FORMER JAPANESE PM SHINZO ABE ASSASSINATED; 90-MEMBER TASK FORCE TO PROBE CASE

Police in Japan have said that a 90-member task force will be set up to investigate the murder case of former Prime Minister Shinzo Abe, who died after being shot at while addressing an election campaign rally in Nara city. The announcement was made late Friday night by the Nara prefectural police at a press conference, reports state broadcaster NHK. The police said that they will review the security arrangement that had been in place while Abe was delivering his speech on Friday morning near the Yamatosaidaiji Station in Nara.



JUNE GTA HOME SALES DOWN 41%, AVERAGE SELLING PRICE STANDS AT \$1.14 MILLION, UP 5.3% FROM JUNE 2021

Higher borrowing costs continued to impact home sales in June 2022. Sales totalled 6,474 – down by 41 per cent compared to last year's strong result. The number of transactions was also down compared to May 2022, but this is often the case due to the seasonal nature of the market. The average selling price, at \$1,146,254, remained 5.3 per cent above the June 2021 level, but continued to trend lower on a monthly basis. The MLS® Home Price Index Composite benchmark was up by 17.9 per cent year-over-year, but also experienced a month-over-month dip compared to May. Annual price growth was driven more so by less expensive market segments, including townhouses and condominium apartments. "Home sales have been impacted by both the affordability challenge presented by mortgage rate hikes and the psychological effect wherein home buyers who can afford higher borrowing costs have put their decision on hold to see where home prices end up. Expect current market conditions to remain in place during the slower summer months. Once home prices stabilize, some buyers will re-enter the market despite higher borrowing costs," said TRREB President Kevin Crigger. While the number of transactions was down year-over-year, the number of new listings was little changed over the same period. This has provided for more balance in the market, resulting in a more moderate annual pace of price growth. "Listings will be an important indicator to watch over the next few months. With the unemployment rate low, the majority of households aren't in a position where they need to sell their home. If would-be sellers decide to take a wait-and-see attitude over the next few months, it's possible that active listings could trend lower as well. This could cause market conditions to tighten somewhat, providing some support for home prices," said TRREB Chief Market Analyst Jason Mercer.


CANADA'S EMPLOYMENT FELL BY 43,000; UNEMPLOYMENT RATE FALLS TO 4.9% IN JUNE

Employment fell by 43,000 (-0.2%) in June. The unemployment rate fell 0.2 percentage points to a new record low of 4.9%, as fewer people searched for work. The employment loss was almost entirely due to a decrease among workers aged 55 and older. Across industries, a decline in the services-producing sector, particularly in retail trade, was moderated by gains in the goods-producing sector. At the provincial level, employment decreased in Newfoundland and Labrador and Quebec, while there were gains in Prince Edward Island and Manitoba. Self-employment declined, while the number of employees in both the public and the private sectors held steady. Total hours worked rose 1.3% in June, the first increase since March 2022. Average hourly wages rose 5.2% (+\$1.54 to \$31.24) on a year-over-year basis in June, up from 3.9% in May and 3.3% in April (not seasonally adjusted). **Employment falls in June** Employment fell by 43,000 (-0.2%) in June, fully offsetting the increase of 40,000 recorded in May. The number of self-employed workers fell by 59,000 (-2.2%), while the number of employees held steady in both the public and the private sectors. Employment was down among workers aged 55 and over (-51,000; -1.2%). It was little changed among youth aged 15 to 24 and the core-age population aged 25 to 54. Employment decreased in Newfoundland and Labrador and Quebec, while there were gains in Prince Edward Island and Manitoba. Employment in the services-producing sector declined by 76,000 (-0.5%) in June, with losses spread across several industries, including retail trade. **CONTD. FROM PAGE 7**

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DEPUTY PRIME MINISTER CHRYSTIA FREELAND VISITS BRAMPTON TRUCKERS

Canada's Deputy Prime Minister Chrystia Freeland visited KJS Transport in Brampton as part of a cross country tour to share how the government is making life more affordable for Canadians. The event organized by the Ontario Dump Truck Association (ODTA) featured a facility tour followed by remarks. The Minister was joined by local MPs Shafiq Ali, Ruby Sahota, Maninder Sidhu and Sonia Sidhu. "We are so honoured to have Minister Freeland visit our company," said Tanvir Singh, Operations Manager at KJS Transport "My father Kulwant Singh and my uncle Jinder Singh Buttar started this business as new immigrants with one truck each back in 2002. Today KJS Trucking is a leader in the industry with more than 300 pieces of equipment, a mechanic shop, head office and over 150 diverse staff. My cousin Amrit Buttar and I are the next generation that will grow this family business and keep our trucking industry strong." The Minister heard first-hand about industry challenges and shared information about measures the Government of Canada is taking to help address inflation and other economic pressures. "We know that Canadians are worried about inflation and that they're asking what their government is going to do about it," said Minister

Freeland. "That's why we have a new Affordability Plan that is going to make life more affordable for Canadians at a time when they need it most. For a couple here in Brampton, with an income of \$45,000 and a child in daycare, this Affordability Plan could mean roughly an additional \$7,600 on top of existing benefits—more than 16 per cent of their annual income—this fiscal year." Members of the Ontario Dump Truck Association (ODTA) were also on hand. "The trucking industry is struggling with high gas prices, insurance rates, regulatory burdens and labour shortages," said Bob Punia, Director of the ODTA. "That's why it's important that leaders like Minister Freeland meet with grassroots organizations and individuals to truly understand our concerns and work collaboratively to find solutions. We are very impressed that she has taken the time to learn about and recognize the importance of our essential sector that literally builds our homes, roads, infrastructure and keeps the economy moving." Brampton is a major Canadian transportation and logistics hub with thousands of direct and spin-off jobs generated in the region. Truckers were deemed essential and continued to work throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.

PUNJAB CM STARTS SECOND INNINGS, MARRIES DOCTOR GURPREET KAUR

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Thursday tied the knot with Gurpreet Kaur, a doctor from Haryana, in a low-key small private ceremony as per Sikh rituals at his official residence here amidst the presence of Delhi Chief Minister and AAP national convener Arvind Kejriwal. It is for the first time that a marriage ceremony was solemnised in the Chief Minister's residence. Mann, 48, divorced his first wife Inderpreet Kaur in 2015. He has two children from that marriage — daughter Seerat Kaur Mann (21) and son Dilshan Singh Mann (17), who attended Mann's swearing-in ceremony on March 16. The Chief Minister made a surprise wedding announcement a day earlier. It is believed to be an arranged marriage. Donning golden attire and a yellow turban with traditional studded 'kalgi' atop, groom Mann arrived for the wedding under a Phulkari 'dupatta' with AAP Rajya Sabha member Raghav Chadha, Kejriwal and a select few AAP senior leaders walking beside him. Kejriwal performed the wedding rituals as Mann's elder brother. A ribbon-cutting ceremony was also performed with the bride's women friends blocking the entrance of the marriage venue. After the conclusion of Anand Karaj ceremony, the couple took blessings of those present at the wedding. Bride Kaur, 32, an MBBS degree holder from Maharishi Markandeshwar University in Mullana in Ambala district, is the youngest of three sisters. The elder ones are settled in the US and Australia. Just hours before tying the knot, Mann's would-be bride said the auspicious day has come. "Din Shagna Da Chadyaa (the auspicious day has come (for her wedding)," Kaur tweeted and also posted her photo. Only close family members, including Mann's mother, sister and a few relatives and friends attended the wedding. Speaking to the media before attending the wedding, Kejriwal said his younger brother Bhagwant Mann is getting married and embarking on a new journey.



"My younger brother is getting married and embarking on a new journey. My best wishes to him," Kejriwal told the media at the Chandigarh airport. Responding to Mann's wedding, AAP Rajya Sabha MP Chadha told the media here, "Happiness is back in Bhagwant Mann's house after a long time." An elated Chadha added, "Saade veer da vyah, sanu gode gode chah (My brother is getting married, I am extremely happy)." He shared a picture on Twitter with Mann, who was seen in wedding golden attire donning a yellow turban. Consul General of Canada in Chandigarh, Patrick Hebert, greeted the Chief Minister by tweeting, "Beautiful day for a wedding in #Chandigarh. Congratulations to Chief Minister @BhagwantMann and @DrGurpreetKaur_ and best wishes for a happy life!" The food menu for the wedding includes karahi paneer, lasagna Siciliano, tandoori kulche, dal makhani, navratan biryani, apricot stuffed kofta and Burrani Raita. A variety of lip-smacking sweets include fresh fruit trifle, moong dal halwa, angoori rasmalai and rabari.

CANADA, US, MEXICO TO MAINTAIN TRADE FLOWS IN EMERGENCY SITUATIONS



Top trade officials of Canada, the US and Mexico announced that the three countries will work to ensure trade flows in emergency situations. Canadian Minister of International Trade, Export Promotion, Small Business and Economic Development Mary Ng, Mexican Secretary of Economy Tatiana Clouthier and US Representative Katherine Tai met on Thursday and Friday for the second meeting of the Canada-United States-Mexico Agreement (CUSMA) Free Trade Commission, reports Xinhua news agency. In a joint statement issued late Friday, the ministers directed the commission's Competitiveness Committee to complete, within 90 days, negotiations on the establishment of a sub-committee to cooperate during

emergency situations in order to maintain, re-establish, or otherwise address issues related to the flow of trade between the three countries. A working group under that sub-committee will also be set up to coordinate on a shared understanding of critical infrastructure priorities, according to the statement. The CUSMA entered into force in July 2020. The trading bloc has a combined gross domestic product (GDP) of nearly \$25.1 trillion and a population of 495 million people. The total value of merchandise trade between them reached nearly \$1.2 trillion in 2021, according to the Canadian government.

HALF OF CANADIANS INFECTED WITH OMICRON IN FIVE MONTHS: REPORT



Half of the Canadian population, or more than 17 million people, were infected with Omicron in only five months starting December 2021, local media has reported. The media outlet quoted a report by the Covid-19 Immunity Task Force (CITF) showing that prior to Omicron, just 7 per cent of Canadians had antibodies from being infected by the virus. The proportion rose by 45 per cent from December 2021 to May 2022, Xinhua news agency reported, referring to National Post. According to the report, this increase is equivalent to more than 100,000 infections per day, which is more than 10 times the number of daily cases seen during previous peaks of SARS-CoV-2 waves over the last two years. The highest level of infection was found in young adults aged 17 to 24, based off of donations made to Canadian Blood Services. A total of 65 per cent of them had antibodies at the end of May, the report revealed. The results are based on population seropositivity, or "the proportion of people with antibodies to SARS-CoV-2 in their blood", the report explained, adding that the research differentiated between antibodies that occurred naturally as a reaction to being infected by the virus and antibodies created by the vaccine. They were thus able to determine which antibodies were a sign of past infection "to track the magnitude of the Omicron wave". "Omicron has been a tsunami," CITF Executive Director Tim Evans was quoted as saying. He said that new sublineages of the virus have been spreading since then, pushing the percentage of Canadians who have been infected "well above" 50 per cent. "Millions of Canadians now have hybrid immunity from a combination of Covid-19 vaccines and an infection," said CITF Co-Chair David Naylor. "Unfortunately, emerging evidence suggests that most of these individuals remain at risk of re-infection with viruses in the Omicron lineage," Naylor was quoted by the National Post. On April 23, 2020, the Canadian government launched CITF with a mandate to catalyse, support, fund and harmonise knowledge on SARS-CoV-2 immunity for federal, provincial, and territorial decision-makers in their efforts to protect Canadians and minimise the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic.

FORMER MP RAJ BABBAR GETS 2-YEAR JAIL IN A 1996 CASE


An MP/MLA court in Lucknow has awarded a two-year jail sentence to former MP Raj Babbar in a case related to 1996. The court has also imposed a fine of Rs 8,500 on the actor turned politician. The former MP was present in court when the sentence was announced. The Congress leader has been found guilty of interfering in government duties and physical assault. Babbar was found guilty of roughing up a government officer during the 1996 Lok Sabha elections. Babbar was then in the Samajwadi Party and was contesting the elections from Lucknow. The incident had taken place on May 2, 1996.



SACKED PUNJAB HEALTH MINISTER VIJAY SINGLA GETS BAIL IN BRIBERY CASE

Sacked Punjab's Health Minister Vijay Singla was granted bail on Friday by the Punjab and Haryana High Court in a bribery case. The bench of Justice Lisa Gill allowed his bail plea. Singla was accused of demanding "one per cent commission" in tenders and purchases by his department. In his bail petition through his counsels, Singla contended that the "first information report (FIR) was the outcome of political rivalry" and wreaking vengeance had "gathered unprecedented popularity among the masses." He was sacked from the Cabinet of the Bhagwant Mann government on May 24 and arrested shortly afterwards on corruption charges.

PEACE NEGOTIATIONS BETWEEN RUSSIA, UKRAINE TO GET MORE DIFFICULT WITH TIME: PUTIN



Russian President Vladimir Putin said his country is open to peace talks, but the negotiations with Ukraine will get more difficult with time passing by. "We do not refuse peace negotiations, but those who refuse should know that the more time they waste, the more difficult it will be for them to negotiate with us," Xinhua news agency quoted Putin as saying during a meeting with State Duma leaders and party faction heads. The President said that the West has been extremely aggressive towards Russia for decades. "Our proposals to create a system of equal security in Europe were rejected. Initiatives for joint work on the problem of missile defense were rejected. Warnings about the unacceptability of NATO expansion are ignored," he added. The attempts of Western countries to impose a new order on the world are doomed to fail, said the president.

BULLET TRAINS TO AMPHIBIAN AIRCRAFT, JAPANESE TEA TO GANGA AARTI - PM MODI'S DEEP BOND WITH SHINZO ABE TRANSCENDED GEOGRAPHICAL AND POLITICAL BOUNDARIES



Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said that he is "shocked and saddened beyond words" at the tragic demise of one of his "dearest friends", Shinzo Abe, the former Prime Minister of Japan who died after being shot during a speech in Nara, Japan on Friday.

Calling him a towering global statesman, an outstanding leader and a remarkable administrator, PM Modi said that Abe dedicated his life to make Japan and the world a better place.

PM Modi recalled that his association with Abe goes back many years, having known the Japanese leader since his long stint as Gujarat Chief Minister. "And, our friendship continued after I became PM. His sharp insights on economy and global affairs always made a deep impression on me," he said.

The Indian PM had recently met Shinzo Abe along with another former Japanese Prime Minister Yoshiro Mori in Tokyo on May 24. Abe was taking over as the Chairperson of the Japan-India Association (JIA)

which was established in 1903 and is one of the oldest friendship associations in the country.

"During my recent visit to Japan, I had the opportunity to meet Mr. Abe again and discuss many issues. He was witty and insightful as always. Little did I know that this would be our last meeting. My heartfelt condolences to his family and the Japanese people," PM Modi said in a series of tweets Friday afternoon.

The Special Strategic and Global Partnership between India and Japan, two major democracies in Asia, strengthened as the friendship between the two leaders blossomed ever since Modi visited Tokyo in 2014 for the first time after becoming PM.

Abe said that in order to build a win-win relationship through synergies between Modinomics and Abenomics he would like to set a common goal of doubling Japan's direct investment and the number of Japanese companies in India by 2019.

ASSASSINATIONS THAT SHOOK INDIA SINCE INDEPENDENCE

As the world mourns the assassination of former Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe, for many in India it brought back memories of leaders who suffered a similar fate like Mahatma Gandhi who was assassinated in 1948, Indira Gandhi in 1984, and Rajiv Gandhi in 1991. Known as "Father of the Nation" Mahatma Gandhi who played a significant role in the country's freedom movement fell to the bullets of Nathuram Godse on January 30, 1948.

Godse, who held Gandhi responsible for the partition, was later tried in the court and hanged.

Indira Gandhi, who was the Prime Minister in 1984, was shot by her bodyguards Beant Singh Satwant Singh and others on October 31 at her residence following Operation Blue Star at Golden Temple in Amritsar by removing Jarnail Singh Bhindranwale and his armed supporters from the premises which is a sacred site of the Sikh religion.

The guards were upset after the Army carried out the operation.

Similarly, her son and former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi was assassinated by the LTTE terrorist in 1991 during the poll campaign in

Sri Perumbudur in Tamil Nadu. He was killed by suicide bombers on May 21. The attack on Gandhi was made by Thenmozhi Rajaratnam, also known as Dhanu. Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE), Dhanu operative of the organisation approached him and bent down to touch his feet, leading to an explosion in an RDX-laden belt.

Besides Rajiv Gandhi, 14 others were also killed in the blast.

Not just this, but Punjab Chief Minister Beant Singh was also gunned down by the Sikh terrorists in 1995. He was killed at the secretariat complex in Chandigarh. The blast claimed the lives of 17 others, including Beant Singh who was accompanied by his close friend Ranjodh Singh Mann on the day of assassination.

In 2013, targeted by Left Wing Extremist organisation in Chhattisgarh, Congress leaders Vidya Charan Shukla and Mahendra Karma along with others lost their lives in the deadly attack.

Former Chief Minister of Punjab Partap Singh Kairon was killed after he stepped down from the chair and while travelling on GT Road on February 6, 1965 in Sonapat when he was on way from Delhi to Chandigarh.

Could ED have avoided grilling Rahul Gandhi for 50-plus hours?



"Congress teaches patience, I have been working since 2004, see even Sachin Pilot is sitting here, patience is inculcated in us," Congress leader Rahul Gandhi had quipped recently while sharing his experience of the marathon questioning by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) in the National Herald case.

It was a response Rahul Gandhi had given to the ED officials who, he said, were surprised by the "patience" with which he answered all the questions and managed to patiently sit for 10-12 hours a day during the interrogation.

The former Congress President was quizzed for more than 50 hours spread over five days in the National Herald case and during that period his party vociferously protested on the streets of the national capital. Every day, hundreds of Congress workers, including Parliamentarians and legislators, were detained by the police.

Every day, a large number of police personnel were diverted towards Congress headquarters and outside the ED office to prevent any untoward incident due to the presence of a large number of party workers.

The police personnel in heavy numbers, along with the paramilitary and rapid action forces, were also deployed at several points between the ED office and the Congress headquarters on 24 Akbar Road.

The grand old party accused the ruling BJP of using Central agencies for its own political vendetta. The party leaders said that the Enforcement Directorate has acted on a fabricated and fake case for which they summoned interim Congress President Sonia Gandhi and Rahul Gandhi for questioning in a case related to money laundering. "This case with no standing or evidence is just another attempt by the

BJP to attack the voices that question its failures and speak out against its despotism," the Congress leaders said.

So, could this high-voltage 'ED grilling', a term most often used when the probe agency interrogates someone for an extended duration, be avoided? If the agency was not going to place Rahul Gandhi under arrest, what was the need of calling him for five consecutive days? Was it all just a political vendetta? Was there any other way the agency could have got the answers from the Congress leader? Yes, there was an alternative way.

Instead of regularly calling Rahul Gandhi to the office, the ED could have given him a written questionnaire of their queries. Rahul Gandhi could have submitted it in the coming days, and thus it would have helped the law enforcement agencies, who were pressed into service to maintain law and order.

A similar stand was adopted earlier as well, and that too in the country's one of the most high-profile cases - the 2G scam.

Retired Special Judge O.P. Saini, who was looking after the 2G Spectrum case, had sent 1,000 written questions to the people involved in the matter. He had asked the persons facing prosecution to submit their answers in the coming days. It made the work easy for both the court and the persons involved.

Interestingly, the ED, in a span of five days, had asked Rahul Gandhi just 100 questions, which means an average of around 20 questions per day. Now, in the coming days, Sonia Gandhi has been summoned by the Ed in the National Herald case. If the agency does not wish to arrest her, it could opt for the other route to avoid turning the questioning into a political theatre.

'PUNJAB TAKING CARE OF IT', SC JUNKS PLEA SEEKING CBI PROBE IN SIDHU MOOSEWALA MURDER



The Supreme Court on Monday dismissed a plea by Punjab BJP leader Jagjit Singh seeking CBI probe into the cold-blooded murder of famous Punjabi singer Sidhu Moosewala.

A bench comprising Justices Ajay Rastogi and Abhay Oka said the case should not be given a political colour and Punjab is supposed to take care of it and they are taking care of the matter. Advocate Namit Saxena, representing Singh, said his client wanted a CBI probe, but Punjab Police is taking appropriate steps. "So, we don't want a central agency probe any longer. We are not pressing it..." submitted Saxena. The bench emphasized that such matters should not be connected with politics. "This court has to work openly for all the people. But it should not be given any political colour," said the bench, while dismissing the plea. Saxena said, "Yes we are not pressing for it further. If they were not taking steps, I would have pressed for it."

During the brief hearing, the bench asked Saxena, "Who are you?" Saxena replied he is representing the petitioner, who is a BJP member. The bench said, "My view is that politicians should not get into such matters, other arenas it is fine..."

The plea was filed through advocate on record, Namit Saxena and advocates Sarthak Chaturvedi and Shubham Jaiswal.

The plea submitted that there is a storm of fear and terror in Punjab, which warrants interference by the Supreme Court as fundamental rights of entire population of Punjab have been jeopardised at large. Shubdeep Singh Sidhu, known by his stage name 'Sidhu Moosewala' was shot dead in broad daylight on May 29 by unknown assailants. The plea said he was a young artist of just 28 years of age, who became globally famous by performing a niche art of Punjabi rap. "The brutal murder of Sidhu Moosewala is a glaring example where the conscience of the community at large has been shocked and the people of Punjab are confident that no effective investigation will be done by the state, rather it will try to cover up its failure by removing the security cover and the incident deserves to be investigated by a central agency," said the plea. The plea said on the next day of the murder, names of international gangsters such as Lawrence Bishnoi and Goldy Brar started coming into play when they took the responsibility of killing the deceased. "That also the present facts of the case involve not only inter-state but also international crime syndicates and it is expedient in the interests of justice if the investigation related to the present FIR is transferred to the Central Bureau of Investigation," added the plea.

AAP MP CHADHA APPOINTED PUNJAB ADVISORY PANEL CHIEF

Amid criticism by the Opposition, the Punjab government, led by leader Bhagwant Mann, on Monday appointed AAP Rajya Sabha member Raghav Chadha as Chairman of a state advisory committee on matters of public interest. The opposition parties had been saying that the Chief Minister would make Chadha the de facto Chief Minister by making him the committee's Chairman to take part in official meetings. A notification to constitute the committee, comprising a Chairman and members, who will not be entitled to any compensation, remuneration, or perks, was issued last week.

Responding to the appointment, state Congress chief Amarinder Singh Raja Warring slammed the government and accused Chief Minister Mann of ceding too much power to Chadha through the committee. He said appointing Chadha as Chairman is tantamount to making him the Chief Minister of Punjab. "Punjabis did not vote for this change. It seems @BhagwantMann ji has handed over the Punjab government on contract," said Raja Warring in a tweet.

The Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) also took a dig at the AAP-led government, saying the move put the show manager Chadha formally on stage. BJP leader Manjinder Singh Sirsa said as predicted and plotted by Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, Chadha made the chairman of an advisory committee to the Chief Minister Mann.

"Back door entry to Raghav Chadha to be super CM! Punjabis won't tolerate surrender of Punjab's sovereignty to Delhi, Mann Sahab. We will ensure he is removed ASAP!" Sirsa tweeted.

FIVE MEMBERS OF LAWRENCE BISHNOI GANG ARRESTED IN HARYANA

In a major crackdown, the Haryana Police's Special Task Force (STF) on Monday arrested five members of the Lawrence Bishnoi gang from Bahadurgarh town, including notorious luxury car thief Manoj Bakkarwala. A police spokesperson said the arrested persons include Chiraag, who was handling the drug trade in south Haryana, and is the younger brother of Tinu Bhiwani, who was arrested in the Sidhu Moosewala murder case. The other arrested accused were Bakkarwala, Prakash Barmer, resident of Rajasthan's Barmer, Amit of Pinjore (Haryana) and Sanjay, a resident of Punjab's Zirakpur. Acting on a tip-off, the STF laid a trap near Bahadurgarh bypass and apprehended the five.

Superintendent of Police, Sumit Kumar said the accused were active members of the Bishnoi gang and supply luxury vehicles and drugs to the gang. They also supply weapons to the gang from Delhi to Haryana and Punjab, besides making extortion calls.

The accused were arrested when they were entering Haryana from Delhi in stolen Innova and Scorpio vehicles.

Accused Bakkarwala and other arrested miscreants came in contact with Lawrence Bishnoi and Sampat Nehra, a key member of Bishnoi gang, through notorious gangster Tinu Bhiwani.

During interrogation, Bakkarwala revealed that apart from providing weapons and drugs to the Bishnoi gang, he has also been a habitual offender of stealing luxury cars. He has so far stolen hundreds of luxury vehicles from different states. He has been arrested many a time and escaped by dodging the police. Many cases are registered against him in Delhi, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh and Punjab.



INDIA TO SURPASS CHINA AS WORLD'S MOST POPULOUS COUNTRY IN 2023: UN

India is projected to surpass China as the world's most populous country in 2023, according to a UN report.

More than half of the projected increase in global population up to 2050 will be concentrated in just eight countries: Congo, Egypt, Ethiopia, India, Nigeria, Pakistan, the Philippines and Tanzania. Disparate growth rates among the world's largest countries will re-order their ranking by size.

In 2022, the two most populous regions are both in Asia: Eastern and South-Eastern Asia with 2.3 billion people (29 per cent of the global population), and Central and Southern Asia with 2.1 billion (26 per cent). China and India, with more than 1.4 billion each, accounted for most of the population in these two regions.

The world's population is projected to reach 8 billion on November

15, 2022. The latest projections by the United Nations suggest that the global population could grow to around 8.5 billion in 2030, 9.7 billion in 2050 and 10.4 billion in 2100.

Population growth is caused in part by declining levels of mortality, as reflected in increased levels of life expectancy at birth. Globally, life expectancy reached 72.8 years in 2019, an increase of almost 9 years since 1990. Further reductions in mortality are projected to result in an average longevity of around 77.2 years globally in 2050. Life expectancy at birth for women exceeded that for men by 5.4 years globally, with female and male life expectancies standing at 73.8 and 68.4, respectively. A female survival advantage is observed in all regions and countries, ranging from 7 years in Latin America and the Caribbean to 2.9 years in Australia and New Zealand.

SRI LANKA'S PARLIAMENT TO ELECT A NEW PRESIDENT ON JULY 20

Sri Lanka, which is completely bankrupt and embroiled in a political crisis virtually with no leader, had decided to elect a new President from the Parliament on July 20.

Speaker Mahinda Yapa Abeywardena made the announcement after President Gotabaya Rajapaksa informed him officially that he would resign on July 13, as he promised earlier.

The Speaker had summoned more than 35 political party leaders from both government and the opposition to decide the next steps to appoint an all-party government. Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe was also at the meeting.

"It was decided to summon the Parliament on July 15 and announcement is to be made with regard to the vacancy for the post of Presidency that needs to be filled. On July 19, nominations would be called to appoint a new President through an election in the Parliament on July 20.

"According to the Constitution when the post of President is vacated, Parliament should be summoned within three days and announcement should be made calling for nomination to appoint a new President. Thereafter, within two days, an election should be held," main opposition party Samagi Janawabalgaya's (United People Front) General Secretary Ranjith Maddumabandara said.

The cabinet ministers, who met Wickremesinghe on Saturday morning, announced that they had decided to hand over their responsibilities to an all-party government that is planned to be appointed.

Meanwhile, Central Bank Governor Dr. Nandalal Weerasinghe has



warned that ongoing political instability would worsen the current economic crisis, as it would delay talks for aid, reports said.

As the nation faced its worst-ever economic crisis, Sri Lankans had been demanding President Rajapaksa to resign from his position since March 31, the day they surrounded his private residence. Later the anti-Rajapaksa protesters reached Colombo on April 2 and occupied the entrance to President's Office and continued to protest until they took over official residence of the President and the Prime Minister on Saturday, amid violence with police and military fired teargas and live bullets on Saturday. Over 100 protesters and police personnel have been injured with one in critical condition.

PUNJAB CM SLAMS AKALIS FOR 'DILUTING' STATE'S CLAIM ON CHANDIGARH



Taking note of the "baseless" statements by Akali leaders on the issue of the state capital, Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Monday slammed the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) leadership for diluting the claim of state on Chandigarh.

"Everyone knows who shifted the state government offices from Chandigarh to Mohali and formed New Chandigarh," he said after paying obeisance at Sri Harmandir Sahib, popularly known as the Golden Temple here.

The Chief Minister accused SAD leaders, Parkash Singh Badal and Sukhbir Singh Badal, of conniving with the governments at the Centre to dilute the claims of Punjab over Chandigarh.

He categorically asked Sukhbir Badal to explain that why the SAD was tightlipped about Chandigarh when they were partners in the successive government at the Centre.

Mann said the Badals have remained mum for the sake of their vested political interests adding that even the Congress leadership remained mute spectator on the entire matter.

The Chief Minister further said the Akalis and the Congress were trying to score brownie points before the media by issuing baseless statements.

Mann said his government is committed for the well being of every strata of society. He said that every issue is being resolved after active consultation with the general public.

The Chief Minister, while assailing the Congress, said that its ministers had sold the trees of the state. On the contrary, he said that his government is committed for making Punjab clean, green and pollution free.

Mann said that his government will restore the pristine glory of the state in the coming days, and has decided not to allow any industrial unit to come up near Mattewara forests in Ludhiana. Earlier, the Chief Minister, accompanied by his wife, mother, and sister paid obeisance at Sri Harmandir Sahib.

PAKISTAN'S LNG IMPORTS DROP BY 15% AS EUROPE RAMPS UP PURCHASES AS ALTERNATIVE TO RUSSIAN SUPPLIES



As European nations ramp up purchases of natural gas as an alternative to Russian pipeline supplies, poorer countries like Pakistan are finding it difficult to compete for the fuel due to high prices, Express Tribune reported. Alongside other developing countries, Pakistan's LNG imports have decreased by 15 per cent due to the buying up by European Union members, according to a Wall Street Journal report. LNG price has skyrocketed 1,900 per cent from its tariff two years ago. The current prices are equivalent to purchasing oil at \$230 per barrel, whereas it is usually sold at a discount as compared to oil. Developing nations are unable to compete with Europe for the import at prices of nearly \$40 per million British thermal units (MMBtu), the WSJ report cited Wood Mackenzie data, revealing that European nations have jacked up LNG imports by almost 50 per cent year-to-date through June 19. Pakistani officials earlier said a tender from the country for around \$1 billion of LNG received no offers on Thursday, Express Tribune reported. Every day, businesses and homes are bearing hours of power outages as Pakistan can't import enough LNG for the power plants, they added. "Every molecule of gas that was available in our region has been purchased by Europe because they are trying to reduce their dependence on Russia," Petroleum Minister Musadik Malik was quoted as saying in the report. What's worse is that in some cases, cargoes destined for poorer countries are sent to Europe instead. According to experts, doing so is profitable even if the suppliers agree to pay penalties under contracts with developing nations. The world's supply of the natural gas used to produce power is scooped up by European countries, according to Valerie Chow, who heads gas and LNG research for Asia Pacific at the Wood Mackenzie. "Emerging markets in Asia have taken the brunt of it, with no end in sight," Chow told WSJ.

SIMARJIT SINGH BAINS, 4 OTHERS SURRENDER IN LUDHIANA RAPE CASE



Lok Insaaf party chief and former legislator Simarjit Singh Bains, along with four other accused, on Monday surrendered before a local court in Punjab's Ludhiana in connection with the rape of a 44-year-old woman. Besides Bains, Paramjit Singh Pamma, Jasbir Kaur, Baljinder Kaur and Pardeep Kumara surrendered in the court of Judicial Magistrate Harsimranjit Kaur. Two other accused — Karamjit Singh Bains and Sukhchain Singh — are in judicial custody. All seven were declared proclaimed offender on April 12. The court had also attached the property of Bains and Pamma. On November 16, 2020, the woman had moved a handwritten application to the Commissioner of Police of Ludhiana for registration of an FIR against the accused.

G20 Summit events in J&K, Ladakh will expose lies peddled by Pakistan, China

Holding the 2023 G20 Summit and its related events in J&K and Ladakh can be a major diplomatic victory for India, even as Pakistan and China have started voicing their reservations about the decision of the Narendra Modi government.

India will assume the G20 Presidency on December 1, 2022, from Indonesia, and will host the G20 Summit for the first time in India in 2023. Though it is essentially about economics, the G20 Summit could provide a platform to India to set certain age-old diplomatic issues on the right course.

At this moment, though, it is not clear whether the main Summit will be held in J&K or Ladakh, but the events related to it or the preparatory meetings, could definitely be hosted in the two union territories. The Centre has been silently working to set up the infrastructure in the two UTs needed to host a prestigious international event such as the G20 Summit.

On June 23, the Jammu and Kashmir administration constituted a five-member committee to coordinate with the Ministry of External Affairs on the G20 meetings.

As India embarks on its preparations for the big event, its neighbours, Pakistan and China, have started crying foul. Both have opposed India's plan to hold meetings linked to the conclave in Jammu and Kashmir. Despite this expected criticism, India is going ahead with planning some events related to the Summit in Ladakh as well. And preparatory steps have already been initiated. Ladakh Divisional Commissioner Saugat Biswas and the Deputy Inspector-General, Sheikh Junaid Mehmood, have been appointed nodal officers for the region for the events.

Why Pak, China are feeling the pinch

Pakistan and China have reasons to feel the pinch if big events take place in Kashmir and Ladakh. Not only will the world see the two regions as happy parts of India, the focus may also shift to China's illegal activities in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir by way of the China-Pakistan 'economic corridor', or CEPC. It may also put the focus back again on Pakistan as a country that sponsors terrorism against the people of Kashmir.

A successful G20-related event in Kashmir may have a ripple effect in Pakistan. The separatist movements in Balochistan, Sindh, or the anti-CEPC voices in PoK, may get a booster shot.

A rattled Pakistan has therefore rushed to its close allies Turkey and Saudi Arabia, and is exhorting them to boycott the summit. There are reports that Pakistan may also take up the matter with the US, the UK and other G20 nations.

What makes Pakistan and China uneasy is the fact that their narratives with regards to Kashmir may get exposed. Also, the OIC that toes Pakistan's

line on Kashmir may also get an answer.

Countries like Turkey, who have vociferously spoken against India on the issue of Kashmir, will be under focus as to whether they will go to Kashmir. And China too, which always nudges Pakistan against India and believes J&K and Ladakh are 'disputed' will have to decide whether to be part of the event in Kashmir or not.

G20 in Kashmir has a tremendous significance in the diplomatic world and will set a path for course correction for all those who have gone along with the propaganda of Pakistan and China.

The move by India may be viewed as an effort to assert its right to govern J&K as its integral part and reject Pakistan's counter-claim on it. It is also New Delhi's objective to make the international community recognise and realise India's sovereignty over both Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh.

Pak lies will be up for global scrutiny

Holding big events such as those related to the G20 Summit can also help expose Pakistan and the international lobbies backing its efforts to portray Kashmir as a militarised zone and ordinary Kashmiris as being persecuted.

Pakistan's stance is on expected lines because it opposes India's efforts to normalise the situation in Kashmir and tries to create trouble by sponsoring terrorism in the Valley. It uses any excuse to thwart steps that help in bringing stability and economic improvement for the local populace. After the abrogation of Article 370 on August 5, 2019, the two union territories have been opened up to the world as integral parts of India. A stream of international delegations have visited J&K ever since and presented a fair picture, thereby evoking a keen interest among investors. Several CEOs from Gulf countries have visited Kashmir to explore investment opportunities. Earlier this year, in March, more than 30 business persons from Gulf countries participated in an investment summit in Kashmir. They said there was a huge potential for investments in the UT. Though Pakistan has shown its annoyance on this, it has failed to create any effect. On the other hand, New Delhi has been encouraged by the

response of international business houses to invest in Jammu and Kashmir, so it has decided to raise the UT to the next level, which is to make it host big events such as the G20 summit next year.

G20: An economic powerhouse

The G20 comprises the world's major developed and developing economies. It accounts for 85 per cent of the global GDP, 75 per cent of international trade and two-thirds of the world population, making it the premier forum for international economic cooperation.

Harsh Vardhan Shringla, Chief Coordinator, G20 Secretariat in the Ministry of External Affairs, has said "India's presidency of the G20 provides a unique opportunity to place our narrative in the global agenda and to showcase India's development and cultural diversity". He wrote a letter to all the chief secretaries of the states and UTs, calling for their support in hosting G20-related meetings. And how could J&K and Ladakh not be included in this?

Hosting G20-related events in J&K and Ladakh, no doubt, could send out a diplomatic message. It could also help in building the narrative that both UTs are doing well as free places like any other state of the Union. By choosing Jammu & Kashmir as one of the venues for the G20 Summit, India has sent a clear and loud message to Pakistan that its claim on the region has no locus standi and bearing at the international level. A similar message is also being sent out to China, which has been creating trouble in Ladakh. For India, the G20 summit and its related events can be held in any part of the country, so it might as well be Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh. The message going out to Pakistan and groups and nations backing it is loud and clear: the world regards Kashmir as an inseparable part of India.

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CANADA ANNOUNCES ADDITIONAL SANCTIONS TARGETING RUSSIAN DISINFORMATION & PROPAGANDA AGENTS

Honourable Mélanie Joly, Minister of Foreign Affairs, today announced additional sanctions in relation to Russia's illegal and unjustifiable invasion of Ukraine, while attending the G20 Foreign Ministers' Meeting in Bali, Indonesia.

Minister Joly reaffirmed Canada's unwavering commitment to support Ukraine, a friend and ally, as it fights for freedom. Canada will not stand by as President Vladimir Putin wages his illegal and unjust war and seeks to justify it through disinformation, manipulation and propaganda.

To counter the Kremlin's disinformation campaign, Canada is imposing sanctions against 29 state-sponsored disinformation and propaganda agents and 15 entities controlled or owned by the Russian government and involved in disinformation efforts. This includes Sumbatovich Gasparyan, the Head of the International Department at Russia Today (RT) state media holding, with considerable influence in Russia. These sanctions include those announced by Prime Minister Justin Trudeau at the G7 Summit in Elmau, Germany. Also, effective immediately, Canada has banned the import of certain gold imports from Russia.

Canada has also launched a webpage dedicated to countering disinformation with facts. Canada will continue to use this platform to shed light on how the Russian regime is using lies to justify its illegal, unprovoked and unjustifiable invasion of Ukraine.

Quick facts

* Since Russia's illegal occupation and attempted annexation of Crimea in 2014, Canada has imposed sanctions on more than 1,600 individuals and entities. Many of these sanctions have been undertaken in coordination with Canada's allies and partners.

* Since Russia's further invasion of Ukraine on February 24, 2022, Canada has imposed sanctions on more than 1,150 individuals and entities from and in Russia, Ukraine and Belarus.

* In March 2022, Canada referred the situation in Ukraine to the International Criminal Court (ICC), in concert with other ICC member states, in light of the numerous allegations of serious international crimes committed by Russian forces in Ukraine, including war crimes and crimes against humanity.

CANADA'S EMPLOYMENT FELL BY 43,000; UNEMPLOYMENT RATE FALLS TO 4.9% IN JUNE

In the goods-producing sector, employment rose by 33,000 (+0.8%) in June, with gains in construction and manufacturing. Total hours worked increased 1.3% in June.

Average hourly wages rose 5.2% (+\$1.54 to \$31.24) on a year-over-year basis in June, up from 3.9% in May.

Unemployment rate reaches fourth consecutive record low

The unemployment rate reached a new low of 4.9% in June, and the participation rate fell 0.4 percentage points to 64.9%. The adjusted unemployment rate—which includes people who were not in the labour force but wanted to work—decreased 0.2 percentage points to 6.8% in June, the second consecutive record low.

Long-term unemployment stood at 185,000 in June.

Employment declines for the first time since January 2022

Employment fell by 43,000 (-0.2%) in June, offsetting the increase of 40,000 recorded in May. This marks the first employment decline not associated with a tightening of public health restrictions since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic.

SOS FOR INJURED ANIMALS AND WILDLIFE

Like people, animals sometimes need rescuing.

While the best course is usually to leave wildlife undisturbed, there are some situations involving animals where assistance is required.

Animals can get injured through fighting with other animals, an accidental fall or collision, or from a severe weather event.

The City's Animal Services section is a key social service that helps to protect wildlife. Animal Services responds to emergencies 24/7, 365 days a year. Their team of experts is dedicated to rescuing wildlife and pets, and to providing food, shelter, care and basic medical care. This is in addition to protecting the community through the City's Animal Care and Control By-law enforcement, education, as well as investigating standards of animal care.

2022 has been an especially critical year thus far. Rescues are on the rise as residents are increasingly reporting incidents of animal injury or distress.

As of June 15, Animal Services has successfully completed 2,418 animal rescues, with 307 animals being transferred to a licensed wildlife rehabilitation centre.

Typical rescues have included:

- A gosling tangled in fishing wire
- A coyote with a food jar stuck on its head
- A fox suffering from mange
- Baby opossums stranded on a busy street
- A skunk and a raccoon stuck in a car engine

Animals with severe injuries are at a higher risk for chronic pain, starvation and dehydration. They are also more vulnerable to predators. So the first few hours after an animal is rescued is always the most critical. Deprived of water, food and shelter, the animals are often wary and fearful.

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TOO EARLY TO CALL NEW OMICRON BA.2.75 SUB-VARIANT MORE SEVERE: WHO

It is too early to call the latest Omicron sub-variant BA.2.75, first reported from India last month, more severe, according to Soumya Swaminathan, chief scientist at the World Health Organization (WHO). Besides India, BA.2.75 has also been reported from 10 other countries, Swaminathan said in a Twitter post, adding that and "the WHO is tracking it". "There's still limited sequencing available to analyse but this subvariant seems to have a few mutations on the receptor binding domain of the spike protein. That's the key part of the virus that attaches itself to the human receptor. So we have to watch that," she said. "However, it is still too early to know that this sub-variant has properties of immune evasion or being more clinically severe"

She added that the WHO's Technical Advisory Group on SARS-CoV-2 Virus Evolution (TAG-VE) committee is constantly looking at data from around the world.

"We are tracking it any time there's an emergence of a virus that looks very different from a previous one, enough to be called a separate variant of concern, then the committee will do that".

Meanwhile, WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus on Wednesday said that the global health agency is tracking the new sub-variant.

"In countries like India a new sub lineage of BA.2.75 has also been detected, which we're following," he said.

On Sunday, Shay Fleishon, with the Central Virology Laboratory at Sheba Medical Center in Israel, in a series of tweets said that BA.2.75 has been detected from about 10 states in India.

This included 69 from India: Delhi (1), Haryana (6), Himachal Pradesh (3), Jammu (1), Karnataka (10), Madhya Pradesh (5), Maharashtra (27), Telangana (2), Uttar Pradesh (1), and West Bengal (13).

Besides India, the strain has also been reported by seven other



countries: Japan (1), Germany (2), the UK (6), Canada (2), the US (2), Australia (1), and New Zealand (2), according to Nextstrain, an open-source platform of genomic data.

While he said it is "too soon to tell" whether BA.2.75 will be the next dominant variant, the Israeli expert noted that the sub-variant may be "alarming because it may imply a trend to come".

The sub-variant is worth "keeping a close eye" on, Thomas Peacock, a scientist at Imperial College London, said.

The BA.2.75 was also flagged by Bloom Lab at the Fred Hutch research institute in the US.

In a tweet, posted this week, the institute said the sub-variant "is worth tracking, as it has appreciable antigenic change relative to its parent BA.2".



PUNJAB TO PROVIDE 600 UNITS OF FREE POWER TO EVERY HOUSEHOLD PER BILLING CYCLE

In a major relief to households, the Punjab Cabinet led by Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Wednesday gave approval to provide 600 units of free power to every household per billing cycle in the state with effect from July 1.

A spokesman for the Chief Minister's office said all domestic consumers in the state would be eligible to get zero bills if their consumption is up to 600 units in every billing cycle.

This will give a big reprieve to the domestic consumers who have to hitherto shell out huge money every month in the form of power tariff. As per the decision, the Scheduled Castes (SC), none SC BPL and backward class domestic consumers, who are currently eligible for free 400 units (per billing cycle), will also get subsidy of 600 units now.

Likewise, freedom fighters of Punjab and their successors, up to grandchildren, and domestic consumers, who are currently eligible for free 400 units, will also get subsidy of 600 units per billing cycle. In case, the consumption of the SC, non-SC BPL, backward class and freedom fighter categories exceeds units per billing cycle then they will pay only for units consumed in addition to 600 units along with full fixed charges, meter rentals and government levies as applicable. Similarly, the Cabinet also gave green signal for waiving off pending arrears of all domestic consumers as on December 31, 2021, and unpaid up to June 30, 2022. This move will give relief to around 28.10 lakh domestic consumers with a total benefit of Rs 1,298 crore.



India needs clearer personal data protection law to tame Twitter, others

The latest Centre-Twitter legal battle over repeated content blocking orders by the IT Ministry has brought an old debate to the fore -- is the country finally ready to penalise foreign intermediaries and social media platforms for not obeying the law of the land or is there still a long way to go?

Unlike the European Union's General Data Protection Regulation (EU GDPR), and tougher cyber laws in countries like Singapore, South Korea and Australia, the Indian government is using several agencies to tame social media platforms in the absence of a nodal cyber regulator that separately deals with Big Tech.

In India, Twitter is in the eye of storm for not complying often with the new IT (intermediary) Rules, 2021.

The micro-blogging platform even witnessed a police raid on its offices in Delhi and Gurugram related to the alleged Congress toolkit controversy last year.

Twitter was at loggerheads with the Indian government last year over removal of certain posts and being compliant with the intermediary guidelines under the IT Act.

As and when the government sends stern notices to Twitter, Google, YouTube and Meta (formerly Facebook) under the available laws (like Section 69A of the IT Act, 2000) to remove controversial content, the platforms immediately knock at the door of the courts, resulting in zero action.

The tussle between Twitter, WhatsApp/Facebook and the government has reached its nadir, and the fact is that an absence of a stricter personal data protection law is forcing the concerned authorities to take routes like writing heaps of notices that have resulted in zero action to date, while social networking giants continue to take the country for a ride.

According to experts, while the government can initiate action for suspension or blocking of intermediary apps or websites if they fail to comply with its directions over various issues under current laws, a strong data protection law is what can tame the social media platforms, the way the GDPR in the EU has achieved.

In case Twitter fails to comply with the government directions, the latter has the powers to resort to penal consequences.

"In that direction, appropriate FIRs can be registered against intermediaries and service providers and their top management can also be made liable for the said contravention under Section 85 of the IT Act, 2000," Pavan Duggal, one of the country's top cyber law experts, noted. The government can exercise its power under Section 69(A)(1). In case, any service provider or intermediary fails to comply with the provisions of the same, there are penal consequences prescribed under Section 69A(3) too. Non-compliance with directions for blocking is a non-bailable serious offence punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to seven years and shall also be liable to fine.

India has to learn from the EU when it comes to formulating a legal framework to secure data and tackle hateful or abusive online content, the experts said. The EU GDPR has been designed to harmonise data



privacy laws across Europe -- to protect and empower all EU citizens' data privacy and to reshape the way organisations across the region approach data privacy. The Indian government, time and again, has told Internet intermediaries and social media platforms to comply with the law of the land. Minister of State for Electronics and IT Rajeev Chandrasekhar said in a tweet that all foreign intermediaries and platforms have a right to approach the court and judicial review in India.

"But equally, all intermediary/platforms operating here have an unambiguous obligation to comply with our laws and rules," Chandrasekhar posted last week, as Twitter moved the Karnataka High Court against the government's order to take down some content on its platform. IT Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said that "be it any company, in any sector, they should abide by the laws of India". Twitter has clearly said that these blocking orders are being challenged on the basis that "they are procedurally and substantially deficient of the Section 69A requirements".

The micro-blogging platform last year clearly stated that they will listen to the Indian government's content removal demands seriously only when the Personal Data Protection Bill is firmly in place.

The proposed Personal Data Protection Bill also has provisions that impose heavy penalties on companies for non-compliance. It has also proposed to term social media companies as publishers, which will make them liable for the content on their platforms.

The moot question is: Once the global tech giants respond to government notices, the matter ends and according to leading experts, data of crores of Indians are still being misused in the absence of a robust mechanism.

"As of today, India does not have a dedicated law on privacy or on cyber security," Duggal pointed out. "It does not have a legal framework in place for protecting all kinds of data. The Personal Data Protection Bill, 2019 is pending consideration before the Joint Parliamentary Committee. Further, India does not have a dedicated policy on data localisation."

According to legal experts, India must fight social media biggies with a strong data protection law in place.

ED SUMMONS SONIA GANDHI ON JULY 21 IN NATIONAL HERALD MATTER



Congress president Sonia Gandhi has been summoned by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) to join the investigation in connection with the National Herald matter on July 21. Earlier, she couldn't join in the probe as she was not keeping well. Sources in the ED said that she will be asked the same set of questions which were asked to Rahul Gandhi during his five-day questioning.

Her questioning which was scheduled to take place on June 23 was postponed on her request as she was not well.

"We have to ask about her role in the deal between Young India and Associated Journals Ltd (AJL)," the sources said. Earlier Rahul Gandhi had said that the late Motilal Vora was looking after all these affairs. Vora held a 12 percent stake in YI whereas Rahul and Sonia held a 76 percent stake.

As per the ED, the Gandhis are major beneficiaries in the whole deal. Earlier Pawan Bansal and Mallikarjuna Kharge were questioned by the ED. Since Vora has passed away the needle of suspicion pointed towards the Gandhis.

'...CAN'T BE AN IMPRESSION OF POLICE STATE': SC ASKS CENTRE TO BRING SEPARATE LAW ON BAIL



The Supreme Court on Monday said criminal courts are guardian angels of liberty and a conscious failure by them would constitute an affront to liberty, as it asked the Centre to consider introducing a separate law in the nature of a Bail Act to streamline the grant of bails.

It emphasised that in a democracy, there can never be an impression that it is a police state as both are conceptually opposite to each other.

A bench of Justices Sanjay Kishan Kaul and M.M. Sundresh noted that jails in India are flooded with undertrials and statistics indicate that more than 2/3rd of the inmates of the prisons constitute undertrial prisoners. It said the majority of them may not even be required to be arrested, despite registration of a cognizable offense, being charged with offenses punishable for seven years or less.

It added that they are not only poor and illiterate but also would include women, thus, there is a culture of offense being inherited by many of them.

"It certainly exhibits the mindset, a vestige of colonial India, on the part of the investigating agency, notwithstanding the fact arrest is a draconian measure resulting in curtailment of liberty, and thus to be used sparingly. In a democracy, there can never be an impression that it is a police state as both are conceptually opposite to each other," said the bench, in its 85-page judgment.

It said criminal courts in general, and the trial court in particular, are the guardian angels of liberty and liberty has to be preserved, protected, and enforced by the criminal courts. "Any conscious failure by the criminal courts would constitute an affront to liberty. It is the pious duty of the criminal courts to zealously guard and keep a consistent vision in safeguarding the constitutional values and ethos," it noted.

Taking these factors into consideration, the top court said: "The Government of India may consider the introduction of a separate enactment in the nature of a Bail Act so as to streamline the grant of bails."

It added that bail applications ought to be disposed of within a period of two weeks except if the provisions mandated otherwise.

"Applications for anticipatory bail are expected to be disposed of within a period of six weeks with the exception of any intervening application. All state governments, Union Territories and High Courts are directed to file affidavits/status reports within a period of four months," said the top court.

The bench observed that the rate of conviction in criminal cases in India is abysmally low. "It appears to us that this factor weighs on the mind of the court while deciding the bail applications in a negative sense. Courts tend to think that the possibility of a conviction being nearer to rarity, bail applications will have to be decided strictly, contrary to legal principles," it added.

The bench said it cannot mix up consideration of a bail application, which is not punitive in nature, with that of a possible adjudication by way of trial. "On the contrary, an ultimate acquittal with continued custody would be a case of grave injustice," it said.

The bench reiterated that "bail is the rule and jail is an exception" coupled with the principle governing the presumption of innocence. It heard submissions from senior advocate Sidharth Luthra as amicus curiae and Additional Solicitor General S.V. Raju, who represented the Central government and issued a slew of guidelines in its judgement in the case of titled as 'Satender Kumar Antil Vs CBI'.

IGNORED DURING RS POLLS, CONGRESS'S G-23 DISSIDENTS DRIFTING TOWARDS BJP?

Speculation over G-23 leaders meeting BJP leaders has set tongues wagging that many of them are drifting towards the ruling party after being ignored by the Congress during the Rajya Sabha polls.

Some of the dissenters have already crossed over to the BJP including Jitin Prasad who is now a minister in the Uttar Pradesh government. The group is lying low after being completely sidelined in the party except for their presence on a few committees. Their leaders are unhappy after not being given a chance for the Rajya Sabha for which they were hopefuls.

The speculation also gained ground after information spread of Anand Sharma meeting BJP president J.P. Nadda but the senior Congress leader and a G-23 member denied meeting Nadda. The meeting was said to have taken place on Thursday. Sources said that Sharma spoke to Nadda over the phone on a programme related issue where both of them are invitees.

After the news spread, Sharma tried to put all speculation to rest and said as Nadda hails from the same state and university they have social and family ties. He said that the Himachal University alumni had invited both of them to a programme. Both spoke about it. There were only ideological differences but no personal enmity, he added.

He asserted that if he had to meet Nadda he would do so openly. Sharma is a prominent leader of the Congress and an important member of the G-23, which has been pushing for reforms in the party.

Sharma has been maintaining a distance after being ignored for the Rajya Sabha. Most recently the majority of members of the group were absent from the 'Satyagraha' called by the Congress party against the Enforcement Directorate (ED), which has been questioning former party president Rahul Gandhi in the National Herald case.

Meanwhile, Congress leader Tarvinder Singh Marwah joined the BJP on Wednesday. Marwah later appealed to all the G-23 leaders of the Congress to join the BJP.

He was a member of the Delhi Assembly for three terms from 1998-2013 and also served as parliamentary secretary to the chief minister. Marwah said that in the last Delhi Assembly elections, Union Home Minister Amit Shah had asked him to contest on a BJP ticket. "Devoted my whole life and youth to the Congress party. But there is no respect for workers who gave everything to the party. People whom nobody knew are made general secretaries in place of hardworking workers. Rajya Sabha seats were given to the people who lost the elections. People who cannot be appointed as even peons are given key responsibilities," Marwah said.

Pointing towards the G-23, Marwah said they are not going to get anything as the leadership does not see their dedication and sacrifices for the party. "G-23 leaders must join the BJP as they will get the respect they deserve here."

The former Congress MLA claimed that the Congress leadership is completely disconnected from the cadre. "I have been seeking time for one and a half years to meet Rahul Gandhi, but failed to get an appointment. They are not meeting any workers," Marwah added.

Tension has been building up within the Congress since the names of veteran party leaders like Ghulam Nabi Azad, Anand Sharma and Veerappa Moily did not figure in the Rajya Sabha candidates' list. The Congress has tried to accommodate them in various fora like the political affairs group, Task Force 2024 and the committee for the 'Bharat Jodo Yatra'.

JUDGES RULE ON STATE ABORTION RESTRICTIONS, SHAPE ROE IMPACT

A Utah judge on Monday granted a request from Planned Parenthood to delay implementing the state's trigger law banning most abortions, as implications of the US Supreme Court overturning Roe vs. Wade reverberate nationwide. With the decision, abortion remains legal up to 18 weeks in Utah, which is among a group of states where abortion rights have been thrown into limbo amid the legal and political challenges shaping the post-Roe landscape with states now holding the power to restrict abortion. "What I'm really doing is saying we have serious things to talk about," Judge Andrew Stone said after granting an injunction delaying the trigger law. He said the status quo should remain in effect until a challenge from the state's Planned Parenthood affiliate can be heard fully.



UN TO MONITOR UKRAINE WAR FOR VIOLATIONS AGAINST CHILDREN



The United Nations announced Monday it will start monitoring the war in Ukraine and conflicts in Ethiopia, Mozambique and Africa's central Sahel region for violations against children, including killings, injuries, recruitment, rape and other forms of sexual violence. Secretary-General Antonio Guterres said in his annual report to the Security Council on children and armed conflict that those four new conflicts have been added to 21 conflicts that the UN already is monitoring for violations of the rights of children. He said the latter conflicts saw "a high number of grave violations" in 2021. The UN chief said the protection of children was severely affected by escalating conflicts, the multiplication of armed groups, land mines and improvised explosive devices, explosive weapons in populated areas, intensified humanitarian crises, and violations of humanitarian and human rights law.

The second favourite was Penny Mordaunt, minister for international trade, who had in the past been defence secretary, at 3.3/1. The third favourite was the foreign secretary Liz Truss at 4/1. Tom Tugendhat, who has no ministerial experience but is chair of the House of Commons' Foreign Affairs Committee, was quoted at 9/1; while Jeremy Hunt, a former foreign secretary, was being offered at 14/1. Another bookmaker Skybet also had Sunak as favourite at 15/8, Mordaunt as second favourite at 7/2 and Truss as third favourite at 4/1. The vacancy was created when the incumbent Boris Johnson lost the confidence of his party MPs after a series of scandals, and resigned on Thursday. 11 candidate have since thrown their hats into the ring. Among them, Sunak, who chancellor of the exchequer before he resigned last Tuesday, and Suella Fernandes Braverman, who is of Goan descent and is still serving as caretaker attorney general. There are two runners of Pakistani extraction – Sajid Javid, who was health secretary in the Johnson cabinet till he led the spate of resignations on Tuesday, and Rehman Chishti, who was appointed a third tier minister in the Foreign Office after

nearly 60 ministers decided not to remain in office under Johnson. On Monday evening in London, Sir Nicholas Brady, the chairman of the Conservative Parliamentary Party's '1922 Committee', which sets the rules of the race, said nominations will close on Tuesday. A candidate will need the backing of at least 20 MPs out of a total of 358 Conservative MPs to go forward. The first ballot will take place on Wednesday afternoon and the outcome revealed the same evening. Similarly, the second round is provisionally scheduled to take place on Thursday. He expected that a maximum of three rounds of balloting will be needed to whittle down the contestants to two. The full membership of the Conservative party – estimated to be around a quarter of a million – will then choose the winner. The result will be declared on 5 September, when parliament is scheduled to return from its summer recess. The Guardian indicated: "With just two contenders so far having the support of the 20 Tory (Conservative) MPs needed to get them on to the ballot, the remaining nine hopefuls were scrambling to shore up support by Tuesday night before knockout votes begin on Wednesday." Sunak and Mordaunt were said to have the backing of 40 and 24 MPs respectively. Braverman is reported to have 12. A candidate will have to muster at least 30 votes in the first round to enter the second round.

UKRAINE'S ECONOMY TO SHRINK BY AT LEAST 35% IN 2022



Ukraine's GDP will shrink by at least 35 per cent this year due to the conflict with Russia, the Interfax-Ukraine news agency reported, citing Ukrainian Prime Minister Denys Shmyhal. While addressing the Ukraine Recovery Conference in Switzerland, Shmyhal said that the Ukrainian economy has started recovering from the "shock coma" of the first weeks of the conflict. The government carried out a "relatively successful" grain sowing campaign and resumed logistics across the western border, Shmyhal said, noting that the economy still faces many challenges, Xinhua news agency reported.

UKRAINE TO USE EU'S 1-BLN-EURO AID TO ENSURE FINANCIAL STABILITY

The new aid of 1 billion euros that was approved by the European Parliament for Kiev on Thursday will be used to ensure Ukraine's financial stability, the Ukrainian Finance Ministry said. "The European Union (EU) Macro-Financial Assistance will be directed to the financing of priority budgetary needs and, in general, to ensuring financial stability in Ukraine," Xinhua news agency reported quoting the ministry's statement. Earlier in the day, the European Parliament voted to support the European Commission's proposal to provide Ukraine with 1 billion euros in fresh aid to cover the country's urgent budgetary needs. The decision to allocate new aid for Ukraine was announced by the European Commission on July 1. It must also be supported by the Council of the EU to come into force. In April, Ukrainian Prime Minister Denys Shmyhal said that Ukraine needs 5 billion dollars a month to fulfill all social and humanitarian obligations amid the conflict with Russia. Ukraine has received 1.2 billion euros (about 1.22 billion dollars) in two tranches from the EU since March.







Rohit Sharma and Shikhar Dhawan's century stand followed up on Jasprit Bumrah's 6-wicket haul to help India hand England a 10-wicket hiding. Rohit ended the match unbeaten on 76 off 58 balls while Dhawan hit the winning runs to end the match on 31 off 54 balls. Earlier, Bumrah's figures of 6/19 is the best by an Indian bowler against England. Bumrah took four wickets in the first 10 overs as he and Shami took England's top order apart in a devastating opening spell. Jason Roy, Joe Root, Ben Stokes and Liam Livingstone were all out for ducks and Bumrah's figures after his first four overs read 4/9 with two maidens. England captain Jos Buttler and Moeen Ali managed to stem the flow of wickets for a while before the latter fell to Prasidh Krishna. Buttler, who was the only one who looked fairly comfortable, finally fell to Shami for 30 off 32 balls. Bumrah later completed his six wicket haul by taking the last two wickets.

India defeated England by 10 wickets in the first ODI of the three-match series at the Kennington Oval, London on Tuesday. Rohit Sharma hit an unbeaten 76 off 58 balls and Shikhar Dhawan accompanied him with a 31 not out as India chased down 111-run target against England in 18.4 overs without losing any wicket. Earlier, Jasprit Bumrah returned his career-best figures in ODIs with 6 for 19 while Mohammed Shami



took 3 for 31 as India bundled out England for 110 runs. Prasidh Krishna claimed the remaining one wicket. This all happened after Rohit Sharma won the toss and opted to bowl first. It is worth noting that Virat Kohli missed the game due to a groin strain, while Arshdeep Singh also remained on the sidelines due to an abdominal strain. With the win on Tuesday, India lead the three-match ODI series 1-0.

I DO NOT SUPPORT THE STATEMENTS MADE BY KAPIL DEV: VIRAT KOHLI'S CHILDHOOD COACH

Former India captain Virat Kohli has been struggling with the bat lately and has not managed to add a decent number of runs in his account. He has not scored a century in the last three years and is going through a rough phase in his career. In the second T20I against England, he came into playing XI in the place of Deepak Hooda but got dismissed by scoring just one run. After he was rested for the West Indies ODI series that will be led by Shikhar Dhawan, speculations on whether he has been dropped from the team have also risen. Recently, former India captain Kapil Dev gave his take on Kohli's inclusion in playing XI. "Now the situation is such that you might be forced to bench Kohli from T20 playing eleven. If world No. 2 bowler Ashwin can be dropped from the Test side then (once upon a time) world No. 1 batter can also be dropped," said the legendary cricketer. "Play in-form players when you have loads of options," said Kapil. "You can't just go by reputation but you have to look for the current form. You can be an established player but that doesn't mean that you will be given chances even if you fail five games in a row," he concluded. However, Kohli's childhood coach Rajkumar Sharma disagreed with Kapil Dev. "I do not support the statements made by Kapil Dev on Virat Kohli. Nothing big happened with Virat that such kind of statement has been issued. Why is there so much hurry with Virat, he has done so well for the country. Making 70 international centuries is not a small thing.

Women's Hockey World Cup 2022: India fail to enter quarterfinals, lose 0-1 against Spain

The Indian women's hockey team crashed out of the FIH World Cup after losing 0-1 to co-hosts Spain in a hard-fought crossover match on Monday. After a fiercely-contested three quarters, the Indian defence let in a goal just three minutes from the final hooter when Marta Segu scored from a rebound to exit from the knock-out rounds. As has been the case so far in the tournament, India fared poorly once again in converting penalty corners. They earned four in the game against Spain's three but all the chances went in vain. India's first penalty corner came in the eighth minute but the Spanish defence was up to the task to deny any inroads. In the first quarter both the teams were a little hesitant in their play, committing some unforced errors which resulted in very few scoring chances. After that it was all about Spain as they explored ways to get past the India back line. India captain Savita, in front of the goal, showed why she has such high reputation as she pulled off saves time and again to keep the deadlock intact.

Spain continued the attack in the second quarter and in a moment of goalkeeping brilliance, Savita made three consecutive saves, first from a Xantal Gine's penalty corner strike, then a rebound from the same player and finally a rebound from Begona Garcia to keep her side afloat. Seconds later, India secured their second PC but first Spain goalie Melanie Garcia saved Monika's shot and then Lucia Jimenez showed immense composure to keep out the rebound.

India soon created a great opportunity to take the lead when Salima Tete set it up for Vandana Kataraiya with a brilliant run along the baseline but the latter dinked over the cross bar while trying to chip it over Garcia's reach as both the teams failed to break the stalemate at half time. After the change of ends, India started on the front foot and Spain had to stay focused to keep their opponent's attacks at bay.

Jonny Bairstow felicitated by ICC for his career and game-altering month of heroics



The chief architect of "Bazball" and currently one of England's most bankable batsman, Jonny Bairstow is having the run of his life. With five Test centuries to his name in 2022 so far, Bairstow has been batting on a different level altogether and does not look in any kind of discomfort against any bowler. Over the past few weeks, Bairstow has faced bowlers like Tim Southee, Trent Boult, Mohammad Shami, and Jasprit Bumrah, but he has made the craft of batting look extremely easy against these top-class international players. Riding high on Jonny's form, the new English outfit has won four consecutive test matches and has made their approach towards the longest format of the game very clear. When asked about his dramatic rise in the red ball game, Bairstow credited his new head coach Brendon McCullum and skipper Ben Stokes for the kind of freedom they have given him to play his game. Taking India by surprise, Jonny played blinders and struck 106 and 114* to register a memorable Test victory by England. India was leading the series 2-1 and England had to make sure that they played their best and prevent India from clinching the series. Jonny continued from where he had left in the New Zealand series and as of now it certainly looks like, he is all set to go past Joe Root's record of scoring the most number of centuries in a single year. Taking New Zealand by surprise, Jonny Bairstow struck 136, 162 which ensured that England comfortably win the series against New Zealand by 3-0. The wicketkeeper-batsman had missed the initial phase of the county championship as he was busy playing IPL cricket but had security from Brendon McCullum that his place in the Test squad was secure.

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SHIKHAR DHAWAN TO LEAD INDIA IN ODIS AGAINST WEST INDIES



Opener Shikhar Dhawan will lead India against West Indies in the upcoming three-match ODI series to be played in Trinidad, starting on July 22, the BCCI announced on Wednesday. All-rounder Ravindra Jadeja has been named as Dhawan's deputy in a 16-member squad that has notable absentees. India have decided to rest several key members of the squad for the ODI series, including regular captain Rohit Sharma, Virat Kohli, Jasprit Bumrah, Rishabh Pant, Hardik Pandya, and Mohammed Shami as well as the injured K.L. Rahul. The 36-year-old Dhawan previously led India in three ODIs last year on the tour of Sri Lanka when other senior players were involved with the Test side in England. As in that series, he'll have Ruturaj Gaikwad as a possible opening partner with India also including Shubman Gill into the ODI side for the first time since the tour of Australia in December 2020. Meanwhile, Sanju Samson is also back after a year, having played his lone ODI so far in Sri Lanka last July. Samson and Ishan Kishan are the two wicketkeepers in the squad. Arshdeep Singh, the left-arm pacer who has been included in a full-strength squad for the England ODIs later this month, has been retained alongside Prasidh Krishna, Mohammed Siraj and Shardul Thakur. Jadeja, Yuzvendra Chahal, Axar Patel along with spin-bowling all-rounder Deepak Hooda, are the spinners in the squad. India's tour of the West Indies begins with the ODI leg in Trinidad starting July 22. They will subsequently play five T20s against the two-time world champions, in Trinidad, St Kitts and Lauderhill (Florida) with the tour finishing with the two T20s in the USA on August 6 and 7.

IND VS ENG, 3RD T20I: ENGLAND BEAT INDIA BY 17 RUNS DESPITE SURYAKUMAR'S HEROICS



Despite India losing to England by 17 runs, Nottingham witnessed a Suryakumar Yadav special, who gave a 360-degree masterclass on his way to his maiden hundred at the third T20I on Sunday. Dawid Malan made a sublime 77 off 39 balls as England put India's second-string attack to the sword to finish with a mammoth 215 for seven. Suryakumar (117 off 55 balls) kept India in the hunt with his classy effort but lacked support from other batters while chasing the huge target. India's innings ended at 198 for nine in 20 overs. India sealed the three-match series 2-1, having won in Southampton and Birmingham. India were on the backfoot at the start of the run chase, struggling to 31 for three in five overs. Openers Rohit Sharma (11) and Rishabh Pant (1) perished cheaply and it was another failure for Virat Kohli (11), who was caught at covers while trying to manufacture a third consecutive hit after collecting a four and a straight six off David Willey. Suryakumar brought India back into the game with a 119-run stand with Shreyas Iyer (28 off 23) who was a spectator to his partner's brilliance for the major part of the partnership. As he often does, Suryakumar toyed with the opposition bowlers and picked his shots all around the ground. The highlights of his glorious innings were the two lofted square drives off pacers Richard Gleeson and Chris Jordan that went all the way for six. He became the fifth Indian to score a hundred in T20 Internationals by opening the face of the bat and guiding a low full toss off Willey between backward point and short third man. His innings comprised 14 fours and half a dozen sixes.

And his failure to score big in the recently concluded Edgbaston Test against England has once again brought the scars.

Before playing the Edgbaston Test, India played a warm-up match against Leicestershire County Cricket Club during which, Virat looked in encouraging form. He looked in decent nick, stroked a fine fifty and was the pick of the Indian batters against the Leicestershire XI.

However, he failed to replicate that against England and had scores of 11 and 20. Interestingly, he was again looking good but couldn't continue that batting longer, which raises the question whether Kohli is short on confidence or lack of concentration is hurting him? More importantly, is there any technical flaw in his game?

During a discussion on Sony Sports, Sanjay Manjrekar talked about Kohli's poor form and said that the modern-day great is low on confidence and there are some technical issues in his batting along with slight bad luck.

"What do I say, as an expert when I see I have some opinion that the confidence has gone down a little, he is enduring slight bad luck also, there are technical issues, I feel he is playing a lot on the front foot but it is not because of this he is not scoring runs, runs are scored despite all this. Everyone does not have technical perfection but they score runs," said Manjrekar. "Virat Kohli's form is surprising me because it came suddenly. When great batters go out of form, they come back in form quickly. You will have to say that we don't know how the out-of-form phase has gone on for so long," he added.

Why is Virat's poor form a cause of concern for India?
After managing scores of 11 and 20 against England, Kohli dropped three places to 13th in the latest batting rankings in Tests on Wednesday, which very much shows the effect of his continuous bad form especially in the longest format of the cricket.

The Delhi-born cricketer bats at No 4, which is considered as a crucial position in Test cricket and lack of consistency from him in the middle order is affecting India badly, especially when other middle batters haven't also been that impressive. His competitor Joe Root has performed exceedingly well at the same spot and is having amazing consistency for England.

In T20 cricket, the former India skipper is often criticised for his slow strike rate at the top-order considering the shortest format of the game is witnessing a massive change in terms of attacking mindset. Playing for RCB in the IPL 2022, Virat opened the innings and his strike rate continuously dipped after the powerplay overs, which used to put pressure on other batters. Irrespective of the format, Kohli's inconsistency of runs is the biggest issue. When the star batter was at the peak of his career, he had a mind-blowing consistency, which is not the case now and it's getting longer with each passing game.

Time to drop Kohli?
Despite having the lean patch for two and half-years now, Virat still has one of the best career records in world cricket. But cricket is not played on past glories and the current form plays an integral part in any sports person's career as Kohli's current performance is not justifying the standard, which he has set for him. Keeping in mind the inconsistency and poor form, there have been murmurs on social media about Kohli's exclusion from the team. Understandably, there are no loud and clear voices, who are calling to drop the star cricketer, given his stature in Indian cricket.

In the past, various legendary cricketers like Saurav Ganguly, Virendra Sehwaag, Gautam Gambhir, Yuvraj Singh and others have been dropped based on their poor form. And just a few months back, Cheteshwar Pujara and Ajinkya Rahane were excluded from the Test squad. Though Pujara made his comeback after scoring runs in County cricket, Rahane is still out.

Novak Djokovic scripts history; wins 7th Wimbledon title after beating Nick Kyrgios

Novak Djokovic, like he has many times in the past, scripted history by winning his seventh Wimbledon title and 21st Grand Slam championship as the Serbian defeated Nick Kyrgios 4-6 6-3 6-4 7-6.

There were two key moments on Sunday that went Djokovic's way. Firstly Kyrgios began engaging in running monologues, shouting at himself or his entourage (which does not include a full-time coach), finding a reason to disagree with the chair umpire (and earning a warning for cursing) and chucking a water bottle.

In the second set, with Djokovic serving at 5-3, Kyrgios got to love-40 — a trio of break points. But Kyrgios played a couple of casual returns, and Djokovic eventually held.

And then, in the third set, with Kyrgios serving at 4-all, 40-love, he again let a seemingly sealed game get away, with Djokovic breaking there. The 40th-ranked Kyrgios was trying to become the first unseeded men's champion at Wimbledon since Goran Ivanisevic in 2001. Ivanisevic is now Djokovic's coach and was in the Centre Court guest box for the match.

Kyrgios is a 27-year-old from Australia who never had been past the quarterfinals in 29 previous Grand Slam appearances — and last made it even that far 7 1/2 years ago.
