RISE IN USE OF SOUTH-ASIAN LANGUAGES IN CANADA DUE TO IMMIGRATION

Despite the impact that the COVID-19 pandemic has had on arrivals to the country, immigration has continued to enrich Canada's linguistic diversity. English and French remain by far the most commonly spoken languages in Canada. More than 9 in 10 Canadians speak one of the two official languages at home at least on a regular basis.

The 2021 Census also found that 4.6 million Canadians speak predominantly a language other than English or French at home (in other words, they speak this language most often at home, without speaking other languages equally often; see the box "Languages known and spoken: Understanding the concepts"). These individuals represent 12.7% of the Canadian population, a proportion that has been increasing for 30 years. By comparison, the proportion was 7.7% in 1991, when immigration levels were rising. In addition, one in four Canadians in 2021—or 9 million people—had a mother tongue other than English or French. This is a record high since the 1901 Census, when a question on mother tongue was first added. Canada has a rich linguistic diversity. The languages known and spoken here are closely linked to the identity and culture of Canadians and to their relationship with their community. Languages are an integral part of the everyday lives of Canadians—be it in early childhood, at home, at school or at work—and extend beyond the country's borders into broader cultural and historical contexts. For example, in 2022, the Observatoire démographique et statistique de l'espace francophone (link is in French only) estimated that 321 million people around the world spoke French, with half living in Africa. The vast majority of the Canadian population commonly uses English and French, Canada's official languages, to communicate and access services.



CANADA'S POPULATION MAY DOUBLE TO REACH UP TO 74 MILLION BY 2068: STATSCAN

Canada's population may nearly double to reach up to 74 million in 2068, according to the national statistical agency.

Statistics Canada announced on Monday that the country's population may increase from 38.2 million in 2021 to between 42.9 million and 52.5 million in 2043, and between 44.9 million and 74 million in 2068. reports Xinhua news agency. In one medium-growth scenario, Canada's population would reach 47.8 million in 2043 and 56.5 million in 2068, it added. Immigration is expected to remain the main driver of population growth and the natural growth is to decrease in the coming years, Statistics Canada said. It added that in 2020, the number of children per woman reached a historically low level in the country at 1.4. This natural growth is likely to even become negative in the brief period between 2049 and 2058, according to the projection. Canada's population will continue to age in the coming decades. Thus, in a medium-growth projection scenario, the average age in Canada increases from 41.7 years in 2021 to 44.1 in 2043 and to 45.1 in 2068. The population aged 85 and older may more than triple over the same period, from 871,000 in 2021 to 3.2 million in 2068, Statistics Canada said.



RISE IN USE OF SOUTH-ASIAN LANGUAGES IN CANADA DUE TO IMMIGRATION





Although both are spoken throughout the country, English is a minority language in Quebec, while French is a minority language in the other provinces and territories, as well as in Canada as a whole. Indigenous languages existed long before Canada was formed. As the International Decade of Indigenous Languages kicks off, the preservation, vitality and growth of the more than 70 distinct Indigenous languages spoken in the country remain as relevant and important as ever. Today, Statistics Canada is releasing a fourth set of 2021 Census results, on mother tongue, languages spoken at home and languages known by Canadians. Census data on languages are essential to understanding how Canada's linguistic profile has changed, as well as for developing and improving programs and services for all Canadians. They are also used in the development, application and administration of various federal and provincial laws, such as the federal Official Languages Act and Indigenous Languages Act, New Brunswick's Official Languages Act, Ontario's French Language Services Act and Quebec's Charter of the French Language.



Canada strikes historic partnerships with leading German automakers Volkswagen and Mercedes to help meet growing demand for clean transportation solutions

Canada's automotive future is founded on maximizing the benefits of our natural resources and adding value to global supply chains for electric vehicles and batteries. Today, the Honourable François-Philippe Champagne, Minister of Innovation, Science and Industry, announced historic partnerships with two leading German automakers in the form of memoranda of understanding with Volkswagen AG and Mercedes-Benz AG. These agreements will further collaboration with two innovative global players across a range of sectors, help secure Canada's position as a leading centre of excellence for the manufacturing of electric vehicles and batteries and help ensure that Canada is a destination for investments in this space.

The Volkswagen agreement focuses on deepening cooperation on sustainable battery manufacturing, cathode active material production and critical mineral supply, among others, and on setting up a Canadian office for PowerCo, Volkswagen's newly formed battery company. The Mercedes-Benz agreement focuses on enhancing collaboration with Canadian companies along the electric vehicle and battery supply chains; supporting the development of a sustainable critical mineral supply chain in Canada that is based on environmental, social and governance principles; collaborating in research and development; and identifying potential investments in Canada.

The recent visit by Minister Champagne to Germany in May was the catalyst for these agreements. During his trip, he met with key business and industry leaders to strongly communicate Canada's automotive value proposition and reiterate our credentials as a sustainable and reliable partner.

Since January, Canada has secured historic manufacturing deals for electric vehicles, batteries and hybrids—deals that create and secure thousands of good, middle-class jobs while positioning Canada as a leader in the electric vehicle and battery manufacturing space.

Today's announcement represents another major step forward, as Canada continues the work to grow its clean transportation sector and meet global and North American demand for zero-emission vehicles.

Dr Anthony Fauci leaving US government to pursue 'next chapter' of his career

Dr Anthony Fauci, the US epidemiologist who emerged as the face of reason amidst the tide of bigotry that swept through the world in response to Covid-19, is leaving government service.

Fauci said he will leave by the end of the year to "pursue the next chapter of my career". The 81-year-old Fauci serves as the head of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases and as Chief Adviser to President Joe Biden. He has served seven US presidents – both Republicans and Democrats, starting with Ronald Reagan. including Donald Trump, who publicly squabbled with him and the country's medical community with his skepticism about the epidemic and harebrained cures, from household cleaning agents to antimalarial drug hydroxychloroquine.

Fauci said, adding that he plans to use his learnings from more than keep his own President and his administration on course.

50 years in government service to "advance science and public health and to inspire and mentor the next generation of scientific leaders as they help prepare the world to face future infectious disease threats". Biden said Fauci's commitment to the work is unwavering, and he does it with an unparalleled spirit, energy, and scientific integrity. He recalled that while he was putting together a team to combat the epidemic as President-elect, one of his first calls was to Fauci to request him to continue as his chief medical advisor.

Fauci had been America's top epidemiologist for decades, leading the fight against HIV/AIDS and Ebola, but he came to international fame and renown during the Covid-19 pandemic as the world raced to tackle the worst public health crisis in 100 years. Governments around "While I am moving on from my current positions, I am not retiring," the world sought his guidance, even while he struggled at home to

MAJORITY OF AMERICANS WANT PROBES AGAINST TRUMP TO GO ON, MORE FEEL COUNTRY HEADED IN WRONG DIRECTION

A majority of Americans want probes against former President Donald Trump to continue but an even greater number want to observe a "protest day" for the country being steered in the wrong direction by politicians. Americans are a dissatisfied public, with three quarters saying the county is headed in the wrong direction, while a record 58 per cent say that America's best years are behind it and 61 per cent who say that they're willing to carry a protest sign for a day because they're so upset, an NBC poll conducted recently after the FBI raid at the Mar a Lago residence of Trump reveals. The poll paints a mixed picture of the November 2022 midterm landscape for the house of reps, with President Joe Biden's job rating dipping to low 40s. Republicans narrowly lead on congressional preference, but Democrats nearly tie Republicans on voter enthusiasm with "threats to democracy" overtaking the cost of living as the top issue facing the country for voters. "Politically, for Joe Biden and Democrats, the news is not all bad," said Democratic pollster Jeff Horwitt of Hart Research Associates, who conducted this survey with Republican pollster Bill McInturff of Public Opinion Strategies. "Heading

into Labor Day, the political dynamics could be worse (for Democrats), but they also need to get a lot better and fast," he added. McInturff agrees that the environment has improved for Democrats since earlier this year. But he argues that the main fundamentals - the President's job rating, the nation's direction - are breaking against the party. "America is singing the blues, and that is bad news for the Blue Team in November," he said.

The NBC News poll was conducted August 12-16, during and after a tumultuous period for Trump - when the FBI searched his Florida home, when Trump attorney and ally Rudy Giuliani revealed he is a "target" in the probe of alleged election interference in Georgia, and as a former Trump business executive was pleading guilty for tax fraud in a Manhattan court in New York. According to the survey, 57 per cent of registered voters say that the investigations into alleged wrongdoing by Trump should continue, while 40 per cent say they should stop. By party, 92 per cent of Democratic voters, 61 per cent of independents but just 21 per cent of Republican voters think the investigations into Trump should continue, media reports claim.

NOVAVAX COVID-19 VACCINE ADJUVANTED GETS EXPANDED APPROVAL IN US



Novavax says the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has granted expanded emergency use authorisation for its Covid-19 vaccine Adjuvanted for adolescents aged between 12-17 years. The US company said the vaccine was the first protein-based Covid-19 jab authorised in the US, dpa news agency reported. Doses of the Adjuvanted are available for use in adolescents upon the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) recommendation, the company noted.

In July 2022, the FDA had granted emergency use authorisation for a two-dose primary series in adults aged 18 years and older, followed by a recommendation from the CDC Advisory Committee on Immunisation Practices, and endorsement from the CDC.

CHANDIGARH INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT TO BE NAMED AFTER SHAHEED BHAGAT **SINGH: PUNJAB CM BHAGWANT MANN**



Ahead of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Punjab, his first after the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) came to power in the state, Punjab and its neighbouring Haryana on Saturday agreed to name the Chandigarh International Airport after Shaheed-e-Azam Bhagat Singh.

An announcement in this regard was made after a joint meeting between Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann and Haryana Deputy Chief Minister Dushyant Chautala. Mann later announced the news in a tweet.

For almost a decade, Punjab wanted to name the airport as Shaheed-e-Azam Sardar Bhagat Singh International Airport, Mohali, but Haryana had objected to the word Mohali.

Also, the Punjab Vidhan Sabha had also passed a resolution to name the airport as Shaheed-E-Azam Sardar Bhagat Singh International Airport, Mohali.

The Haryana Vidhan Sabha had passed a resolution to rename the airport, but with the use of the word Chandigarh.

INDIA WARNS UN MAY FACE OBLIVION WITHOUT REFORMS TO MAKE IT RELEVANT

India has warned that the world body UN could slip into oblivion and be overtaken by more democratic organisations if the UN Security Council is not reformed to make it more relevant to today's geopolitical realities. India's Permanent Representative to the UN, Ruchira Kamboj said on Monday, "A truly representative Security Council is the



most pressing need of the hour. " "Else, there is a real danger of the United Nations being superseded by other plurilateral and multilateral groupings which are more representative, more transparent and more democratic and, therefore, more effective," she added.

"The most urgent thing, therefore, for us to do is to make the Security Council more representative of developing countries, so as to reflect current geopolitical realities," Kamboj said at the Council meeting on "Maintenance of International Peace and Security: Promoting Common Security Through Dialogue and Cooperation".

In a world very different from the world of 1945 when the UN was founded, she asked, "Is the UN, particularly the Security Council which is the foremost organ tasked with the responsibility of maintaining international peace and security, able to remain relevant?"

More than two decades of efforts to reform the Security Council which is stuck in the post-World War II structure have failed because of obstruction from a small number of countries led by Italy and includes Pakistan. As it has in previous years, the negotiations for Council reforms were pushed last month to the next session of the General Assembly after failing to even adopt a negotiating text on which the discussions can be based. India has been pushing for reforming the Council and staked a claim to a permanent seat in the restructured body. "In my country, which now represents more than one-sixth of humanity, we believe that until we 'reform, perform and transform' multilateral governance structures, we would be continuing to found wanting," Kamboj added. The call for reforms takes on a sense of urgency as the Council mired by system of vetoes of the permanent members has been unable to act on Russia's invasion of Ukraine. UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres drew attention to the hobbling of the Council. While "today's collective security system is being tested like never before," he said. "Lingering differences between the world's great powers — including at this Council — continue to limit our ability

to collectively respond." "Many of the systems established decades ago are now facing challenges that were unimaginable to our predecessors — cyberwarfare, terrorism and lethal autonomous weapons," Guterres added. Kamboj said, "A body that was founded in the aftermath of the second world war, which continues to reflect in its decision-making, 77 years later, the fundamentally flawed premise of 'to the victors belong the spoils, will continue to be confronted with a crisis of confidence and credibility."



Another US delegation lands in Taiwan amid China tensions

Taiwan's President Tsai Ing-wen on Monday received another delegation from the US amid rising tensions with China.

Indiana Governor Eric Holcomb arrived in Taipei on Sunday night for a four-day trip, reports dpa news agency.

Upon his arrival, he said in a tweet: "I landed in Taipei to kick off an economic development trip in Taiwan and South Korea. Indiana's home to 10 Taiwanese & 12 South Korean businesses. This week marks my 2nd trip to South Korea as Governor and I'm proud to be the first governor to visit Taiwan since before the pandemic."

His visit comes after recent trips by House Speaker Nancy Pelosi and top Democrat Ed Markey drew ire from Beijing, which rejects official contacts between Taipei and other countries.

Beijing started large-scale military manoeuvres around Taiwan in response to Pelosi's August 2 visit.

Tsai stressed in a presidential office meeting with Holcomb that the US and Taiwan are key security and economic allies in the Indo-Pacific region. "Taiwan has been confronted by military threats from China, in and around the Taiwan Strait. At this moment, democratic allies must stand together and boost cooperation across all areas," Tsai told the Indiana Governor.

She also said Taiwan was eager to strengthen cooperation to build sustainable supply chains.

Holcomb signed a memorandum of understanding with Taiwan's Ministry of Economic Affairs to facilitate bilateral business, trade and scientific cooperation.



He told Tsai that Indiana will continue to seek strategic partnerships with Taiwan and said he was excited about the prospect of future collaborations with Taiwan.

Holcomb plans to meet with other senior government officials and representatives from the semiconductor sector, according to Taiwan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Taiwan has had an independent government since 1949, but China considers the island part of its territory.

ONTARIO REVEALS PLAN MEANT TO STABILIZE ONTARIO'S HEALTH-CARE **SYSTEM; TO FUND MORE PRIVATE CLINIC SURGERIES**

The Ontario government introduced its Plan to Stay Open: Health System Stability and Recovery, a five-point plan to provide the best care possible to patients and residents while ensuring the resources and supports are in place to keep the province and economy open. The plan further bolsters Ontario's health care workforce, expands innovative models of care and ensures hospital beds are there for patients when they need them.

"When we released our first Plan to Stay Open in March 2022, we made a promise to build an Ontario that is ready for the challenges of tomorrow because we can no longer accept the status quo," said Sylvia Jones, Deputy Premier and Minister of Health. "The second phase of our plan will provide the support our health system needs to address the urgent pressures of today while preparing for a potential winter surge so our province and economy can stay open."

When fully implemented, this next phase of the Plan to Stay Open will add up to 6,000 more health care workers. Combined with the initiatives included in the first phase of the plan that are adding 13,000 more staff, the two plans together are adding 19,000 more health care workers, including nurses and personal support workers, to Ontario's health workforce. It will also free up over 2,500 hospital beds so that care is there for those who need it, and expand models of care that provide better, more appropriate care to avoid unnecessary visits to emergency departments.

The next phase of Ontario's Plan to Stay Open also temporarily covers the costs of examination, application and registration fees for internationally trained and retired nurses, so they can resume or begin caring for patients sooner.

Some key highlights of the plan include:

Preserving our Hospital Capacity

To further bolster the fight against COVID-19 and help stop its spread, the government is continuing to provide access to testing for COVID-19, Paxlovid and Evusheld therapies for treatment for those who are eligible, with plans on expanding eligibility for Evusheld for high-risk populations in the coming weeks.

COVID-19 and flu shots will also continue to be provided to Ontarians so they can stay up to date with their vaccinations to protect themselves and reduce the number of hospitalizations due to respiratory illnesses.

Free rapid antigen tests will continue to be available to the general public at participating grocery and pharmacy retailers throughout the province as well as for workplaces, schools, and congregate settings.

Providing the Right Care in the Right Place

Ontario is expanding the hugely successful 9-1-1 models of care to include additional ailments and is now giving paramedics the flexibility to provide better, more appropriate care. Patients diverted from emergency departments through these models received the care they needed up to 17 times faster with 94 per cent of patients avoiding the emergency department in the days following treatment.

Ontario is implementing several initiatives to help avoid unnecessary hospitalizations, improve the process for ambulance offloading, and reintroduce respite services in long-term care.

Ontario is introducing legislation that, if passed, will support patients whose doctors have said they no longer need hospital treatment and should instead be placed in a long-term care home, while they wait for their preferred home. Ontario continues to fund community paramedicine to provide additional care for seniors in the comfort of their own homes before their admission to a long-term care home. These initiatives will free up to 400 hospital beds.

Further Reducing Surgical Waitlists

Timely access to surgery is important for keeping patients healthy and reducing pressure on the health care system in the long-term. That is why the government is investing over \$300 million in 2022-23 as part of the province's surgical recovery strategy, bringing the total investment to \$880 million over the last three fiscal years.

Ontario is working with hospital partners to identify innovative solutions to reduce wait times for surgeries and procedures, including considering options for further increasing surgical capacity by increasing the number of OHIP-covered surgical procedures performed at independent health



facilities. Ontario is investing more to increase surgeries in paediatric hospitals and existing private clinics covered by OHIP, as well as to fund more than 150,000 additional operating hours for hospital-based MRI and CT machines.

Easing Pressure on our Emergency Departments

Ontario is also launching a new provincial emergency department peerto-peer program to provide additional on-demand, real-time support and coaching from experienced emergency physicians to aid in the management of patients presenting to rural emergency departments. Ontario is adding 400 physician residents to support the workforce in northern and rural Ontario.

Ontario is working with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario to expedite the registration of doctors, including those from out-of-province and who may want to work in rural and northern emergency departments, so they can start working and caring for patients sooner.

Further Expanding Ontario's Health Workforce

Ontario is working with the College of Nurses of Ontario and Ontario Health to expand funding for the supervised practice experience partnership program which has already supported over 600 international nurses in getting licensed since January. The province anticipates that by the end of the fiscal year another 400 international nurses will gain the practice and language requirements necessary to work in Ontario.

The Ontario government is also working with the College of Nurses of Ontario to reduce the financial barriers that may be stopping some retired or internationally trained nurses from receiving accreditation to resume or begin practicing by temporarily covering the cost of examination, application, and registration fees, saving them up to \$1,500.

The province is aware that agency rates have increased significantly, creating instability for hospitals, long-term care homes and emergency departments. In response, Ontario will engage with our frontline partners to better understand how we can bring stability to hospitals and emergency departments, while protecting quality of care. As actions in this plan are implemented in the coming weeks and months, Ontarians can expect to see faster access to health care, including lower wait times in emergency departments, lower wait times for surgical procedures and more care options right in their communities. Ontario will also significantly reduce the risk of a hospital bed shortage during a possible winter surge so that the province and economy can stay open. "Expanding specialized supports for people with complex needs and supporting the transition from hospitals into long-term care, when appropriate, are key pieces of our government's Plan to Stay Open: Health System Stability and Recovery," said Paul Calandra, Minister of Long-Term Care. "We are taking action to get Ontarians the right care in the right setting, where they can have the best possible quality of life, while freeing up much-needed hospital beds." "We are committed to working with our system partners to deliver on this plan and support front line health care workers," said Matthew Anderson, President & CEO of Ontario Health. "This plan provides both immediate and long-term strategies that will allow us to respond to current challenges and better integrate the system for the future." Since the start of the pandemic Ontario has taken immediate action to ensure we can continue to manage COVID-19 and prepare for the long term.

CHINA TO RESUME STUDENT **VISAS FOR INDIANS**



China on Monday announced that it will resume issuing visas to students, especially Indians, intending to pursue education in the country. "Warmest congrats to #Indian #students! Your patience proves worthwhile. I can really share your excitement & happiness. Welcome back to #China!", Ji Rong, who is Counsellor, Department of Asian Affairs at China's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, said in a tweet.

The Chinese embassy in India, on its website, said that it has updated the "Application Procedures and Material Requirements of China Visa", which will be implemented from August 24, and shared steps of the new process. China will issue X1 visas to students who intend to pursue higher academic education in the country. These include new and old students as well and China wants them to return at earliest. Around 23,000 Indian students, a majority of which were undergoing medical education were stuck back home due to Covid visa restrictions. India had submitted a list of the students after China sought the names of those wanting to return and resume their studies.

IT WILL BE BJP VS AAP IN 2024 GENERAL **ELECTIONS, CLAIMS MANISH SISODIA**



Delhi Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia on Saturday claimed that the 2024 general elections will see a direct contest between the BJP and AAP. The election will be held between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Delhi Chief Minister and AAP chief Arvind Kejriwal, Sisodia claimed addressing mediapersons.

After the Punjab assembly election, Kejriwal has emerged as an alternative at national level and that is their (BJP's) main concern, Sisodia said. He said irregularities in the Excise policy or any scam in not an issue for them, but their main concern is the rising stature of Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal. Sisodia's remark came a day after the CBI raided his residence and other locations in connection with irregularities in connection with New Excise Policy.

A conspiracy is being hatched through this raid by the probe agency to stop Arvind Kejriwal, he alleged.

"I am not involved in any corruption. My only mistake is that I am the education minister of the Arvind Kejriwal government", said Sisodia. "It may be that the CBI can arrest me in the next 3-4 days. But we won't be scared. They cannot stop us. The elections of 2024 will be AAP vs BJP," Sisodia said. He has proved the mettle as a leader who works for the public by improving Delhi's education and health systems.

He said that the Excise policy due to which whole controversy is created is the country's best policy.

"We were applying it with transparency & sincerity. Had Delhi LG not changed his decision conspiring to fail the policy, Delhi government would've been getting at least Rs 10,000 crore every year," claimed Deputy CM Sisodia. "Around Rs 10 thousand crore were misappropriated through excise policy in Gujarat. If they have any concern about the excise irregularities or any loopholes, the whole CBI and ED office should have shifted to Gujarat."

IAF SACKS THREE OFFICERS FOR MISFIRING OF BRAHMOS MISSILE INTO PAKISTAN



The Indian Air Force on Tuesday sacked three personnel for the firing of a BrahMos missile into Pakistani territory.

The IAF in a statement said, "BrahMos missile was accidentally fired on 09 March 2022. A Court of Inquiry (Col), set up to establish the facts of the case, including fixing responsibility for the incident, found that deviation from the Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) by three officers led to the accidental firing of the missile."

"These three officers have primarily been held responsible for the incident. Their services have been terminated by the Central Govt with immediate effect. Termination orders have been served upon the officers on 23 Aug 22," the statement added. The incident was reported on March 9 this year. It was said that during "routine maintenance and inspection," a BrahMos missile was accidentally launched into the territory of Pakistan in the vicinity of Mian Channu town, travelling more than 120 kms west of the India-Pakistan border.

According to Pakistani military officials on March 10, the missile flew for 3 minutes and 46 seconds within Pakistani airspace.

Welfare state vs. poll promises: A complex question confronts the apex court

The democratic set-up we have in our country involves political parties/leaders to express and share their agendas to get elected to power, through their manifestos, social media handles, advertisements and public speeches.

The request to vote for such political parties/leaders involves giving a ray of hope to the voters and an array of reasons justifying their candidature and election. This is primarily done in view of our country being, constitutionally, a welfare state, where the ruling establishment is duty-bound to provide multiple facilities to the countrymates.

In the light of these electoral promises, the political leadership tends to guarantee certain things free of cost or as now popularly known as freebies. Few of these freebies can be rational. Many may not. What may constitute rational freebies is primarily essential services including education, health facilities, etc. These are permissible and rather essential.

Some may even say these cannot be termed as freebies at all. On the other hand, what may include irrational freebies is television sets, mixer-grinders, other electronic gadgets such as mobile phones and laptops, bicycles, etc. The list can never be exhaustive for obvious reasons.

It is these irrational freebies which are a cause of great concern and the doors of the top court have been approached to decide

In my view, irrational freebies must be deprecated in the strongest possible manner and strictly disallowed.

We have lately seen a trend by certain political parties and leaders where a number of irrational freebies are promised in order to attract attention and gain votes. Worse problem is where few of these irrational freebies are actually given to the public at large.

These irrational freebies derive existence from taxpayers' money as the government primarily generates revenue through multiple direct and indirect taxation. No political party generates money to produce these free gifts but derives money to give these freebies from hard earned money of the public exchequer only.

Certain services such as health, education, water, sewage, electricity and transport that people cannot organise for themselves, being a welfare state, the ruling establishment should provide. If not for free, then at least at some subsidy as these are all welfare measures. That is why we elect governments.

How much of these services should be free depends on the government's fiscal space and economic health. If the government's (state or centre) expenditure-revenue situation is robust, then free services are most welcome. But the reality is, almost all the states

FURTHER THERE IS NO ACCOUNTABILITY FOR GIVING OUT SUCH FREEBIES AT ALL.

are often short of cash. Even the central government has to work extremely hard to maintain the financial position.

Irrational freebies are an elitist construct that allows those in power exploit those who are not in power by promising to give them and themselves certain things (not essential services) for free by increasing the prices of other services for them.

The difference between an irrational freebie and an essential service is an evolving concept. It depends on the prevailing situation if giving away a particular service/item is an essential service at a particular point of time or is an irrational freebie at another time or location.

Similarly, both "irrational" and "freebies" are terms open to subjective interpretation and can have no precise legal definitions as they are not static either. During a natural disaster or a pandemic, providing life-saving medicines, food or funds may save lives but in regular times, they can be termed freebies.

The Directives Principles of State Policy in Part IV of the Constitution says the state government should promote the welfare of people who are Below the Poverty Line (BPL) or cannot progress without support. But we have seen election manifestos often do not honour such distinctions.

Irrational freebies also interfere with free and fair elections as they influence the people's mind although it is not a corrupt practice. Further there is no accountability for giving out such freebies at all.

There is a complete lacuna in the law on this subject. Recently, even the Prime Minister has pointed out that this erevadi culture' must be checked as it carries far-reaching economic consequences.

If we look closely at the voter behaviour in response to such irrational freebies, we find that the Aam Aadmi Party has managed to emerge as the sole regional party to have elected governments in two states -- Delhi and Punjab.

The manifestoes and public speeches of this political party are full of giving away freebies which weakens the fiscal health of the state. For

anything which goes haywire, the political party tends to cry out to the centre and tries level best to push the onus on the ruling establishment at the centre.

We have seen multiple such examples including Tamil Nadu, where the eAmma' brand under J.Jayalalitha literally gave out all household items (free sarees, pressure cookers, television sets and washing machines) as freebies while she herself was convicted for disproportionate assets under the anti-corruption law.

Political parties in power tend to give incentives to the public in the

form of irrational freebies just before elections to woo voters. For example, the Aam Aadmi Party issued a series of freebies just before the 2020 Delhi elections including free rides for women in metro trains and buses, free electricity for people who use up to 200 units, waiver of arrears in water bills, and extension of free entrance coaching to all students whose annual family income is less than Rs8 lakh. The matter of "irrational freebies" has reached the Supreme Court, where the BJP-led central government wants freebies stopped, while

quicker solution. Although the Supreme Court has hinted towards forming an expert committee rather than asking parliament to do it as political leadership may not want to lose on irrational freebies, yet, it will be much better if the top court decides the matter on the judicial side rather than

delegating it. Let's hope for the best. Fingers crossed!

CANADA, GERMANY SIGN DEAL TO START HYDROGEN SHIPMENTS BY 2025

Germany and Canada have signed a cooperation agreement for the water has to be split into hydrogen and oxygen by electrolysis, which is production and transport of hydrogen on the second day of German Chancellor Olaf Scholz's inaugural trip to Canada.

German Economics Minister Robert Habeck and Canadian Energy Minister Jonathan Wilkinson signed the agreement at a ceremony on Tuesday in the remote town of Stephenville, in Newfoundland and Labrador, attended by Scholz and Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau, dpa news agency reported.

Trudeau spoke of a "historic step forward for our shared future".

"Our target is clear: Working towards initial exports of Canadian hydrogen to Germany by 2025," Trudeau said. "Our outcomes are clear as well: Creating middle class jobs and local growth while delivering clear energy that will help fight climate change."

Scholz said that the deal will take the partnership between the two countries to a more strategic level.

The German chancellor, who was accompanied on his trip by his deputy Habeck and a large delegation of business and industry leaders, called the agreement "an important step not only for strengthening our bilateral economic relations, but also for a sustainable energy supply for the future." Newfoundland is considered a favourable location for the production of renewable hydrogen. The region is very windy and sparsely populated. The use of hydrogen does not produce greenhouse gases. To produce it, only climate-friendly if sustainable energy is used.

Currently the cost of producing low-carbon hydrogen is more expensive than buying natural gas, but experts believe that hydrogen has the ability to reduce energy bills in the medium term.

Industrial hydrogen production hubs have yet to be completed, however. German energy companies Eon and Uniper said on Tuesday that they had signed a memorandum of understanding with Canada's Everwind on the sidelines of the German-Canadian talks with the aim of importing climate-neutral hydrogen from Canada on a large scale from 2025.

Accordingly, the companies are each seeking a purchase agreement for up to 500,000 tonnes of ammonia - the chemical used to transport hydrogen - per year.

A green hydrogen and ammonia production plant is to be built in the village of Point Tupper in the Canadian province of Nova Scotia. "It is in an advanced stage of development and is expected to start commercial operation in early 2025," Eon said.

Also on Tuesday, German carmaker Mercedes-Benz and the Canadian government signed a memorandum of understanding to promote cooperation and economic opportunities within the Canadian supply chain for electric vehicles.

CANADA SUPPORTS BIG BROTHERS BIG SISTERS PEEL YORK AND BLACK YOUTH SUCCESS IN ONTARIO

This ensures that Black youth are mentored by people who understand their lived experiences, trauma, and struggles with cultural identity and systemic discrimination.

Young people are the leaders of today and tomorrow, and it is organizations like BBBSPY and BYS that ensure their success. wellbeing, and happiness. TEMPORARY BAN ON IMPORTATION OF HANDGUNS INTO CANADA NOW IN EFFECT



Today, the Honourable Mélanie Joly, Minister of Foreign Affairs, and the Honourable Marco Mendicino, Minister of Public Safety, announced that the temporary ban on the importation of restricted handguns is now in effect. This temporary ban means that permits for import-restricted handguns into Canada will no longer be issued to individuals or businesses, subject to narrow exceptions that mirror those in Bill C-21. With stores unable to restock their shelves, these measures will slow the run on handguns until the national handgun freeze proposed in Bill C-21 comes into force. No single program or initiative can tackle the challenge of gun violence on its own. That is why the Government of Canada is using all the tools at its disposal to fight gun crime and keep Canadians safe. Minister Joly said, "All Canadians deserve to feel safe in their communities. As a government, it is our collective responsibility to explore every avenue to make that so. The temporary ban on the importation of handguns is an important measure in our comprehensive plan to build a safer Canada for everyone." "My top priority as minister of public safety is keeping Canadians safe. This temporary ban is further proof that we are using all the tools at our disposal to fight gun crime. It is a key pillar of our plan to address it, along with investments in prevention, action at our borders, a ban on assaultstyle weapons and Bill C-21: Canada's most significant action on gun violence in a generation," Minister Marco said.

PM TRUDEAU ANNOUNCES ADDITIONAL SUPPORT FOR UKRAINE; IMPOSES NEW SANCTIONS AGAINST RUSSIA

The Prime Minister, Justin Trudeau, participated in the virtual Summit for Heads of State and Government of the International Crimea Platform, where he announced new sanctions against supporters of the Russian regime, as well as additional assistance for Ukraine. Chancellor of Germany Olaf Scholz, currently visiting Canada, also participated in this Ukraine-led initiative. The two leaders highlighted their solidarity and unwavering support for Ukraine and the Ukrainian people bravely defending their sovereignty, territorial integrity, and independence against Russia's illegal and unjustifiable invasion. To increase pressure on Putin's regime, the Prime Minister announced that Canada is imposing new measures on 62 close associates of the Russian regime and a defence sector entity that is complicit in Russia's invasion of Ukraine. Among the individuals sanctioned are high-ranking Russian government officials, including Russian federal governors and regional heads, their family members, and senior officials of currently sanctioned defence sector entities.

CITY OF GUELPH TAKING A PHASED APPROACH TO IMPROVEMENTS ALONG SPEEDVALE CORRIDOR

The City has started making improvements along the Speedvale Avenue corridor between Elmira Road North and Stevenson Street. Speedvale is an essential corridor in Guelph for local residential and commercial traffic, movement of goods and services for local businesses, and railway access. The City is taking a strategic phased approach to this work.

A future-focused plan

Water and sewer pipes running under Speedvale Avenue must be replaced as they approach the end of their lifecycle and upgraded to support Guelph's growing population.

"Water and sewer pipes are expected to last about 80 to 100 years; the pipes under Speedvale Avenue now are 70 to 90 years old," explains Terry Gayman, the City's general manager of Engineering and Transportation Services. "Replacing pipes before they begin to break is more cost-effective and allows us to install infrastructure that supports future population growth and economic development opportunities." These upgrades are crucial for a future-ready Guelph and achieving the City's overall vision for the roadway. In addition to replacing underground pipes, the bridge over the Speed River will be replaced, and the City will improve and add travel options for people who walk, cycle, and use other forms of active transportation. Road improvements will also benefit people driving and riding transit.

Projects in the plan

City staff is working on several projects in different sections of Speedvale Avenue in a phased approach.

Elmira Road North to Imperial Road North

Imperial Road North to Royal Road Retaining Wall

Silvercreek Parkway North

Westmount Road to Glenwood Avenue Glenwood Avenue to Speedvale and Woolwich Railway Tracks

Speed River Bridge replacement Riverview Drive to Clive Avenue

Clive Avenue to Manhattan Court

Emma to Earl pedestrian bridge

Work on some of these projects is currently underway, with construction to continue over the next few years. For more information about any project, please visit guelph.ca/construction.

The Speedvale Bridge

Work to replace the Speedvale Bridge is planned around construction of the new Emma to Earl pedestrian bridge so that pedestrians and cyclists have a safe, alternate route while the Speedvale Bridge is being replaced.

The City recently updated and finalized the Emma Street to Earl Street Pedestrian Bridge Municipal Class Environmental Assessment as requested by the Ministry of Environment, Conservation and Parks. Should the assessment confirm a new pedestrian bridge as the preferred solution, construction is expected in 2024 or 2025. A recent study of the Speedvale Bridge's structural integrity indicated load restrictions would likely need to be imposed in about five years time. City staff will continue to monitor the bridge condition on an annual basis.

Communication with local businesses will be key throughout the process. "We understand the impact construction can have on revenue generation, and we're working hard to build and provide alternate routes during the Speedvale Bridge closing," adds Gayman. "We will do everything we can to support businesses and their customers throughout this important work and the Emma to Earl bridge is one way we can make it as easy as possible for

customers to access local businesses. Active transportation options for a net-zero future

Improving the quality of active transportation options along Speedvale Avenue will increase the safety, efficiency and connectivity of Guelph's transportation system. Sidewalks, paved multi-use paths, and the addition of the Emma to Earl pedestrian bridge are important investments in sustainable transportation, and vital to supporting a future-ready Guelph, the Transportation Master Plan and the City's commitment to the Race To Zero.

Avoid sugary drinks that can contain up to 10 teaspoons of sugar. Water is the best way to stay hydrated. By eating a nutritious lunch and snacks, your child will be able to focus on schoolwork and activities rather than a grumbling tummy.

Set a sleep routine.

A good night's sleep is important for everyone, especially children! Make sure your child has a healthy sleep routine, including limiting screen time before bed, and having a consistent bedtime and waking time. Getting enough rest - at least eight hours of sleep each night - gives children's bodies and minds the necessary time to develop, and to start the next school day rested and ready to learn.

Physical activity and keeping fit is important at all ages. It is key to teaching children about staying healthy through exercise and encourages them to explore new hobbies. Sports activities are also an excellent way for kids to make friends and use up extra energy. Communicate with your child frequently.

Talk with your child about any fears they may have about going back to school and, once back, always ask them about their day. Be present and supportive through the conversation by showing interest in their classes and activities, and inquiring about their feelings. These conversations are also a good opportunity to talk to your child about safety - from reminding them to look both ways before crossing the street to educating them about bullying.

Know the backpack essentials. School backpacks are a practical way of carrying schoolbooks, lunch and other items children need during the school day. A good, well-fitted backpack can help prevent back injuries. Backpacks should have wide padded shoulders and a padded back, and the bottom should sit at the child's hip. The packed weight should not exceed 20 per cent of the child's weight.

SONALI PHOGAT: SOCIAL MEDIA, REALITY TV CELEBRITY WHO'LL BE REMEMBERED FOR BEING 'A HAPPY SOUL'

Sonali Phogat, who died following a heart attack in Goa on Tuesday, was no stranger to being in the public eye. She thrived on social media and hours before she breathed her last at the age of 42, she posted pictures and updates about herself on Instagram.

Phogat was a TikTok star and 'Bigg Boss 14' contestant in 2020; she played the wife of a don modelled after the infamous Haji Mastan in the Zee TV serial 'Amma' opposite Nawab Shah; she appeared in a Bhojpuri film with Ravi Kishan, now the BJP MP from Gorakhpur; and she lost to Kuldeep Bishnoi, who was then in the Congress, in his family pocket borough of Adampur in the 2019 Haryana Assembly elections. Ironically, Phogat had contested from the BJP, the party Bishnoi recently joined. And a little before he made the switch, Bishnoi, who has resigned as MLA, was reported to have met Phogat to offer the seat to her — a seat that his father, the late former Haryana Chief Minister Bhajan Lal, then he and his wife Renuka have held since 1968. A BJP activist who had been inducted into the party by former Lok Sabha Speaker Sumitra Mahajan, Sonali Phogat, a farmer's daughter from Bhuthan village in Haryana's Faridabad district, was married off to a local politician, Sanjay Phogat, after she cleared her Class X exams from a local government school. It was Sanjay Phogat, who, coincidentally, also died at the age of 42 in their farmhouse in 2016, who supported her education till Class XII and encouraged her to pursue modelling, along with her studies, in Noida.

From there, she went on to appear on Doordarshan Haryana, acted in the Zee TV serial 'Amma' and also appeared in Haryanvi films, and finally joined the BJP, wetting her feet in politics by campaigning for Vijender Gupta, the party's candidate for the Chandni Chowk Lok Sabha seat in 2009. Throughout, her late husband was solidly behind her, which she tearfully told the singer Rahul Vaidya in a much-publicised episode of 'Bigg Boss 14'.

Immediately after appearing on the reality show, Sonali Phogat was back in the news after a video showing her beating up a Haryana official named Sultan Singh in Hisar went viral.

Remembering their days together on 'Bigg Boss 14', reality TV celebrity Arshi Khan said: "I was in touch with her even after 'Bigg Boss'. She used to treat me like family. She was a happy soul. I used to get so much positivity from her."

Arshi added: "She always treated me like her daughter, pampered me during 'Bigg Boss'. She used to make me understand how the game worked and guided me. The time she was moving out from the 'Bigg Boss' house, I was all broken and today, she has left us all behind." She concluded by saying: "I seriously cannot even think she is no more. I have cancelled my work today and am trying to say a final goodbye."

In her short life, Sonali Phogat managed to leave behind a trail of memories — and a legion of fans and followers.

Adani group targets 55.18% stake in NDTV, issues open offer for 26%

With an idea to hold 55.18 per cent stake in New Delhi Television Ltd (NDTV), the Adani group has issued an open offer for 26 per cent stake in the news channel at Rs 294 for a share with a face value of Rs.4. The total outlay for 26 per cent, or 16,762,530 fully paid up equity shares of NDTV - if the offer is accepted in full - will be about Rs 483 crore for the Adani group.

According to Adani group, the stake acquisition will be in two modes. Firstly, it will be through Vishvapradhan Commercial Private Ltd geographies, NDTV is the most suitable broadcast and digital platform (VCPL). And then VCPL, its wholly-owned parent AMG Media Networks and Adani Enterprises Ltd (persons acting in concert).

According to AMG Media Networks, its subsidiary VCPL has exercised its rights to acquire 99.5 per cent of equity shares of RRPR Holding Private Ltd, a promoter group company of NDTV.

The VCPL holds 1,990,000 warrants of RRPR Holding entitling it to convert them into 99.99 per cent stake in the latter.

The VCPL has exercised its option in part, resulting in acquisition control of RRPR Holding - 1,990,000 equity shares or 99,50 per cent. RRPR Holding holds 29.18 per cent stake in NDTV that has three national television channels.

This triggered the issue of open offer to acquire shares of NDTV from the public as per SEBI's (Substantial Acquisition of Shares and Takeovers) Regulations, 2011.

The VCPL, at its sole discretion, may exercise the balance warrants to acquire up to 99.99 per cent of the equity share capital of RRPR

Holding at any time and in such manner as it may deem fit.

crore and net profit of Rs 85 crore in FY22 with negligible debt. "This acquisition is a significant milestone in the journey of AMNL's (AMG Networks) goal to pave the path of new age media across platforms," AMG Media Networks Ltd Sanjay Pugalia said.

"AMNL seeks to empower Indian citizens, consumers and those interested in India, with information and knowledge. With its leading position in news and its strong and diverse reach across genres and to deliver on our vision. We look forward to strengthening NDTV's leadership in news delivery," he added.

AMNL, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Adani Enterprises, houses the media business of the Adani Group. The company was recently incorporated to set up a credible next generation media platform with emphasis on digital and broadcast segments, amongst others. VCPL, which was recently acquired by AMNL, is its wholly-owned subsidiary. Meanwhile, on Monday, NDTV referring to a query from a journalist filed with BSE: "We are sharing this with you in the best interests of our shareholders - that we have clarified to the journalist in writing that this is a baseless rumour, and that Radhika and Prannoy Roy are not in discussions now, nor have been, with any entity for a change in ownership or a divestment of their stake in NDTV. They individually and through their company, RRPR Holding Private Ltd, continue to hold 61.45 per cent of the total paid-up share capital of NDTV." As per BSE, NDTV has three promoter shareholders (Prannoy Roy 15.94 per cent, Radhika Roy 16.32, RRPR Holding 29.18) holding NDTV recorded a revenue of Rs 421 crore with an EBITDA of Rs 123 61.45 per cent stake and the balance 38.55 per cent is with the public.

CONGRESS YET TO DECIDE ON DATES TO ELECT PARTY PRESIDENT

The Central Election Authority of the Congress is awaiting nod from the party's working committee to announce the schedule for electing the next Congress President as the grand old party is still in search of a consensus candidate for the top post after refusal from Rahul Gandhi. While sources said that the top choice is Ashok Gehlot, the Rajasthan Chief Minister had said on Monday that Rahul Gandhi should re-think his decision as it will demoralise the party workers.

The sources also said that Congress wants to complete the organisational election by September, as it does not want to be on the firing line of the G-23 grouping after the resignation of Ghulam Nabi Azad and Anand Sharma from state committees and with Haryana strongman Bhupinder Singh Hooda batting for the cause of senior party leaders.

Also, Manish Tewari had taken a contrary stand to that of the Congress on the Agnipath scheme, which made the party uncomfortable. Another idea was mooted some time ago accroding to which Sonia Gandhi will continue as the party President while working presidents will be appointed for each zone.

The other name doing the rounds for the top party post is Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel.

Some leaders from the Scheduled Castes who could be given the top post include Sushil Kumar Shinde, Mallikarjun Kharge and Meira Kumar. Kharge is Rahul Gandhi's confidante and can be instrumental in Karnataka polls.

CENTRE PROMOTES WELFARE OF 'RICH FRIENDS', WE INVEST IN PUBLIC, SAYS AAP

The much-debated issue today that has caught the attention of common citizens across many states is the freebies politics that originated from the national capital Delhi in some ways and has made its way to many states through assembly polls.

The freebie culture that has made it to the centrestage of Indian politics is being criticised and advocated at the same time. Those advocating this culture find it a solid foundation for a vibrant democracy and call it an important aspect of the welfare state, while those criticising it fear an adverse impact on the economy.

However, the issue has reached the apex court through a PIL by BJP leader Ashwini Upadhyay against the practice of political parties providing or promising freebies to voters.

The Aam Aadmi Party which started providing free electricity and water with a cap in the capital city after coming to power, may be called the beginning point for this culture. Though, there has been the tradition of waiving off electricity bills, water bills, and agricultural loans by many governments earlier. The Aam Aadmi Party calls it 'an investment in the public.

Dr Sakti Prasad Srichandan, Assistant Professor, Centre for European Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, says that for a country like India, where many people are still below the poverty line, freebies are sometimes required. But it should be in a sustainable way, and without putting pressure on the economy.

"But today we see freebies are used as a political tool to garner votes, and in an unsustainable way. Sooner or later, it will affect the economy and create other problems. The politics of freebies can have serious repercussions as we have seen in the recent case of Sri Lanka" he told IANS. He was apprehensive that India could meet the same fate, if this freebies culture is not tamed in a coordinated and controlled way. Delhi Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia in a press briefing last week said that the BJP calls welfare schemes for the public 'free ki revari' but we call it investing in our people.

MINISTER GADKARI LAUNCHES INDIA'S FIRST ELECTRIC AC DOUBLE-DECKER BUS



Union Minister for Road Transport and Highways, Nitin Gadkari, on Thursday inaugurated India's first AC double-decker electric bus in Mumbai. Taking to his Twitter handle, Gadkari said, "Ushering Sustainable Revolution! It gives me immense pleasure to launch the Ashok Leyland's Electric Double-Decker Bus in Mumbai today."

The minister also said the initiative will give a dynamic boost to the sustainable transport sector.

"Giving Dynamic Boost to the sustainable transportation sector, such initiatives are cost-effective solutions & achieve PM Shri Narendra Modi Ji's vision of Aatmanirbhar Bharat by cutting down oil imports and promoting indigenous resource & services," the minister said in another tweet.

Gadkari added that the government's vision and policies are supportive towards EV adoption with growing consumer demand for greener solutions. Manufactured by Switch Mobility Ltd (Switch), the electric double-decker has more capacity and can carry nearly twice the number of seated passengers as compared to single-decker bus. EXCISE POLICY CASE GIVES BJP AMMUNITION TO AIM AT KEJRIWAL

Though the political image with which the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) was founded owes credit to social activist Anna Hazare's crusade against corruption, Kejriwal has been winning elections for three successive terms in Delhi and the party recently formed the government in Punjab. The AAP has now started projecting itself as a party fighting against corruption and is making this its major poll issue. The AAP is now expanding its foothold in other parts of the country and is fast emerging as a national party and posing a direct political challenge to the NDA government led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. However, Anna Hazare did not support Kejriwal's move to float his own political party and after the formation of AAP, several co-founders of the party were either expelled or left the party on their own.

Manish Sisodia is the lone AAP leader, who is an active party member along with Kejriwal in running the government in Delhi. Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh is another key AAP leader trying to build the party at the organisational level.

Kejriwal is seen to be the most popular AAP face in the states where the party is trying to expand its footprint.

If Kejriwal, who entered into politics after fighting the battle against corruption, also gets embroiled in a corruption case, then it will likely dent his clean political image. This is the reason why the BJP is repeatedly seen targeting the Delhi Chief Minister directly. Union Minister and BJP leader Anurag Thakur has held Kejriwal solely responsible for the liquor scam, adding that Manish Sisodia is the accused in the scam but the 'kingpin' is Kejriwal.

Thakur took a dig at Kejriwal's 'number one' leader remark and

further said that the AAP chief is the most corrupt leader. After targeting the AAP government for distributing freebies to people, the BJP has slammed the AAP government over the liquor scam. Thakur further described the Delhi government as 'Revdi (freebies) Sarkar' and 'Bewdi (drunkards) Sarkar' and asked the AAP whether Kejriwal was himself involved in returning over Rs 144 crore to the liquor mafia without the requisite consent taken by the Delhi Cabinet. Both former and current Delhi BJP chiefs --Manoj Tiwari and Adesh Gupta -- have accused Kejriwal of directly benefitting the liquor mafia, adding that the Delhi government bypassed all the rules and regulations by allowing opening of liquor shops near residential areas, schools and religious places like temples and mosques. Tiwari, while demanding accountability of Rs 8,100 crore from Kejriwal has also alleged that the AAP contested the recent Assembly elections in Punjab, Uttarakhand, Goa and other states with the commission money received from the liquor scam. BJP MP Pravesh Verma went a step further and accused the Delhi Chief Minister of formulating a new excise policy by holding meetings at hotels in Delhi where Sisodia and the government officials as well as liquor mafia were also present. Harsh Vardhan, BJP Lok Sabha MP from Delhi and former Union Minister, also targeted Kejriwal and said that the people have witnessed large-scale corruption committed by the Delhi government. He even said that if there is any morality left in the AAP leaders, they should resign immediately. Speaking to the media on Saturday, a day after the CBI raid at Sisodia's residence, the AAP is downplaying the raids after Sisodia claimed that Kejriwal is emerging as an alternative to Narendra Modi at the national level. "That's why the BJP government is afraid of Kejriwal," Sisodia said. Sisodia also claimed that the 2024 Lok Sabha election will be Arvind Kejriwal vs Narendra Modi. Reacting to Sisodia's allegations, Union Minister Anurag Thakur took a jibe at the AAP and said that these people (AAP) also made several poll promises and tried (to defeat Modiji) in 2014 and 2019 Lok Sabha elections as well in the recent Assembly elections held in Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Goa but were defeated by Prime Minister Modi. Thakur said that the AAP leaders had claimed to form the government with absolute majority in Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand, but their candidates' lost their seat deposits. The same situation is going to happen during the upcoming Assembly elections in Himachal Pradesh and Gujarat as well, he added. Thakur said that in 2014 the BJP had won 282 seats, in 2019 it won 303 seats and in 2024, the Modi

government will be formed for the third time at the Centre by

winning with an even bigger margin of seats.



TRUMP'S PROBLEMS PILE UP AS HIS TEAM SEEMS TO BE LOSING GRIP

Former US President Donald Trump's problems are piling up as his with access to the boxes at issue so that those in the Intelligence team seems to be losing the grip as new disclosures reveal he took 300 documents from the White House. His lawyers are deserting him and he's having tough time at the primaries when blue states recently turned in non-Trump candidates in the run-up to the midterms.

Trump is reportedly having a hard time retaining the "best people" to represent him as he faces multiple lawsuits and a federal investigation, but the latest move from Trump left everyone wondering if his team is even awake at the wheel, media reports said.

On Monday night, one of Trump's official representatives for the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) released a May 10 letter that legal experts say is incredibly damning. Conservative journalist John Solomon posted the document on his website, JustTheNews.com.

The letter was sent to Trump's lawyers by NARA, and confirms that the former president took highly classified materials with him to Mara-Lago. "As you are no doubt aware, NARA had ongoing communications with the former President's representatives throughout 2021 about what appeared to be missing Presidential records, which resulted in the transfer of 15 boxes of records to NARA in January 2022," the letter reads. In its initial review of materials within those boxes, NARA identified items marked as classified national security information, up to the level of Top Secret and including Sensitive Compartmented Information and Special Access Program

NARA informed the Department of Justice about that discovery, which prompted it to ask the President to request that NARA provide the FBI Community could examine them.

The former President had more than 300 classified documents at his Florida estate, Mar-a-Lago, that have since been recovered by the federal government, New York Times has reported.

The figures represent three batches of documents that federal officials have recovered in recent months. About 150 documents marked classified were handed over to the National Archives in January, a large number that prompted concern from officials there that Trump may have had additional sensitive material in the bowels of the resort. Trump reportedly went through those boxes himself late 2021 before they were turned over. Officials at the Justice Department later went to the Florida estate in June with a subpoena for any additional classified material. But reviews of security footage and information from interviews with Trump's aides led them to believe there were even more documents that hadn't been turned over.

The Times added former White House officials were tasked with trying to return the documents to the federal government, but Trump resisted, calling the boxes: "Mine." The FBI, armed with a search warrant, went to Mar-a-Lago on Aug. 8 and recovered 11 more sets of classified material. A federal judge unsealed the warrant shortly afterward, which shows Trump was under investigation for possible violations of the Espionage Act. The Times, the first to report the number of sensitive material found during the searches, added it's unclear what type of classified information officials found. But the paper, citing a person briefed on the investigation, said they included material from the CIA, the National Security Agency and the FBI on topics related to national security.

Sharif pointed out that Islamabad and New Delhi should have competition in trade, economy and improving the conditions of their people.

Pakistan was not an aggressor, but its nuclear assets and the professionally trained army are deterrence, he said, adding: "We spend on our military to protect our frontiers and not for aggression," The News reported. The delegation consisted of students from diverse origins and academic backgrounds. The Prime Minister welcomed students and held a candid discussion about contemporary challenges Pakistan was facing today. In response to a question about the national economy and the IMF programme, the premier said that Pakistan's economic crisis stem from structural problems along with political instability in the recent decades.

He said the first few decades since the inception of Pakistan witnessed impressive growth across all sectors of the economy when there were plans, national will and the implementation mechanism to produce outcomes. "Overtime, we lost the edge in sectors in which we were ahead. The lack of focus, energy and policy action led to reduction in national productivity."

BRITISH AIRWAYS TO CANCEL AROUND 10,000 HEATHROW FLIGHTS: REPORT

British Airways said that it will axe around 10,000 short-haul flights to and from London's Heathrow Airport between October 2022 and March 2023. Some long-haul flights will also be affected, the flag carrier said on Monday of its move, which aims to minimize cancellations and delays during the winter months, reports dpa news agency. Through the end of October, a few dozen round-trip flights per day, a total of 629, are also to be cancelled, the company said. The airline plans to maintain its connections during the autumn school vacations to popular vacation destinations.

Most of the cancellations will be announced well in advance, and travellers are expected to be able to switch to other connections, the airline said. Heathrow, the largest airport in Britain, has imposed a cap of no more than 100,000 passengers a day because of an acute shortage of staff. This had been due to expire in mid-September, but was recently extended until the end of October.

BOLLYWOOD'S TRIPLE CRISIS: NO BANKABLE STARS, NO ORIGINAL SCRIPTS, OVERPRICED MARKET

SOURISH BHATTACHARYYA AND AKSHAY ACHARYA

The tanking of Aamir Khan's 'Laal Singh Chaddha' and Akshay Kumar's 'Raksha Bandhan' (his third in succession) -- that too on a five-day holiday weekend with no competition from the South -- has shown Bollywood for what it is worth.

For the failing stars, the writing on the wall can't get any clearer

-- either reinvent yourself, like 'tragedy king' Dilip Kumar did with his comedic reinvention in the 1967 blockbuster 'Ram Aur Shyam' (which, significantly in the context of what is happening today, was the remake of the 1964 Telugu film 'RamuduBheemudu'), or face the ignominy of fading away. Audiences flock to see films with edgy scripts -- they have done it, across recent decades, from Shah Rukh Khan's 'Darr' and 'Baazigar' to Shahid Kapoor's 'Kabir Singh', to the southern hit machines 'K.G.F.: Chapter 2', 'RRR' and 'Vikram'. Or they just love getting transported to the world of fantasy, which is why the 'Baahubali' franchise has been the top of the top grossers in India, or, in the more recent past, Kichcha Sudeep's 3D sci-fi thriller 'Vikrant Rona' worked so well.

It is for this reason alone that 'Dr. Strange in the Multiverse of Madness' has done better than most Hindi films this year. It also explains the successive successes of 'Avengers: Infinity War' (2018), 'Avengers: Endgame' (2019) and 'Spider-Man: No Way Home' (2022).

What, then, are the realities that Bollywood refuses to wake up to? Trade analyst SumitKadel offers the following reasons:

- 1. Bollywood is making movies for the urban elite multiplex market, which rules out the mass audience, whose budget for an outing to the cinema is between Rs 60 and Rs 150 -- it is this audience that has given generations of Bollywood stars their blockbusters and superhits.
- 2. Even the multiplex audience "now wants to see films that justify, first, the commute and then the high ticket and food prices in theatres". It is cheaper for them to consume entertainment from OTT platforms, where one password can be shared by the entire family -- and the viewing experience does not require any commute. "The average monthly occupancy of multiplexes, unsurprisingly, has come down to 15-20 per cent," Kadel commented. "That is why they are now forced to sell popcorn at exorbitant prices!"
- 3. The South still has a culture of single-screen cinemas with affordable ticket prices, so the films from there -- and the stars -- attract mass footfalls, which in turn leads to the creation of burgeoning fan clubs that keeps them in business. Add to this the support these films get from the South Indian diaspora across the world and you know why their makers are laughing all the way to the bank.
- 4. And most importantly, perhaps, Bollywood seems to be completely out of sync with how the proliferation of social media, from YouTube to TikTok, have revolutionised the entertainment preferences of Indian audiences. And this disruption of conventional entertainment preferences will be disrupted further by the penetration of 5G, which, following Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Independence Day address, has become a national mission.

"Indian audiences are now not only exposed to the best of world cinema, thanks to the Internet, they also have snackable, flash and micro content in the forms of Instagram reels and YouTube vlogs," Kadel pointed out. But, has Bollywood woken up to the ground moving below its feet? It does not seem so.


TO HAVE DEEPIKA-RANVEER AND 'BRAHMASTRA PART 2' ALIA-RANBIR IN THE SAME FILM?

WHAT'S WORKING IN FAVOUR OF INDIA WINNING ASIA CUP FOR 8TH TIME



ndia will enter Asia Cup 2022 in the UAE as the defending champions of the competition. As usual, the Rohit Sharma-led side will once again start as the hot favourites to win the competition despite the absence of senior pacer Jasprit Bumrah and death-overs specialist Harshal Patel.

Though there are some doubts over who will feature in the starting eleven ahead of the Men's T20 World Cup in Australia, cricket fans can be optimistic about India successfully retaining the title. India's journey in Asia Cup 2022 begins from August 28 against arch-rivals Pakistan, before facing the qualifying team on August 31. But India's real challenge will begin when the Super Four stage comes. One of the most striking features of India's T20I game since their early exit in the Men's T20 World Cup has been the side shrugging off their safety-first approach and embracing a more aggressive approach with the bat at the top. The result of which has been that India go hard in their batting innings, with their run-rate in 2022 at a healthy 9.29, compared to 8.20. "We've made it very clear after the T20 World Cup in Dubai, where we didn't qualify for the finals, that we felt there needed to be a change in our attitude and approach in how we play our game. If the message is clear from the captain and the coach about where the team is trying to head, then the individuals will definitely try to do that. "For that to happen they need freedom and clarity and that's what we are trying to do. We are trying to give them as much freedom as possible," revealed Rohit on "Follow the Blues" show on Star Sports about bringing a change in India's batting approach. Rohit himself has been in brilliant form, playing the high-risk shots in the power-play to get better returns. Suryakumar Yadav and Deepak Hooda have been in brilliant form while Rishabh Pant, Hardik Pandya and Dinesh Karthik are capable of providing big-bang finishing touches to the innings. Once Virat Kohli and KL Rahul embrace India's new batting approach, then India's batting

stocks are bound to go high. Since last year's World Cup, when Rohit has been the full-time captain and Rahul Dravid as the head coach, India have won six of their seven bilateral T20I series, barring the one against South Africa, which was shared 2-2 after rain had washed out the decider in Bengaluru in June. Rohit also acknowledged how having a great cricketing brain like Dravid as head coach was the foundation stone of India's new style of playing T20Is. "When he (Dravid) became a coach here, we met and sat together in a room for a while and decided how we want to take this thing forward and he was pretty much on the same thought process as to what I was thinking." "That made it a little easier for me to give out a clear message to the boys because we don't want to create confusion among the group; and of course, we wanted him to change the style of cricket as well. We wanted to play a certain way in all three formats and he was ready to accept all of that." Despite the absence of Bumrah and Patel, India still have the presence of senior pacer Bhuvneshwar Kumar, who is back to his best self since the T20Is against South Africa in June and making the big strikes in power-play. India will also be buoyed with young left-arm pacer Arshdeep Singh's glowing performances in the T20I series against West Indies, where he picked seven wickets in five matches. In the spin department, Ravichandran Ashwin showed he still has it in him to contribute in T20Is. Yuzvendra Chahal has been in great form and is all but confirmed to be the first-choice spinner. But if the batting order of the opposition is loaded with right-handers, then Ravindra Jadeja comes into the mix. Ravi Bishnoi is an excellent user of deceptive googly and is a nice back-up option on pitches of the UAE. In all, with a new batting template and variety in bowling options leading to great form in the last

couple of months, one can be very hopeful that the above factors can lead to

India winning Asia Cup for the eighth straight time.

Eleven teams had participated in the qualifying rounds, and Team Blitz was the fourth and last team to enter the semifinals, which were played on August 12 against Poland's CKIS Skawina U15.

ASIA CUP 2022: KOHLI WILL BE MENTALLY AND PHYSICALLY FRESH AHEAD OF **TOURNAMENT - SHANE WATSON**

According to Australia all-rounder, Shane Watson, Virat Kohli will be mentally and physically rejuvenated after coming back from a monthlong break from cricket ahead of the Asia Cup.

Kohli is currently off-coloured and enduring a lean phase of his career. He is yet to score a century in international cricket since November 2019. In the upcoming, India vs Pakistan match on August 28, the focus will be on the star batter as he will return to cricket after missing out on the series against the West Indies and Zimbabwe.

"Having time off for him certainly, would (help him) just be able to regenerate mentally, physically, just be able to get away from the game of cricket," Watson said on the ICC Review Show. "You could just see that his energy was a bit sapped, even during the IPL. You could tell, no matter how much he tried - he was always up and about, but you could see the light was just out a tiny bit," he added. Kohli played his last match during the England tour where he could manage just 76 runs from six innings across formats, which included the rescheduled fifth Test, two ODIs, and as many T20s in July. "This month that he's had off cricket will make sure that that light's shining very bright going into this Asia Cup, knowing there's a T20 World Cup in Australia coming up very soon as well.

"So when you're able to have a break, and because the Indian cricketers in particular play so much cricket, for Virat to be able to have some time off, especially a month, that's just going to regenerate everything he needs to be able to take stock of what happened, freshen up mentally and physically." Watson said Kohli is a quality player who will eventually return to form. "He's too good not to be able to find his groove. It'll only take him a couple of balls, get into the battle again, and away he goes."

ASIA CUP 2022: LOSING AFRIDI IS BIG SETBACK: PAKISTAN HEAD COACH SAQLAIN

Pakistan head coach Saglain Mushtag said injured Shaheen Shah Afridi's absence in the upcoming Asia Cup is a "big setback". However, he backed his bowlers to deliver positive performances in the tournament. Saglain backed Nassem Shah to perform in the Asia Cup after the rightarm pacer's brilliant bowling in the three-match ODI series against the Netherlands. "Obviously, losing Shaheen is a big setback to us before the tournament and for the England series because he is someone who has proven himself at the top level and done well against the best batsmen," Saqlain said. "It is never easy to replace a player like Shaheen because of his quality but the resources we have are good and we are backing them to deliver for us, he added. "Naseem, I see him as a star in the making because of the control, aggression, attitude and execution he has displayed in his bowling. He has been very impressive for us." Saqlain said. "He (Naseem) changed the course of the match and the other bowlers supported him well. "His (Afridi's) injury is unfortunate but we are hoping he recovers soon as we have important cricket coming up." Pakistan selectors named 22-year-old Mohammad Hasnain as a replacement for Afridi for the Asia Cup.

SHOOTING, ARCHERY, WRESTLING, JUDO APPLY FOR **INCLUSION IN VICTORIA 2026 COMMONWEALTH GAMES**

Applications have been received from shooting, wrestling, archery and 3×3 basketball among others to be included in the programme for the 2026 Commonwealth Games in Victoria State in Australia. Among the other sports that have applied to be included in the "three or four" sports that are likely to be added to the 16 already shortlisted are judo, coastal rowing, beach rowing and taekwondo. Saturday was the last day to apply for being included in Victoria 2026 Commonwealth Games. The organising committee had initially proposed 16 regular sports and six para-sports to be part of the Games.

Aquatics, athletics, badminton, boxing, beach volleyball, T20 cricket, cycling, gymnastics, hockey, lawn bowls, netball, rugby sevens, squash, table tennis, triathlon and weightlifting are the 16 sports already on the programme. Six Para sports — athletics, swimming, lawn bowls, triathlon, table tennis and powerlifting — are also due to be contested. Competitions will be held in four regional centres

Geelong, Bendigo, Ballarat and Gippsland besides Melbourne Cricket Ground, which will host the opening and closing ceremonies.

While shooting and archery were left out for the just-concluded Commonwealth Games in Birmingham. Judo, 3×3 basketball and wrestling all appeared at Birmingham 2022 but have not yet been confirmed for Victoria.

Following a huge furore over the exclusion of shooting, both in Australia and countries like India. Victoria 2026 chief executive Jeroen Weimar had a few weeks back informed that "three or four" more sports are likely to be added.

Meanwhile, shootings got a boost for their inclusion after Shooting Australia proposed the Wellsford Rifle Range near Melbourne, which hosted full-bore rifle events of Melbourne 2006 Commonwealth Games, and the Victorian State Range at Echucha, 81 kilometres from Bendigo as possible venues that could be refurbished for the CWG.

PAKISTAN SURVIVE NETHERLANDS SCARE TO **REGISTER 9-RUN WIN, CLINCH SERIES 3-0**

The Netherlands produced a compelling performance to come close to beating Pakistan in the third and final ODI but the visitors held their nerve to win by nine runs and clinch the series 3-0, here on Sunday. Despite the 0-3 loss, the Netherlands showcased fight and played some exemplary cricket right through the series.

After winning the toss and opting to bat first, Pakistan didn't have a great start as the Netherlands' bowlers impressed with the new ball. Vivian Kingma prized out debutant Abdullah Shafique in the second over of the innings. Fakhar Zaman and Babar Azam then rebuilt for Pakistan. However, the Netherlands managed to find a breakthrough when Logan van Beek cleaned up Zaman (26) in the 18th over. Agha Salman gave Babar fine company as the skipper completed his ninth fifty-plus score in his last 10 innings. Pakistan lost three wickets in quick succession in the middle overs as the Netherlands made a strong comeback. Salman, Khushdil Shah and Mohammad Haris were dismissed in the space of 31 runs. Babar continued edging close to a hundred, but he couldn't eventually get there as a stunning return catch from Aryan Dutt ended his knock, nine short of a ton. Pakistan were eventually bowled out for 206 in 49.4 overs. In reply, the Netherlands too had a poor start. Naseem Shah continued to make a strong impression on the tour as he sent back Max O'Dowd and Musa Ahmed inside the first 10 overs to give Pakistan a rousing start.

HOW UAE BECAME WORLD'S FIRST CHOICE FOR SPORTS AND INTERNATIONAL TOURNAMENTS

The 51-year-old country, the United Arab Emirates, which did not even have a special identity in the sports arena on the world stage till a few years ago, has emerged as a world-class sports venue in the last few years, to everyone's surprise. The country has proved its mettle on the global stage in terms of hosting cricket, football, Formula One, tennis, golf, and UFC (Ultimate Fighting Championship) events.

Although football is the first choice of the local population of UAE and there are countless football stadiums and football clubs, the way the government has made facilities in UAE for all sports with a vision and policy considering the possibilities in all other sports. Along with creating a safe environment, it has started a new chapter of sports tourism in this tourism-oriented economy.

This month UAE is going to host the Asia Cup 2022. In the past few years, UAE hosted a lot of cricket events — T20 World Cup, IPL, and Pakistan Super League (PSL) — many times. The country hosted them during the peak of COVID-19 and that makes UAE a standalone country in organising sports events. Hosting major cricket tournaments is not a foreign concept for the UAE. Cricket came to this country in early 1981 when Sharjah started hosting, the elite international players well before hosting its first international tournament. Since then, the UAE has grown strongly, hosting the first part of the 2014 IPL and the full edition of the 2020 IPL. It also hosted Pakistan's international matches for almost a decade after the 2009 Lahore terror attack. The country, which brought international cricket in the 1980s, got the chance to host one of the biggest tournaments in the world — the ICC T20 World Cup (October 17 to November 14) and now will be hosting the Asia Cup. The tournament was supposed to be hosted by Sri Lanka, but the political situation forced the Lankan Board to move the tournament to the UAE. According to a report on the economic impact of sports in Dubai, more than \$1.7 billion is spent in total annual sports-related spending, and the total economic impact of sports in Dubai is more than \$670 million.
