest post-pandemic grosser before the release of 'RRR'.

The makers surely must be exalted and the political parties jumping in to derive the appropriate mileage, but for the Kashmiri Pandit community, it is like reliving the horror and experiencing the trauma once again.

It is a lone struggle for the minuscule minority of Kashmir, which has a 5,000-year-old history behind it, but is today struggling to save its roots, culture, and identity, and getting justice for the families of B.K. ONTARIO EXTENDS FREEZE ON COLLEGE AND **UNIVERSITY TUITION BY AN ADDITIONAL YEAR**

colleges and universities by an additional year, through 2022-2023, seeking access to affordable postsecondary education.

CANADA'S 1ST LARGE-SCALE DOMESTIC EV BATTERY MANUFACTURING FACILITY CONFIRMED FOR WINDSOR, ONT.



With the support of the Ontario, federal and municipal governments, LG Energy Solution and automaker Stellantis are joining forces to build the province's first large-scale electric vehicle (EV) battery manufacturing plant.

The joint venture between LG Energy Solution, Ltd. (LGES) and Stellantis N.V. will invest more than CDN \$5 billion (USD \$4.1 billion) to build a facility in Windsor to manufacture batteries for EVs in Canada, representing the largest automotive manufacturing investment in the history of the province. This historic investment puts Ontario on a path to becoming one of the most vertically integrated automotive jurisdictions in the emerging North American EV market. The battery facility, with a production capacity of 45 gigawatt hours (GWh) that will supply Stellantis plants in the North American market, will employ an estimated 2,500 people. Construction activities are scheduled to begin later this year with production operations planned to launch in the first guarter of 2024. The facility will be fully operational by 2025. "Attracting this multi billion-dollar investment will secure Ontario's place as a North American hub for building the cars and batteries of the future," said Premier Doug Ford. "As we secure gamechanging investments, we're also connecting resources, industries and workers in northern Ontario with the manufacturing might of southern Ontario to build up home-grown supply chains. Every region of Ontario will benefit with thousands of jobs being created and a stronger economy that works for everyone."

This investment will accelerate Ontario's 10-year vision for the Driving Prosperity? The Future of Ontario's Automotive Sector plan. Phase 2 of Driving Prosperity demonstrates the government's commitment to transform the province's automotive supply chain to build the cars of the future, including the production of hybrid and fully battery electric vehicles, EV battery and component production, and increasing exports of Ontario-made auto parts and innovations.

Ontario's top-quality manufacturing talent, clean and competitive electricity, access to investment-ready sites, and commitments to streamline the approvals process continue to make the province a destination for major investments, ensuring that everyone in Ontario benefits from the auto sector's long-term growth and success. This gamechanging investment helps secure the province's position as a competitive player in the low-carbon economy of the future.

ONTARIO GOVERNMENT INCREASING NON-**RESIDENT SPECULATION TAX TO 20%**

As part of its commitment to tackle Ontario's housing crisis by prioritizing Ontario families and homebuyers, the government is increasing the Non-Resident Speculation Tax rate to 20 per cent, closing loopholes to fight tax avoidance and expanding the tax to apply provincewide effective March 30, 2022. The changes made to establish the tax as the most comprehensive in Canada were announced as the government prepares to unveil the next components of its housing supply action plan designed to build more homes in Ontario. Currently, the Non-Resident Speculation Tax rate is 15 per cent and only applies to homes purchased in the Greater Golden Horseshoe Region by foreign nationals, foreign corporations and taxable trustees. Increasing the tax rate to 20 per cent and expanding the tax to apply provincewide will strengthen efforts to deter non-resident investors from speculating on Ontario's housing market and help make home ownership more attainable for Ontario residents. The Government of Ontario is eliminating loopholes to support Ontarians who are trying to buy their first home by focusing NRST relief eligibility to only newcomers who commit to laying down roots in the province long-term. Rebates for new permanent residents of Canada and related exemptions will be available to eligible newcomers to ensure Ontario continues to be welcoming to new Canadians.

This includes an opportunity for foreign nationals studying and working in Ontario who become permanent residents of Canada to apply for the rebate. "Young families, seniors and workers are desperate for housing that meets their needs. But a lack of supply and rising costs have put the dream of home ownership out of reach for too many families in the province," said Peter Bethlenfalvy, Minister of Finance. "That is why our government is adopting the most comprehensive Non-Resident Speculation Tax in the country. Our government is working to increase supply and help keep costs low for Ontario families and homebuyers, not foreign speculators looking to turn a quick profit."

Ontario is also working with municipalities that are looking to establish a Vacant Home Tax, which is another tool to increase the supply of housing. The authority for municipalities to implement such taxes exists in the Municipal Act. The City of Toronto has introduced a Vacant Home tax, and a number of other municipalities, including Ottawa, are also preparing to implement similar taxes. The Province will also establish a working group with municipal representatives to facilitate the sharing of information and best practices. As well, Ontario will consult on potential measures to address concerns related to land speculation. For example, Ontario will explore ways to discourage construction slowdowns that may be artificially driving up prices of new homes for Ontario families through land speculation. "Our government is taking action to bring home ownership within reach for more hardworking Ontario families, and I look forward to sharing our plan in the near future," said Steve Clark, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing.



Toronto Mayor launches City's first Reconciliation Action Plan



Mayor John Tory announced the details of the City of Toronto's first Reconciliation Action Plan, which will be considered by the City's Executive Committee on Wednesday, March 30. The recommended action plan will guide the City's actions from 2022 to 2032 to advance truth, justice and reconciliation.

The announcement was made alongside Elder/Grandmother Dorothy Peters, City Manager Chris Murray, Councillor Mike Layton (University-Rosedale), Selina Young, Director, Indigenous Affairs Office, and Bryan Winters, co-chair of the Aboriginal Affairs Advisory Committee.

The Reconciliation Action Plan builds on the City's existing commitments to Indigenous Peoples through 28 meaningful actions across five themes: actions to restore truth, actions to right relations and share power, actions for justice, actions to make financial reparations and actions for the Indigenous Affairs Office.

The 28 actions outlined in the Plan will contribute to the visibility and overall wellbeing of First Nations, Inuit and Métis Peoples in Toronto through placemaking and placekeeping, supporting economic development and prosperity, increasing civic engagement, honouring Indigenous ways of knowing and being, and recognizing rights to self-determination and self-governance. A key priority for the City will be addressing barriers and colonial practices embedded in its policies, processes and practices to better serve Indigenous residents in Toronto. The Reconciliation Action Plan was developed over three years with input from First Nations, Inuit and Métis community members, organizations, Elders, Knowledge Carriers, youth, and Indigenous employees and allies in the Toronto Public Service. The Plan will be a living document, which will evolve, as needed, to incorporate directives from any future public inquiries or calls for government action from local Indigenous communities and organizations. The City will also continue to collaborate with Indigenous leaders and community members to fulfill the actions within the Plan, ensure transparency and accountability, and improve relationships with Indigenous Peoples.

The Reconciliation Action Plan was acknowledged and endorsed by the Aboriginal Affairs Advisory Committee in its meeting on Tuesday, March 8 as a City mechanism to begin the process of reconciliation with the Indigenous community.

Several key reports and calls to action informed the Reconciliation Action Plan, including: the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada's Final Report in 2015, the 2019 National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, the 2007 United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples and the City's 2010 Statement of Commitment to Aboriginal Communities.





MEN, WOMEN PROCESS PAIN SIGNALS **DIFFERENTLY: STUDY**

Neurons in the spinal cord process pain signals differently in women compared to men, suggests a study.

The finding, published in the journal BRAIN, could lead to better and more personalised treatments for chronic pain, which are desperately needed, especially in light of the opioid epidemic.

Women are disproportionately impacted by the burden of chronic pain. They are more likely than men to report low back pain, neck pain, orofacial pain and neuropathic pain, and twice as many women report common migraines or headaches.

But to date, most research on pain was conducted on male rodents. The new study led by researchers at The Ottawa Hospital in Canada, however, used female and male spinal cord tissue from both rats and humans (generously donated by deceased individuals and their families). By examining the spinal cord tissue in the laboratory, the researchers were able to show that a neuronal growth factor called BDNF plays a major role in amplifying spinal cord pain signalling in male humans and male rats, but not in female humans or female rats. When female rats had their ovaries removed, the difference disappeared, pointing to a hormonal connection.

"Developing new pain drugs requires a detailed understanding of how pain is processed at the biological level," said Dr. Annemarie Dedek, lead author of the study. "This new discovery lays the foundation for the development of new treatments to help those suffering from chronic pain." This is the first time a sex-related difference in pain signalling has been identified in human spinal cord tissue. Future studies are required to understand how this biological difference may contribute to differences in pain sensation between men and women, the researchers said.

India, US to hold 2+2 dialogue on April 11 in Washington

India and United States are scheduled to hold 2+2 dialogue in Washington on April 11. External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and Defence Minister Rainath Singh will meet their counterparts Secretary of State Antony Blinken and US Defence Secretary Lloyd Austin.

Jaishankar and Rajnath Singh will also have other meetings scheduled on the sidelines.

The last 2+2 Ministerial Dialogue between the two countries was held in October 2020 in New Delhi.

India and the United States held a bilateral 2+2 inter-sessional meeting in September last year in Washington and exchanged assessments on developments in South Asia, the Indo-Pacific region and the Western Indian Ocean.

Both sides took stock of the progress and developments in the bilateral agenda under the India-US strategic partnership, including defence, global public health, economic and commercial cooperation, science and technology, clean energy and climate finance, and people-to-people ties.

BJP wants to kill Kejriwal after poll defeat in Punjab, says Sisodia

Delhi Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia alleged on Wednesday that after its poll defeat in Punjab, the BJP wants to "kill" Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal. The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) leader also said they will lodge a formal complaint in this connection.

He was addressing a press conference after a protest at Kejriwal's residence earlier by the Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha (BJYM), the youth wing of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), during which CCTV cameras and barriers were allegedly damaged by the protesters.

"As it could not defeat Arvind Kejriwal in the Punjab polls, the BJP now wants to kill him (hatya karna chahta hai). Today's attack on the chief minister's house shows that the BJP, with the help of police, wants to kill Kejriwal. We will lodge a formal complaint against this," Sisodia alleged. He said the "life-threatening attack" on Kejriwal was "properly planned". UTTARAKHAND CM DHAMI ALLOTS PORTFOLIOS, KEEPS OVER TWO DOZEN DEPARTMENTS WITH HIMSELF



Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami has allotted portfolios to the ministers in his cabinet and kept the charge of 21 departments, including home and information, to himself. The allocation of portfolios late Tuesday came nearly a week after the ministers took the oath of office. Chief minister Dhami's portfolios include the secretariat administration, general administration, estate, information, home, revenue, industrial development (mining), labour, information technology and science technology, drinking water, power, Ayush, excise, justice, civil aviation, environment protection and climate change, disaster management, and rehabilitation. During his previous tenure, Dham was in charge of 12 ministries.

Not much has been changed in the portfolio of senior cabinet minister Satpal Maharaj. Maharaj has been given charge of the Public Works Department (PWD), Panchayati Raj, rural construction, culture, religious affairs, tourism, flood control, and irrigation. Maharaj is both the eldest and richest minister in the Dhami cabinet of eight ministers. Dhan Singh Rawat has been given more responsibility with the school education of both basic and secondary levels along with the higher education department going under him. Rawat will also be the minister of Medical Health and Education along with that of Cooperation and Cultural Education. In the previous cabinet, he was in charge of the higher education, cooperatives, disaster management, dairy development, and protocols departments.

Subodh Uniyal, who served as the agriculture minister in the previous Uttarakhand cabinet, has been given charge of the forest, language, election and technical education departments. The only woman in the new cabinet, Rekha Arya, has been given the portfolios of women empowerment and child development, food, civil supplies and consumer protection, and sports and youth welfare departments. Ganesh Joshi has been given the responsibility of agriculture and farmer welfare, soldier welfare and village development. Out of the three first-time ministers, former speaker Prem Chand Agarwal has the most important portfolios of finance, housing and urban development, parliamentary affairs, and census. Saurabh Bahuguna, the son of former Uttarakhand CM Vijay Bahuguna, has been given the responsibility of animal husbandry, dairy development, fisheries, skill development, protocol and sugarcane development, and sugar trade departments. He is another new face in the cabinet.

Exercise increased caution while travelling to India, says new US travel advisory

The United States in a new travel advisory has urged its citizens to exercise "increased caution" while travelling to India and advised them to not to travel to Jammu and Kashmir and within 10 km of the India-Pakistan border. "Exercise increased caution in India due to crime and terrorism," the US State Department said in its latest travel advisory for India that decreases the risk of travel to India from Level 3 to Level 2. The last travel advisory issued by the United States was on January 25.

The State Department's travel advisory comes a day after the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has issued a Level 1 Travel Health Notice due to Covid-19, indicating a low level of Covid-19 in India. Both the advisories are indicative of the fact that the US considers that the situ-



ation in India is now returning to normal. However, its view on Jammu and Kashmir and the Indo-Pak border remains the same, where it is asking its citizens not to travel. "Terrorist attacks and violent civil unrest are possible in the union territory of Jammu and Kashmir. Avoid all travel to this union territory (with the exception of visits to the eastern Ladakh region and its capital, Leh)," the advisory said. "Sporadic violence occurs particularly along the Line of Control (LoC) separating India and Pakistan, and in tourist destinations in the Kashmir Valley: Srinagar, Gulmarg, and Pahalgam. The Indian government prohibits foreign tourists from visiting certain areas along the LoC," the State Department said. India and Pakistan maintain a strong military presence on both sides of the border, it said, adding that the only official India-Pakistan border crossing point for persons who are not citizens of India or Pakistan is in the state of Punjab between Atari, India, and Wagah, Pakistan. "The border crossing is usually open, but confirm the current status of the border crossing prior to commencing travel. A Pakistani visa is required to enter Pakistan. Only US citizens residing in India may apply for a Pakistani visa in India. Otherwise, apply for a Pakistani visa in your country of residence before travelling to India," it said.

RUSSIA WOULD NOT SUPPLY GAS TO EUROPE FOR FREE



Russia does not intend to engage in charity and export gas to Europe for free, Kremlin spokesperson Dmitry Peskov said while commenting on statements by representatives of Western countries that they will not pay for deliveries in rubles. Peskov also stressed that Moscow was not the initiator of such a development of the situation, since it was the Western states that unleashed an economic war against Russia, RT News reported. Western countries unleashed an economic war against Russia, he added. "Western European countries, the US, Canada, Australia are actually waging a war against us in trade and the economy," Peskov was quoted by TASS in an interview with PBS. According to him, Western countries seized Russian property, seize money, block financial relations. He noted that Russia has to adapt to the new reality. Russia does not intend to supply Europe with gas for free, Peskov said on the air of the American television company PBS."No payment - no gas," TASS quoted Peskov as saying.

According to him, he does not know what will happen if the EU refuses to pay for gas in rubles. "However, we definitely do not intend to engage in charity in this regard - to send gas to Western Europe for free." He noted that Russia will study options for action as soon as they learn about the final decision.

SRI LANKA PLUNGES INTO 10-HOUR DAILY POWER CUT AS FUEL CRISIS WORSENS



The Sri Lankan government on Wednesday imposed a nationwide 10-hour daily power cut due to shortage of hydro-electricity triggered by non-availability of fuel. Sri Lanka is facing an unprecedented acute economic and energy crisis caused due to shortage of foreign exchange. A sudden rise in prices of key commodities and fuel shortage forced tens of thousands of people to queue for hours outside petrol filling stations. People are also facing long hours of power cuts daily. All essentials are in short supply due to import restrictions forced by the forex crisis. The daily power cuts in the island nation have been further extended Wednesday morning to 10 hours, officials said. The country has been facing a seven-hour power outage since the beginning of the month. "There is a shortage of 750 megawatt due to non availability of fuel to generate thermal power," the chair of the Public Utilities Commission Janaka Ratnayaka said. State-run Ceylon Petroleum Corporation (CPC) has asked motorists not to queue outside fuel stations on Wednesday and Thursday to purchase diesel as it was unable to pay for a shipment that had arrived.

COVID: OMICRON SUBVARIANT BA.2 BECOMES DOMINANT STRAIN IN UNITED STATES, SAYS CDC

The BA.2 sub-lineage of the Omicron variant has become the dominant strain in the US, according to new data released by the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The variant has been steadily rising in proportion due to its increased transmissibility compared to the original Omicron strain, Xinhua news agency reported. The BA.2 variant represented 54.9 per cent of new Covid-19 cases for the week ending March 26, according to CDC data. This data is up from 39 per cent a week prior, and 27.8 per cent two weeks before. The BA.2 subvariant is thought to be about 30 per cent more transmissible than the original BA.1 Omicron strain, early study suggested.

'VLADIMIR PUTIN CANNOT REMAIN IN POWER' REMARK WAS MORAL OUTRAGE, **NO APOLOGIES: JOE BIDEN**



US President Joe Biden on Monday said that his weekend comment in Europe that his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin cannot remain in power was a moral outrage for his invasion of Ukraine, and that does not reflect any change in American policy with respect to regime change. As such, Biden refused to apologize for his comments, on which his administration has been having a tough time in explaining over the past few days. "I'm not walking anything back. The fact of the matter is, I was expressing the moral outrage I felt toward the way Putin is dealing ..., which is just brutality, half the children of Ukraine. I just come from being with those families," Biden told reporters at the White House. "But I want to make it clear, I wasn't then nor am I now articulating a policy change. I was expressing the moral outrage that I feel and I make no apologies for it," he said when asked about his remarks last week in Europe where he had gone to shore up his allies and show solidarity with the people of Ukraine. "For God's sake, this man (Putin) cannot remain in power," Biden had said last week. Responding to questions, Biden said the escalatory efforts of Putin to continue and engage in carnage... "The kind of behaviour of that makes the whole world say, My God, what is this man doing?" "He (Putin) is going to become a pariah worldwide and who knows what he becomes at home in terms of support," said the US President.

I was there with my children but not the way I should have been. Now, I am doing it. I have realised this now at the age of 56-57. I wonder what would have happened if I realised it at the age of 86, at least now I can rectify. I don't know what my children want, so that is the big problem," Khan said. He further said the moment he had this realisation, he was very angry and that anger came out towards cinema. "I felt it (cinema) took me away from my family. I told my family I will quit, not act, produce films. I told them I want to be with you all. It was responsive anger. My family was shocked," Khan said. The actor revealed that he initially decided to not speak about his thought of bidding adieu to cinema as he believed that some people might perceive it as a marketing tool for his next film "Laal Singh Chadha". In all of this, Khan said, three months passed and his children explained to him not to become "an extreme" person and rather try to find a "balance in life".

"My kids and Kiran ji explained to me I am doing the wrong thing.



Kiran got rather emotional and said films reside inside me. So, a lot happened in two years, I quit the industry and came back," he said. Khan said the last two years were indeed difficult for all of them. "I did get time to think, I went through a lot of introspection. A big change came to me. I am thinking about how I have spent my life.

Like, I have been working since the age of 18 with my uncle as an assistant director. Today I am 57. This world (of cinema) has attracted me so much and I got so passionate and forgot myself at the cost of my responsibility. I was living my life, running behind my dreams, I was not able to spend time with my loved ones," he added. The actor further shared that he didn't know the dreams, hopes, anxiety and fears of his children but knew the same things about his filmmakers like Ashutosh Gowariker and Raju Hirani.

"Time is an important resource and we know it will end but when we don't know. It was a sharp realisation."






