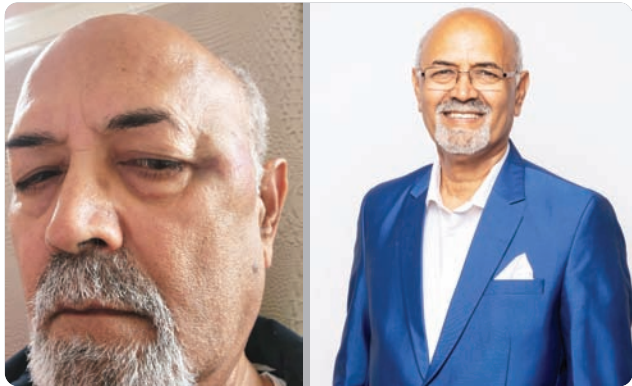

DOES THE WEATHER IMPACT YOUR ARTHRITIS?

Is there truth to the idea that weather affects your joints, or is it an old wives' tale? Scientists are not yet sure why, but studies do suggest that weather changes can increase pain. While controlling the weather isn't an option, there are things you can do to manage your arthritis pain. Start by tracking your symptoms. You can find a daily symptom tracker on Arthritis Society Canada's website. Once you know what kind of weather affects you, follow these tips. If your symptoms are worse in warm weather:

- * A cool shower or cold pack can help with pain and inflammation on hot days.
- * It's important to stay hydrated. Drink plenty of water and try to avoid

caffeine, alcohol and sugary drinks that can contribute to dehydration.

- * Try to avoid spending time in the sun during the hottest hours of the day.
- * You can try a cooling ointment or spray that produces an icy feeling where it's applied.

If your symptoms are worse in colder weather:

- * Take a warm bath or shower to help relieve the pain.
- * Use a hot water bottle, warm pack or heating pad to soothe sore joints.
- * Dress in multiple layers and cover exposed skin when outdoors.
- * Try soaking your sore hands in warm water.

PUNJAB DGP CONSTITUTES SIT OVER 'LEAKED OBJECTIONABLE VIDEOS' OF STUDENTS

Punjab Director General of Police Gaurav Yadav on Monday constituted a three-member all-women Special Investigating Team (SIT), under the supervision of Additional DGP Gurpreet Deo, to investigate allegations by Chandigarh University hostellers over their alleged 'leaked objectionable videos'. The DGP said one student and two others were arrested. He thanked his counterparts in Himachal Police for excellent cooperation. "Electronic devices seized and sent for forensic examination. The SIT will go to the bottom of the conspiracy. No person to be spared, if found involved," said Yadav in a video message. He appealed to everyone to maintain peace and harmony. "Don't fall to unverified rumours. Let's work together for peace in society," he added. Responding immediately, Himachal DGP Sanjay Kundu said the police reacted to the request of Punjab Police with sensitivity and professionalism. "We nabbed the accused. Congrats to Dr Monika, Superintendent of Police, Shimla, and her team for great professional work," Kundu tweeted. Huge protests broke out on the university campus in Mohali district after a girl allegedly leaked private videos of her hostel mates online. A day after daylong protest, silence returned to the campus on Monday as the local administration and the university agreed to investigate the demand of the students over objectionable videos of several girl students that were recorded by a hosteller and shared with her friend in Shimla. The police arrested an MBA first-year student of the university, while her friend and another person were held in Shimla. As the matter drew angry political reactions, the university authorities

clarified that "no videos were found of any student which are objectionable, except a personal video shot by a girl which she shared with her boyfriend". Also dismissing reports of suicide attempt by some students who were allegedly filmed, the authorities said "there are rumours that seven girls have committed suicide whereas the fact is that no girl has taken any such step". Senior Superintendent of Police Vivek Soni, who is leading the investigation team, categorically told the media on Sunday that no attempt to suicide was reported after the incident came to light. Also, he said, so far there is no evidence of the video going viral. "As per the investigation, the accused made her own video and shared it with her boyfriend. There is no video of other students made by her. There is no evidence of that so far. A lot of misinformation and rumours are doing the rounds. We should respect the modesty of the accused student as we are investigating the matter," he said. As per reports, the accused hosteller sent nude images and videos to her male friend in Shimla, resulting in the footage being circulated online. As the news spread, a massive protest was staged on the university campus on Saturday night with scores of hostellers raising the 'we want justice' slogan. Meanwhile, terming the incident as unfortunate, Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann ordered a high-level probe into the matter. The Chief Minister said that "daughters are our dignity and pride", adding that any such incident is highly condemnable. He categorically said that anyone found guilty will not be spared and severe action will be taken against the perpetrators of this crime.

SIKH DELEGATION MEETS PM MODI AT HIS RESIDENCE



A delegation of Gurudwara Bala Sahib visited Prime Minister Narendra Modi at his official residence on Monday. They offered him 'prasad' and blessings and honoured the Prime Minister by tying a 'Pagdi' and offering him a 'Siropa'. An 'ardas' was also performed for the Prime Minister's long life and good health. The Gurudwara had organised an 'Akhand paath' between September 15 and 17 to commemorate the Prime Minister's birthday. This 'Akhand paath' was attended by thousands of Sikh devotees, a statement said. The Prime Minister expressed his happiness on meeting the delegation and thanked them for their wishes and prayers for his well-being. He said that he was humbled and deeply touched by their gesture for making him feel a part of the Sikh community. He reiterated the commitment of the government for continuously working towards the welfare of the Sikh community.

US PRESIDENT BIDEN CLAIMS 'PANDEMIC IS OVER' AS WHO ADVISES VIGILANCE

US President Joe Biden has claimed that the Covid-19 pandemic is over, as millions suffer from long Covid and several countries still bear the brunt of the global health crisis. On the CBS '60 Minutes' TV show on Sunday, Biden said: "The pandemic is over. We still have a problem with Covid. We're still doing a lot of work on it. It's, but the pandemic is over". "If you notice, no one's wearing masks," Biden said while gesturing at the gathering. "Everybody seems to be in pretty good shape. And so I think it's changing." However, the US government still designates Covid-19 as a Public Health Emergency and the World Health Organization (WHO) says it remains a Public Health Emergency of International Concern, reports CNN. Last week, the WHO said that future coronavirus waves are expected and that governments across the world need to remain vigilant and ready to respond to any threat that may emerge. WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus said that this virus will not just fade away. "The global decline in reported cases and deaths is continuing. This is very encouraging. But there is no guarantee these trends will persist. The most dangerous thing is to assume they will," he said in his latest remarks. "The number of weekly reported deaths may have dropped by more than 80 per cent since February, but even so, last week one person died with Covid-19 every 44 seconds," Ghebreyesus emphasised. However, he said that "we have never been in a better position to end the pandemic". According to the WHO, during the week of September 5-11, the number of new weekly cases worldwide decreased by 28 per cent over the previous week to more than 3.1 million. The number of new weekly deaths was down 22 per cent to just under 11,000.

TWO-TIME PUNJAB CM AMARINDER SINGH JOINS BJP

Two-time Punjab Chief Minister Capt Amarinder Singh on Monday joined the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in presence of Union Ministers Narendra Tomar and Kiren Rijiju. Among those present included senior leaders Ashwani Sharma, Sunil Jakhar and others. Besides Capt Amarinder Singh, others who joined the BJP included former Deputy Speaker Ajaib Singh Bhatti, former MPs Amrik Singh Aliwal, and Kewal Singh, former MLAs Prem Mittal, Harchand Kaur, Harjinder Thekedar, Balbir Rani Sodhi, former Punjab Mahila Congress President, Raninder Singh, Beeba Jaya Inder Kaur, Nirvan Singh, Kamaljit Saino and Farzana Alam, who was represented by her daughter. Earlier, Amarinder Singh met union Home Minister Amit Shah and BJP President J.P. Nadda.

Welcoming Amarinder Singh and others into the party, Tomar said he had always kept national interests above partisan interests. He said with his joining the party, the BJP will be strengthened further in Punjab. Amarinder Singh expressed gratitude to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Home Minister Shah and BJP chief Nadda for reposing trust and confidence in him. He assured that he will give in his best to strengthen the party in Punjab. Amarinder Singh, a veteran of many political and military battles, left the Congress last year after resigning as the Chief Minister. He set up his own political outfit, the Punjab Lok Congress, which fought February 2022 Assembly elections in alliance with the BJP. However, it did not win any seat.

BUZZ OF MERGER WITH VISTARA AS AIR INDIA WANTS TO ESTABLISH ITSELF AS WORLD-CLASS GLOBAL AIRLINE

Amid the ambitious plan of the Tata owned Air India to raise its market share substantially to at least 30 per cent in the domestic market, there is a buzz within the aviation industry on the possibility of its merger with Vistara, a joint venture between Tata Sons and Singapore Airlines. On September 15, Air India unveiled its comprehensive transformation plan, to establish itself, once again, as a world-class global airline. It said that over the next five years, it will strive to increase its market share to at least 30 per cent in the domestic market while significantly growing the international routes from the present market share. The plan is aimed at putting Air India on a path to sustained growth, profitability and market leadership. Air India clocked a market share of 8.5 per cent in August while carrying 8.61 lakh passengers. On the other hand, Vistara has maintained its second position in terms of the market share during the last two months July (10.4 per cent) and August (9.7 per cent). Apart from this, Air India has talked about its fleet expansion plan by introducing five widebody and 25 narrowbody aircraft. The airline has also said about getting back its grounded aircraft in service. On the other side, Vistara has 55 aircraft and the number will increase to 60 in the upcoming months. In the winter schedule starting from October end, Vistara will add more flights to Europe as it has planned increasing capacity to Frankfurt and Paris. When asked about the possibility of a merger, an industry insider said that there was speculation about the merger particularly after Air India's announcement of the transformation plan. There will be clarity on this only in the coming months. The ambitions of Air India to have 30 per cent market share from the current existing market share of 8.5 per cent gives enough support to the buzz of a merger with Vistara," he said. When contacted, both the airlines refused to comment on the possibility of merger. Moreover, the Competition Commission of India approved Air India's proposed acquisition of Tata group's entire 83.67 per cent stake in Air Asia India. The approval gives a boost to the group's plans of merging the two airlines. Currently, the Tata Group operates four airlines -- Air India, Air India Express, AirAsia India and Vistara. Air India and Vistara



operate on both domestic and international routes. While AirAsia flies on only domestic routes, the Air India Express operates only on the international routes. Air India and AirAsia have a combined market share of 13 per cent in India. The group already planned to merge AirAsia India with Air India Express. Air India has spread its wings to become a major international airline with a network across the US, Canada, the UK, Europe, Far East, South East Asia, Australia and the Gulf. The airline also has an extensive domestic network, including far-flung areas of India's North-East, Ladakh, Andaman & Nicobar Islands. India's first international budget carrier, Air India Express was launched in 2005 to meet the need for affordable services on short and medium haul routes -- connecting smaller towns directly to the Gulf and South East Asia regions. After 69 years as a government-owned enterprise, Air India and Air India Express were reacquired by the Tata group in January 2022. Post the acquisition, time-bound transformation milestones have been laid out and a series of steps have been initiated towards achieving the same in order to ensure Air India once again emerges as a world class airline.

PM TRUDEAU MEETS UKRAINE'S PM IN LONDON, DISCUSSES RUSSIA'S 'ATROCITIES'



Prime Minister Justin Trudeau met with the Prime Minister of Ukraine, Denys Shmyhal. The Prime Ministers discussed Canada's assistance to Ukraine and work with like-minded partners to address the impacts of Russia's illegal and unjustifiable aggression of the country. They also discussed the importance of maintaining strong unity amongst allies and continuing to impose severe sanctions on Russia in the face of its invasion of Ukraine. Prime Minister Trudeau expressed his condolences to Prime Minister Shmyhal on behalf of Canadians to all Ukrainians regarding the horrifying and heartbreaking atrocities committed in Izium. Prime Minister Trudeau commended the courage and heroism of the Ukrainian people in coming together to defend their country and freedoms against Russia's ongoing attacks. Prime Minister Trudeau congratulated Ukraine on its recent military gains, and reiterated Canada's strong ongoing support for Ukraine, including leadership on financial support through the International Monetary Fund. The leaders also discussed Ukraine's financial situation, including its economic recovery and reconstruction. Prime Minister Shmyhal thanked Prime Minister Trudeau for Canada's ongoing military, financial, and humanitarian aid to Ukraine. The leaders strongly condemned Russia's increasingly persistent, indiscriminate, and horrific attacks on civilians and civilian infrastructure in Ukraine. Prime Minister Trudeau and Prime Minister Shmyhal agreed to keep in close contact.

'TOTALLY UNEXPECTED': RAMAN VASUDEV, BRAMPTON'S REGIONAL COUNCILLOR CANDIDATE FROM WARDS 3, 4 ATTACKED NEAR HIS HOME

In an exclusive interview with Y Media, Raman Vasudev, Brampton's Regional councillor candidate from wards 3, 4, said he was attacked by two unknown men while he waiting for an "urgent letter." "I don't know what was their plan, and they tried to come close to me," he explained. "The moment they (came) close to me I said 'what do you want from me?'"



"They didn't follow me, they just ran away at that time," he said, adding that he woke up his son and wife who were both sleeping. Vasudev said the attack was "totally unexpected," adding that he didn't even have his cell phone with him. When asked by Y Media whether he thinks the attack was "politically motivated," Vasudev said he's not sure. "It's not my routine, normally I go for a walk at around 5:30 in that area for half an hour," he said. Vasudev said he called police to report what had happened.

MINISTER HARJIT SAJJAN, MP IQRA KHALID, AND CANADIAN DELEGATION OF MPS VISIT THE FLOOD IMPACTED REGIONS IN PAKISTAN

Pakistan is experiencing the worst climate catastrophe in its recent history. Heavy monsoon rains and flooding since mid-June have caused over 1,500 deaths and impacted 33 million lives across the country. Hundreds of thousands of homes have been destroyed, and livelihoods, crops, and livestock have been severely affected. There must be international support to save lives and rebuild communities in Pakistan. Canada took action and sent a delegation comprised of the Minister for International Development, Harjit Sajjan, along with MPs Iqra Khalid, Salma Zahid and Shafqat Ali, to Pakistan to assess the dire situation firsthand. The delegation travelled from Sindh to Khyber Pakhtoon Khan and met with impacted communities. They heard the heart-wrenching stories from families who have lost their homes, children who no longer have a school to attend, and healthcare workers who are preparing for the diseases that will become widespread as the country waits for the water to recede. The delegation also met with government officials including Prime Minister Shahbaz Sharif and the National Disaster Management Authority, to receive briefings on the situation on the ground. In light of this ongoing tragedy, Canada has stepped up to support the people of Pakistan. Prime Minister Trudeau announced that Canada is allocating an additional \$25 million of funding, on top of the initial \$5 million committed, in response to the ongoing crisis in Pakistan and to support development projects in the country. Prime Minister Justin Trudeau also announced that the Government of Canada is matching up to \$3 million in donations made by individuals to the Humanitarian Coalition and its members in response to the flooding in Pakistan, until September 28th. These funds will help to deliver life-saving support, such as emergency food and nutrition assistance, emergency cash and vouchers, as well as necessary water, sanitation and health services. As emergency relief is provided to the over 6 million people in need, Canada is also looking at what redevelopment looks like for Pakistan and will be monitoring the evolving situation closely. While in Pakistan, MP Iqra Khalid also met with the UNHCR and Inspire Pakistan and reviewed their efforts to support Afghan refugees in resettlement. She participated in the various services offered, including vocational training and trauma recovery. Canada provides \$6 million to UNHCR to support these efforts.

SCO SUMMIT: CONFLICT BETWEEN NEED AND GREED

The Economist magazine has termed the Shanghai Corporation Organisation (SCO) a 'Talking Shop' and perhaps rightly so. Once again vital regional challenges such as cooperation, connectivity and economy that the region faces have been ignored at the 22nd SCO Summit held in Samarkand, Uzbekistan, between September 15-16. At least four of the permanent members of SCO are a loggerhead with each other or with their immediate neighbours. The Russian war in Ukraine has created uncertainty about the global supply of gas and oil. Pakistan is grappling with terrorism in its northern region of Khyber Pakhtunkhawa as well as wrestling with armed separatists in southwestern province of Balochistan. Diplomatic tensions run high with Afghanistan after Pakistan accused the former of providing the UN designated terrorist Masood Azhar with sanctuary. India is busy tackling terrorist infiltration from Pakistan as well as serious border tensions with China.

It was obvious from the start that this summit will not be a collective consultative conference but will end up becoming an opportunity for SCO member states to hold one-to-one meetings on the side lines. On September 15, Chinese President Xi Jinping held a meeting with the president of Uzbekistan signing a \$16 billion investment deal. Another deal sealed at the SCO summit sideline meetings was that between Russian and Uzbekistan which amounts to \$4.6 billion. According to the deal signed with China it will construct a China-Kyrgyzstan-Uzbekistan railway. The deal signed with Russia were in machinery, chemicals, petrochemicals and geology sectors of Uzbekistan's economy. Russian President Vladimir Putin met with his Turkish counterpart Recep Tayyip Erdogan in which Russia promised to support Turkey becoming a permanent member of the SCO in return for Turkey not to object the gas pipeline of which 750 km has already been laid down via Iran and needs to be build a further 250 km into Pakistani territory. During a half-an-hour closed door meeting held at the Summer Palace residence of the president of Uzbekistan between Xi Jinping and Erdogan it is believed that a billion-dollar grain deal was struck which will enable China to earn billions of dollars from Turkey. The Prime Minister of Pakistan choked several times during his speech to the summit describing that his country had turned into "a sea of water", but no collective relief package was offered, leaving him high and dry. Moreover, the SCO summit failed to persuade Putin to end the devastating war in Ukraine or for that matter the China's illegal economic expansion into the disputed territories of Gilgit-Baltistan under the guise of the so-called CPEC, which is part of her larger Belt and Road Initiative program. The Russian president and Chinese head of state both seemed to have come to a trade fair. Both were cutting trade deals left, right and centre. Putin was negotiating the price of gas and oil sale to pauper Pakistan and Xi was expanding Belt and Road Initiative into central Asia via Uzbekistan. The purpose of the summit should have been to collectively find solutions to the menace of terrorist, slack connectivity and solving the energy crisis. Instead it ludicrously became an exercise of collective inaction. Tensions among SCO member states run so high that the Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi was unable to hold a one-to-one meeting with

his Pakistan and Chinese counterparts. One of the main reason for SCO summit to fail to come up with a joint declaration seems to be the lack of will of both China and Russia to withdraw from their desire to expand their hegemonic influence among their economic and political spheres. None of the above countries initiated a debate in their home countries for peace and reconciliation. The war jingoism which has become the benchmark of Xi's politics has antagonized the wider Chinese population to an extent that to reverse that could become a cause for Xi's downfall. Therefore, there was no collectively agreed agenda for the summit to discuss. No pre-summit discussion was held among the leaders of the member countries which would have been a precursor for any productive road map. The only country that stood its ground was India as Modi moved among the world leader like a sage advising Putin to consider peaceful means to forward his diplomatic ambitions. India has become the fifth largest economy of the world surpassing the UK. As India moves forward to become the new manufacturing hub of the world, it is most unlikely that SCO will be able to become a forum for regional peace and economic cooperation. China, it seems, will use all means available to sabotage India. India's economic growth is led by the desire to meet the needs of both its population and wider world. China's economic growth, on the other hand, is driven by imperialistic economic expansionism driven by greed. Modi's advice to Putin that this was the era of peace is the key approach to achieve regional peace which in turn is vital for the region. However, for this to happen the member countries of the SCO will have to strike a balance between need and greed. For now, it seems it will take quite some time before the current conflict between need and greed will resolve itself.

CANADA ANNOUNCES \$1.9 MILLION IN FUNDING TO COMBAT
ONLINE TERRORIST & VIOLENT EXTREMIST CONTENT

At the Christchurch Call 2022 Leaders’ Summit, the Prime Minister, the Right Honourable Justin Trudeau, announced that Canada will commit up to \$1.9 million in funding over three years to Tech Against Terrorism for Phase 2 of their Terrorist Content Analytics Platform (TCAP), a secure online tool that automates the detection, notification, and analysis of verified terrorist content.

This funding is made available through the Canada Centre for Community Engagement and Prevention of Violence’s Community Resilience Fund (CRF), which supports partnerships and innovation in countering radicalization to violence in Canada.

In June 2019, in support of the Christchurch Call to Eliminate Terrorist & Violent Extremist Content Online, the Government of Canada provided approximately \$1 million in funding through the CRF for Tech Against Terrorism to create the TCAP.

Building on the TCAP’s successes, Phase 2 of the platform will expand its capabilities to identify and assess more types of content across a wider range of platforms, and help develop a content moderation tool to assist smaller tech companies in quickly removing this terrorist content.

Investing in tools such as the TCAP helps keep Canadians safe by finding innovative and effective ways to address harmful online content, and to work with our global partners to combat terrorist and extremist activities in a rapidly changing digital landscape.

Quick facts

The Canada Centre for Community Engagement and Prevention of Violence leads the Government of Canada’s efforts to counter radicalization to violence, and works with all levels of government, not-for-profit organizations, communities, youth, frontline practitioners, academia, law enforcement, and international organizations.

Canada continues to work with Five Eyes partners, through the Five Country Ministerial, and G7 countries to engage with digital industry,



including the Global Internet Forum to Counter Terrorism led by Facebook, Google, Twitter and Microsoft, to address issues related to violent extremist and terrorist use of the Internet.

CANADA’S INFLATION REACHES 7% IN
AUGUST, DOWN 7.6% FROM AUGUST 2021

Excluding gasoline, prices rose 6.3% year over year in August, following a 6.6% increase in July. This is the first month since June 2021 that the year-over-year CPI, excluding gasoline, has slowed. On a monthly basis, the CPI fell 0.3% in August, the largest monthly decline since the early months of the COVID-19 pandemic. On a seasonally adjusted monthly basis, the CPI was up 0.1%, the smallest gain since December 2020. Transportation (+10.3%) and shelter (+6.6%) prices drove the deceleration in consumer prices in August. Moderating the slowing in prices were sustained higher prices for groceries, as prices for food purchased from stores (+10.8%) rose at the fastest pace since August 1981 (+11.9%). Price growth for goods and services both slowed on a year-over-year basis in August. As non-durable goods (+10.8%) decelerated due to lower prices at the pump, services associated with travel and shelter services contributed the most to the slow down in service prices (+5.5%). Prices for durable goods (+6.0%), such as passenger vehicles and appliances, also grew at a slower rate in August. In August, the average hourly wages rose 5.4% on a year-over-year basis, meaning that, on average, prices rose faster than wages. Although Canadians experienced a decline in purchasing power, the gap was smaller than in July.

Gasoline prices rise at a slower pace year over year

Year over year, gasoline prices rose less in August (+22.1%) compared with July (+35.6%). On a monthly basis, gasoline prices fell 9.6% following a decline in July (-9.2%). This was the largest monthly decline since April 2020.

Fee for Attestation services will be payable only through Demand Draft in favour of “Consulate General of India, Toronto”. For attestation service applicant must attach a self-addressed prepaid envelope for return of serviced documents. Applicants are therefore requested to go through the following links to understand the documentary requirements and applicable fee:

4. Applications will be accepted only if all documents and forms are submitted. Applicants are required to submit original and photocopy of all the documents and the forms as prescribed in the above links. Soft copy of any document will not be accepted.
5. The Covid-19 guidelines must be strictly adhered to at the camp.

SUBMISSION OF VISA APPLICATION BY PERSON OF INDIAN ORIGIN

- All Indian Passport holders, after obtaining foreign nationality, are compulsorily required by law to surrender their Indian Passports at the nearest Indian Mission/Post. Those Indian Origin Canadian/foreign nationals who are yet to surrender their Indian Passports are advised do so immediately and obtain a Surrender Certificate. The details of the process to Surrender the Indian Passport can be seen on the website <https://www.cgitoronto.gov.in>
2. In view of the difficulties being faced by aged Persons of Indian origin who arrived in Canada long ago and are unable to trace their old Indian Passports, the Consulate has decided to relax the requirement of providing Surrender Certificate/ old cancelled Indian Passport.
 3. Person of Indian origin who acquired Canadian citizenship before 1st June 2010 and are unable to provide copy of Surrender Certificate / old Indian Passport may provide a duly notarized Affidavit with regard to unavailability of Surrender Certificate / old cancelled Indian Passport. The format of Affidavit can be seen on the Mission's website at the link below:

When Council approved the updated Waste Management Bylaw in April 2022, City staff was asked to engage with the Accessibility Advisory Committee (AAC) to discuss the potential elimination of plastic straws by January 1, 2023. Given the new federal direction, staff is unable to recommend any bylaw measures for SUP straws as federal regulations override municipal bylaw.

GUELPH COUNCIL APPROVES SINGLE-USE ITEMS BYLAW

Local single-use items reduction strategy aligned with Government of Canada's single-use plastics ban Last night, Guelph Council approved a Single-Use Items Bylaw aligned with new federal regulations announced in June. The Government of Canada is banning six categories of harmful single-use plastics including checkout bags, cutlery, foodservice ware made from or containing problematic plastics (e.g. polylactic acid, polyvinyl chloride, polystyrene foam, oxo-degradable plastic, and black plastic made with carbon black), ring carriers used for bottles and cans, stir sticks and straws.

Federal ban on plastic straws effective December 2023

According to the new federal regulations, the manufacture and import of single-use plastic (SUP) straws for sale in Canada are banned as of December 20, 2022, and they will no longer be available for purchase by December 20, 2023. The manufacture and import of SUP flexible straws will be allowed with the following sale restrictions:

It was close to an even split between the number of markets where sales were up and those where sales were down. Gains were led by the Greater Toronto Area (GTA) and a large regional mix of other Ontario markets. These were offset by declines in Greater Vancouver, Calgary, Edmonton, Winnipeg, and Halifax-Dartmouth.

The actual (not seasonally adjusted) number of transactions in August 2022 came in 24.7% below the same month last year. While still a large decline, it was smaller than the 29.4% year-over-year drop recorded in July. "August saw national sales hold steady month-to-month for the first time since February which, along with a stabilization of demand/supply conditions in many markets, could be an early sign that this year's sharp adjustment in housing markets across Canada may have mostly run its course," said Jill Oudil, Chair of CREA. "That said, some buyers may choose to remain on the sidelines until they see clearer signs of borrowing costs and prices also stabilizing. On Monday, September 12, 2022, at approximately 2:15 p.m., police responded to reports of a shooting at the Tim Hortons restaurant located at 3110 Argentia Road in Mississauga. 48-year-old Toronto Police Constable Andrew Hong of Traffic Services, was found deceased inside the restaurant. Constable Hong was instructing at a Police Motorcycle Operations Course sponsored by Peel Regional Police. Constable Hong was on his lunch break when the suspect ambushed and shot him at close range. Shortly after this incident, the suspect fled to a nearby parking lot and, while carjacking a Black SUV, shot the male driver before fleeing the scene. That male was transported to a trauma centre, where he underwent surgery for his injuries. He remains in stable condition and has life-altering injuries. At approximately 2:50pm, the Halton Regional Police Service responded to multiple reports of a shooting at an auto shop in Milton which resulted in the tragic death of 38-year-old father and business owner Shakeel Ashraf. Two other victims were transported to hospital. Satwinder Singh, 28, international student later died in hospital. Other victim remain in critical and serious conditions and police are not releasing the names at this time. The suspect was later located in Hamilton and was later pronounced deceased as a result of an interaction with police while attempting to take him into custody. The Special Investigations Unit is now investigating.

The Runs are set to take place within the upcoming days and weeks.

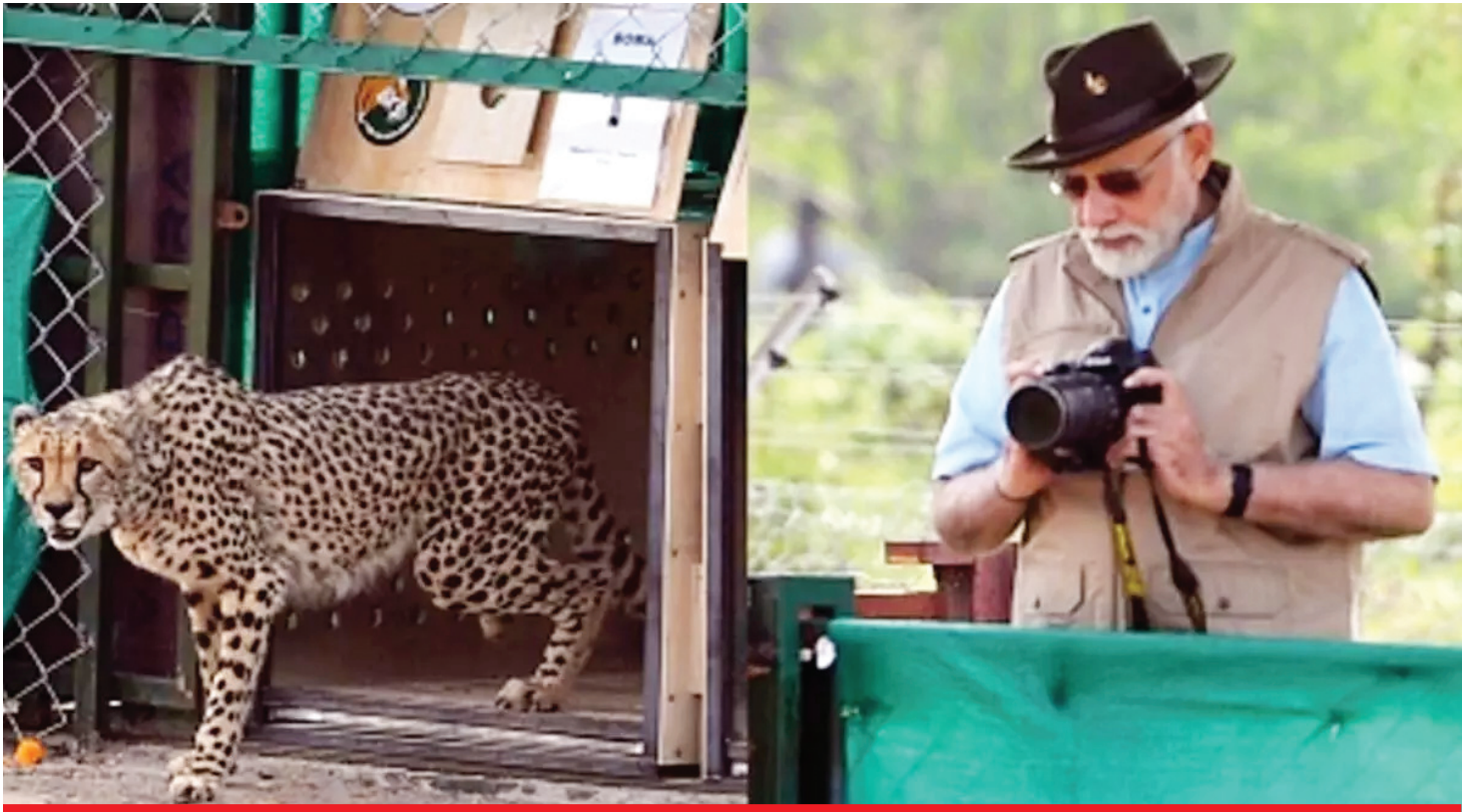

CHEETAHS BACK ON INDIAN SOIL AFTER 70 YEARS: PM MODI

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday said cheetahs are back on Indian soil after 70 years and the move will lead to restoration of forest and grassland ecosystems.

The Prime Minister released the big cats — five male and three female, brought from Namibia, into enclosures of Madhya Pradesh’s Kuno National Park and termed it endeavour towards environment and wildlife conservation.

Prime Minister Modi said, “Cheetahs had become extinct from the country in 1952, but for decades, no meaningful effort was made to rehabilitate them. Today, as we celebrate ‘Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav’, the country has started rehabilitating cheetahs with a new energy.” He said that tourists and wildlife enthusiasts will have to wait a few months before they can see cheetahs at KNP.

“Bringing Cheetahs back to India will help in the restoration of open forest and grassland ecosystems and also lead to enhanced livelihood opportunities for the local community,” the Prime Minister added. He said ‘Project Cheetah’ is the world’s first inter-continental large wild carnivore translocation project.

Notably, the special event was scheduled for September 17 to mark Prime Minister Modi’s 72nd birthday.

The felines will be living under an earmarked area of KNP for two weeks after which they will be released in the park.

According to a senior forest officer in Madhya Pradesh: “Cheetahs will be living in an earmarked area under KNP for two weeks. Once they will adapt to the climate of this area, they will be released into the park.” All cheetahs have special radio-collar fitted to their necks so that their movement can be easily located. Their health and movement will be monitored every day by a special joint team of African and Indian wild animals experts,” the senior forest officer added. Spread over 748 square km in the vast forest landscape of Madhya Pradesh, KNP is the new home of the eight cheetahs. Notably, the region is very close to the Sal forests of Koriya in Chhattisgarh,

CITING ‘GENERAL SENTIMENT’, MORE STATE UNITS BACK RAHUL FOR CONGRESS CHIEF

Amid strong indications that Thiruvananthapuram MP Shashi Tharoor is considering contesting elections for the Congress president’s post, two more state units — Haryana and Jharkhand — on Tuesday passed resolutions backing Rahul Gandhi for the post.

Party leaders in Kerala indicated that the state unit is in favour of Rahul taking up the post he had relinquished in 2019, after Congress’s drubbing in the General Election. Former Leader of Opposition in Kerala Assembly, Ramesh Chennithala, told the media in Alappuzha that the general feeling in the state unit of the party is that Rahul Gandhi should take the helms. “There is no need to pass a resolution in this regard, as some other state units have done. It is up to Tharoor to speak out whether he is contesting to become the party’s national president,” he said.

Lok Sabha MP from Vadakara in Kerala and former Pradesh Congress Committee (PCC) president, K Muraliedharan, said, “Whoever contests for the post, only a person with support of the Nehru (Gandhi) family will become the president.”

In Chandigarh, the Haryana unit (HPCC) passed two resolutions: one requesting Rahul to take over as party chief while considering “sentiments of all”, and a second empowering the Congress president to appoint PCC office-bearers. Announcing the resolution, HPCC president Udai Bhan told the media, “The resolution to make Rahul Gandhi the party’s national president was unanimously passed. In the meeting, all of us agreed that we urge Rahul Gandhi to file the nomination for the post of president.” The PCCs in Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Tamil Nadu, Bihar, Maharashtra and J&K have already passed similar resolutions.

In Ranchi, the party’s Jharkhand in-charge, Avinash Pandey said, “All our leaders in unanimity decided and passed a resolution that Rahul Gandhi should be AICC chief.” Stating that party leaders and workers in Jharkhand want Rahul as AICC president, PCC chief Rajesh Thakur said, “He should decide on PCC chiefs, too.”

where the native Asiatic Cheetah was last spotted almost 70 years ago. As per the forest officials in Madhya Pradesh, KNP was chosen as suitable destination for cheetahs after a survey of nearly a dozen national parks located in Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan, Gujarat, and Uttar Pradesh.

“These surveys were carried between 2010 and 2012. Later, it was observed that Kuno was the suitable destination. It was the most preferred habitat based on the assessment carried out by the Wildlife Institute of India and Wildlife Trust of India (WTI) based on climatic variables, prey densities, population of competing predators, and the historical range,” the officer said.

Kuno is probably one of the few wildlife sites in the country where there has been a complete relocation of roughly 24 villages and their domesticated livestock from inside the park years ago. The village sites and their agricultural fields have now been taken over by grasses and are managed as savannah habitats.

According to the government’s plan, Kuno offers the prospect of housing four large felines in India — tiger, lion, leopard and cheetah — and ensuring they coexist as they did in the past. While the only surviving population of lions is in Gujarat, Kuno was initially proposed to provide a second home. The forest has a significant population of leopards with a density of about nine leopards per 100 square km. This remains a concern, taking into account, that the much-stronger leopard has an advantage over the slender cheetah, whose strength mainly lies in its blazingly fast speed. They are also believed to have more adaptive potential and a wider habitat than the cheetah.

Madhya Pradesh Governor Mangubhai Pate, Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan; Union Ministers — Narendra Singh Tomar, Bhupender Yadav, Jyotiraditya M Scindia and Ashwini Choubey — were among those present on the occasion.

The Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister on Friday had said, “We were a tiger state, a leopard state and now becoming a Cheetah state.”



Leaders from the G-23 grouping have not found much support in the party’s Kerala unit. While former Rajya Sabha member P J Kurien has not been active in the party, another veteran Congressman, K V Thomas, who had raised a rebellion against Rahul, has been completely sidelined. In Chandigarh, former Haryana CM and Leader of Opposition in the Assembly, Bhupinder Singh Hooda, said: “The party will welcome its leader, Rahul Gandhi, and all those participating in the ongoing Bharat Jodo Yatra when it reaches Haryana. There will be an unprecedented presence of Congress workers to welcome the Yatra.” On the occasion, the party’s state unit also finalised the list of 195 delegates to bolster its rank and file at the ground level.

The resolution was passed at the a meeting of new representatives and MLAs of HPCC under chairmanship of former MP Tarachand Bhagora, the Pradesh Returning Officer (PRO), Hooda, state unit chief Udai Bhan, HPCC working presidents, MLAs and senior leaders.

The proposal was presented unanimously and authorises the Congress president to nominate the HPCC president, vice-president, treasurer, executive member, state election committee and AICC members from the state. Senior leaders approved it and all delegates unanimously passed the resolution by raising their hands, it was informed.

Niira Radia tapes: Supreme Court directs CBI to file status report on probe into intercepted conversations

The Supreme Court of India on Wednesday (September 21) directed the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) to file a status report on the investigation into intercepted conversations of corporate lobbyist Niira Radia.

A three-judge bench headed by Justice DY Chandrachud was hearing a plea filed by industrialist Ratan Tata seeking protection of right to privacy in view of the emergence of the Radia tapes. “We will have it after the vacations as there is a Constitution Bench next week. Meanwhile, the CBI may file an updated status report,” said the bench also comprising Justices Hima Kohli and PS Narasimha.

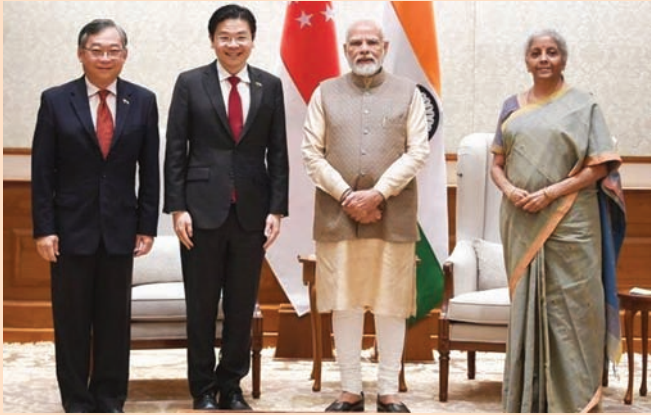
The matter is posted for next hearing on October 12. Additional Solicitor General Aishwarya Bhati, appearing for the Centre, submitted that the petition may be disposed of in the light of the right to privacy judgment of the apex court. The apex court in 2017 has unanimously delivered its judgment in Justice (retired) KS Puttaswamy case, holding that privacy is a constitutionally protected right. “I must inform you that the CBI was directed by your lordship to investigate all these conversations. Fourteen preliminary inquiries were registered and the report was placed before your lordships in a sealed cover. No criminality was found in those. Also, now there are phone-tapping guidelines in place,” Bhati said.

At the outset, the counsel, appearing for Tata, sought an adjournment. The counsel for the petitioner informed the apex court that there is another petition filed by NGO Centre for Public Interest Litigation (CPIL), which had sought that these transcripts be made public in the larger public interest. Advocate Prashant Bhushan, appearing for the CPIL, said Radia was a corporate lobbyist for two of the most important companies and there were attempts to influence public persons etc. which was revealed.

The top court was hearing Tata’s petition seeking action against those involved in the leakage of the tapes alleging the leakage amounts to infringement of his fundamental right to life, which includes the right to privacy under Article 21 of the Constitution. He had contended that as a corporate lobbyist Radia’s phone was tapped for probing alleged tax evasion and the tapes cannot be used for any other purpose.



INDIA-SINGAPORE MINISTERIAL DELEGATION MEETS PM MODI



A joint India-Singapore ministerial delegation, including Singapore’s Deputy Prime Minister Lawrence Wong, who is also the island nation’s Finance Minister, called on Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday. The ministers briefed the Prime Minister about the outcomes of the inaugural session of the India-Singapore Ministerial Roundtable (ISMR), which was held here on September 17. This is Wong’s first visit to India in his capacity as the Deputy Prime Minister. “The establishment of the ISMR is a path-breaking initiative which was envisioned by Modi and reflects the unique nature of the India-Singapore bilateral relationship. The ministers briefed the Prime Minister about the wide-ranging discussions held, especially in emerging areas of digital connectivity, fintech, green economy, skill development and food security,” a statement issued by the Prime Minister’s office said. The Prime Minister conveyed his appreciation and hoped that initiatives like ISMR would help further strengthen the bilateral relations between the two countries. He also conveyed his good wishes for Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong and the people of Singapore.

PUNJAB TO START PADDY PROCUREMENT FROM OCT 1



In view of the impending paddy procurement season commencing from October 1, Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Tuesday reviewed the arrangements aimed at hassle free and seamless procurement of paddy.

“Every grain produced with the sweat and toil of the Punjabi farmer shall be purchased,” he said while chairing a meeting. Emphasising speedy purchase, the Chief Minister directed that purchase, lifting, and payment should commence from the first day of procurement itself and warned of strict action if any farmer is put to any inconvenience.

Presiding over a meeting of officials of procurement agencies, he directed the state procurement agencies and the FCI to be fully geared up for procurement of paddy in the ensuing season. He expressed satisfaction that the state had already arranged sufficient ‘bardana’ for the season well in advance and directed its optimal placement across the state in all mandis.

AAP MLA AMANATULLAH KHAN SENT TO 5-DAY CUSTODY; AIDE ARRESTED UNDER ARMS ACT FROM TELANGANA



A Delhi court on Wednesday sent Amanatullah Khan to a 5-day remand after the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) had sought 10 days of custody of AAP MLA. The Bureau told the court that Khan has been very evasive during questioning.

The department said that it will also videograph all his statements. ACB told the court that a cosmo developer who made property in Uttarakhnad had an entry in name of Amanatullah. “The roots also go to Dubai.... money has gone outside India... one Zeeshan Haider is there, he has received crores of rupees...” it told the court. “A person maintaining day-to-day diary can’t be thrown away like this... sale deeds have been found...” ACB counsel said while being continuously opposed by Khan’s counsel. Meanwhile, as the MLA was produced in the court, the Delhi Police nabbed Khan’s close aide Kaushar Imam Siddique from Telangana, officials said. Kaushar Imam Siddique alias Laddan, 47, a resident of Jogabai Extension, was wanted in a case of Arms Act registered against him after a country-made pistol and three live rounds were found in his premises, they said. “We have apprehended Laddan from Telangana in connection with an FIR registered against him under the Arms Act,” a senior police officer said. Kaushar Imam Siddique alias Laddan, 47, a resident of Jogabai Extension, was wanted in a case of Arms Act registered against him after a country-made pistol and three live rounds were found in his premises, they said. “We have apprehended Laddan from Telangana in connection with an FIR registered against him under the Arms Act,” a senior police officer said.

The development comes days after the Anti Corruption Branch (ACB) arrested Khan following raids at four places in connection with alleged irregularities in the recruitment to the Delhi Waqf Board, including that of its chairman. Police had last Friday registered three FIRs after the ACB raid.

'TODAY'S ERA IS NOT OF WAR': PM MODI ADVISES RUSSIA'S PRESIDENT PUTIN

Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday told Russian President Vladimir Putin that now is not a time for war, with food, fertilizer and fuel security among the major concerns of the world at present. "I know that today's era is not an era of war, and I have spoken to you on the phone about this," Modi told Putin on the sidelines of a regional security bloc summit in Uzbekistan, adding that democracy, diplomacy and dialogue keep the world together. Putin said that he understood Modi's concerns about the Ukraine war. "I know about your position on the conflict in Ukraine, and I know about your concerns. We want all of this to end as soon as possible." PM Modi and Putin spoke on the sidelines of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) meeting, whose permanent members, besides India, include China, Russia, Pakistan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan. "Our trade is growing, thanks to your additional supplies of Russian fertilisers to the Indian markets, which have grown more than eight fold. I am hopeful that this is going to be of huge help of the agricultural sector of India," Putin said.



PUTIN WILLING TO END WAR IN UKRAINE, CLAIMS TURKISH PRESIDENT ERDOGAN

Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan has said that he believes the Russian President is seeking an end to the war he began in Ukraine, and that a "significant step" will be made, media reports said. Erdogan said his impression from his recent talks with Vladimir Putin is that the Russian leader wants to "end this as soon as possible", BBC reported. With Ukraine recapturing swathes of its territory this month, the Turkish leader indicated that things are "quite problematic" for Russia. Erdogan spoke of having "very extensive discussions" with Putin at a summit in Uzbekistan last week. In an interview, the Turkish leader said he gained the impression that the Russian President wants a speedy end to the war. "He is actually showing me that he's willing to end this as soon as possible," Erdogan said, adding, "That was my impression, because the way things are going right now are quite problematic," BBC reported.

He also said 200 "hostages" would soon be exchanged between the two sides. Erdogan gave no further detail of who all would be included in such a prisoner swap. Erdogan has repeatedly sought to mediate during the war, promoting a "balanced" stance for Nato member Turkey, while opposing Western sanctions on Russia. He helped the UN mediate a resumption of grain exports from Ukraine and said last week that he is trying to organise direct ceasefire talks. Meanwhile, two months after Russian forces seized control over the entire eastern region of Luhansk, Ukraine has reclaimed part of the territory. Luhansk's Ukrainian leader Serhiy Haidai said Russian forces have retreated from the village of Bilohorivka – but are doing all they could to dig in elsewhere, BBC reported. Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelensky said "the occupiers are clearly in panic".

UK’S QUEEN ELIZABETH II LAID TO REST AFTER GRAND FAREWELL

There she was to be laid to rest at the royal chapel next to her beloved husband Prince Phillip, who predeceased her in 2021. Only members of the British royal family, led by her successor King Charles III, attended the private ceremony. Earlier, in an hour long church service at the Abbey, which has existed and expanded since 960 AD and is located in central London, Elizabeth, who reigned for 70 years, was given the grandest of final farewells. She had got married at the same Abbey 75 years ago. President of India Droupadi Murmu was present at the proceedings. Compared to other Commonwealth heads of government or state, she unassumingly arrived early at the venue, wearing a dark blue silk sari and a cardigan. She took her appointed seat in the midst of 2,000 assembled invitees. On Sunday evening, she attended a reception hosted by Charles and Queen Consort Camilla for 500 foreign dignitaries. Charles greeted the President warmly and was seen engaged in a brief conversation with her. In an Anglican Christian service, with leaders of multiple religions in the audience, Baroness Patricia Scotland, Secretary General of the Commonwealth – an organisation near and dear to Elizabeth – read the first lesson from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians about the resurrection of Jesus Christ. She was followed by the British Prime Minister Liz Truss, who read a passage from John, which said: 'Let not your heart be troubled...'


US PRESIDENT BIDEN WARNS PUTIN AGAINST USE OF CHEMICAL OR NUCLEAR WEAPONS

US President Joe Biden has warned his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin against the use of chemical or tactical nuclear weapons in the ongoing war with Ukraine that has stretched to more than six months now. "Don't. Don't. Don't. You will change the face of war unlike anything since World War II," Biden said. Biden gave an interview to CBS News anchor Scott Pelley at the White House which will be aired on Sunday. Biden's reaction came soon after Pelley asked what the consequences would be if Putin crossed the line. Biden said: "You think I would tell you if I knew exactly what it would be? Of course, I'm not gonna tell you. It'll be consequential. They'll become more of a pariah in the world than they ever have been. And depending on the extent of what they do will determine what response would occur." Biden and Pelley discussed a host of issues beyond the war in Ukraine, including the economy and the upcoming midterm elections. The Biden administration has announced another \$600 million in military aid to help the Ukrainian army maintain momentum against Russia. In the interview for this Sunday's '60 Minutes', Pelley spoke to Biden about Ukraine's recent battlefield success – and the dangers that could arise. "As Ukraine succeeds on the battlefield, Vladimir Putin is becoming embarrassed being pushed into a corner," Pelley told Biden. "And I wonder, Mr President, what you would say to him if he is considering using chemical or tactical nuclear weapons." "Don't. Don't. Don't. You will change the face of war unlike anything since World War II," Biden replied. Biden also told Pelley about his efforts to avert a national railroad strike. On Thursday, the President had announced that a tentative deal has been reached between the railroads and rail workers' unions after 20 hours of negotiations in the US Department of Labour. "We brought business and labour together," the President told Pelley.

The deposed prime minister is today like a man watching fire engulf his neighbourhood without thinking about the possibility of the fire reaching his own abode. There is as much a chance of Imran's resurrection as Prime Minsiter as the chances of an end to his political career. Imran Khan has been consistently demanding early national polls which he believes can put him back in the power saddle. Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif right now is the most unpopular leader in the country because of the tough measures he has taken to arrest the economic slide that had started under Imran. These decisions will breathe fresh life into the economy over the next six-seven months if everything goes well. Naturally, therefore, Shehbaz is in no hurry to hold the polls, which, in the normal course are due next year. However, Imran is a man in a hurry. He is firing on all cylinders, cashing in on the conspiracy theories he had held responsible for his exit from power. On his part, Shehbaz has put his act together and almost checkmated him by hoisting a host of cases. In a clever maneuver, Imran is trying to befriend the Army. "Give extension to the Army Chief Gen Bajwa," is his new war cry.

2022 People's Choice Awards, Platform Prize, NETPAC, and FIPRESCI, IMDbPro Short Cuts, Canada Goose Amplify Voices Awards, and Shawn Mendes Foundation Changemaker Awards close the Festival

The Toronto International Film Festival® has announced its award recipients for the 47th edition of the Festival, which concluded last evening with the Closing Night screening of Mary Harron's *Dalland* at the Visa Screening Room at the Princess of Wales Theatre and Roy Thomson Hall.

The sweeping range in cinematic storytelling from around the world is a testament to the uniqueness of the films that are being made. We're so grateful and proud of this year's Festival."

IMDbPro SHORT CUTS AWARDS

The 2022 IMDbPro Short Cuts Awards are for Best Film, Best Canadian Film, and the Share Her Journey Award for best film by a woman. Each winning film will receive a bursary of \$10,000 CAD and a one-year membership to IMDbPro, the essential resource for entertainment industry professionals, to help them continue achieving success in their careers. AMPLIFY VOICES AWARDS PRESENTED BY CANADA GOOSE

The film's realist style captures an everyday man who begins to see the maddening cycle of star ratings and delivery quotas for the hollow incentives they are, slowly opening up to ideas about workers' rights and solidarity. 'Zwigato' sounds like a straightforward film, but it is not. Our everyday lives are layered with societal elements we take for granted. The movie explores the lives of those who have been ignored to the point that we, as a society, have taken humanity entirely out of the equation. Nandita Das tells Y Media she considers herself a social advocate, and through her work as an actor and a director, she tries to address the concerns that affect society. In an exclusive interview, Das informs Y Media she believes the cinema's job is to engage. Festivals like TIFF are "a great way of sharing one's work of seeing other films. Films are a great way of learning about different cultures and ideas, and it's the better thing to travel." 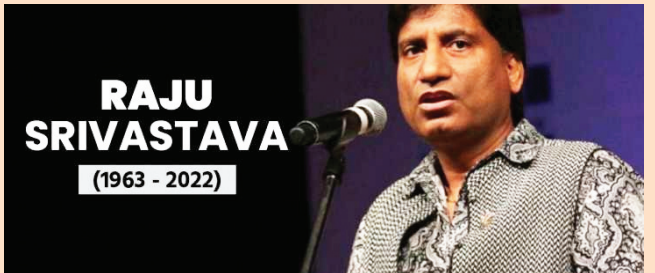

RAJU SRIVASTAVA DIES: AFTER MAKING MILLIONS LAUGH, COMEDIAN PASSES AWAY AT 58



Popular stand-up comedian Raju Srivastava passed away at 58. He suffered a sudden heart attack on August 10 following which he was rushed to AIIMS Delhi. His postmortem was done at AIIMS on Wednesday. Dr Sudhir Gupta, Head, Department of Forensic Medicine, said, "Raju Srivastav's post-mortem has been done with a new technique called Virtual Autopsy. It does not require any dissection. The whole process took 15 to 20 minutes, after which the body was handed over to his family." Last month, after he was admitted to the hospital, the actor was immediately shifted to ICU and was on life support. He did not gain consciousness for over 40 days and despite doctors' efforts, his health kept deteriorating even days after he suffered a heart attack. Doctors had shared that he has suffered brain damage following the heart attack. He was declared dead at 10:20 am on September 21, according to hospital sources.

SWARA BHASKER ON ATTACKS AGAINST KARAN JOHAR: 'YOUR DISLIKE DOESN'T MEAN HE IS A MURDERER'

Actor Swara Bhasker has called the boycott trend plaguing Bollywood as a sort of mob mentality. These hate campaigns are said to be one of the main reasons why big budget films like *Laal Singh Chaddha* and *Raksha Bandhan* flopped at the box office. Aamir Khan's 2015 statement on intolerance in India was dug up and used to fuel the hatred against his film, despite the actor's apologies. In a recent interview, Swara, who was recently seen in the film *Jahaan Char Yaar*, opened up about the boycott trend and said that Bollywood is under attack. Talking to Connect FM Canada, Swara said, "There's an atmosphere of fear. This is an industry—there is this idea of not engaging in controversy. There is a genuine belief that the industry has, that if there's a controversy happening, it's best not to bother about it."

INDIA WOMEN VS PAKISTAN WOMEN SET FOR T20 ASIA CUP

The Indian Women are all set to take on arch-rivals Pakistan on October 7 in Women's T20 Asia Cup, Asian Cricket Council president Jay Shah announced on Tuesday. Seven teams will take part in the 15-day tournament, starting on October 1. The tournament will be held in a round-robin format with the top four teams qualifying for the semifinals. The teams playing in the tournament are India, Pakistan, hosts Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, UAE, Thailand and Malaysia. Afghanistan doesn't have a women's team since the Taliban took over.

India start the campaign on an opening day against Sri Lanka. They next play Malaysia (October 3) and UAE (October 4) on successive days before taking on Pakistan. India plays hosts Bangladesh on October 8 and the round-robin game against minnows Thailand is on October 10. The Harmanpreet Kaur-led side will play six league games in 10 days before the probable semifinals on either October 11 or 13th. The final is slated for October 15. Meanwhile, Harmanpreet Kaur-led side is gearing up for the 2nd ODI vs England.

WADE, GREEN POWER AUS TO 4 WICKET WIN OVER INDIA; LEAD SERIES 1-0

Australia started the 3-match T20I series vs India with a bang as the high-flying Kangaroos defeated the Men in Blue by 4 wickets to record their highest-ever chase in T20 cricket. vs India. Led by Green's 61 off just 30 deliveries at the start and Wade's 45 off just 21 balls at the end, Australia chased down a mammoth total of 209 with as many as four balls to spare. Australia won the toss and opted to bowl first. Batting first, KL Rahul and Hardik Pandya's audacious strokeplay helped India post a daunting 208 for six in the first T20 International against Australia. With his strike rate under the scanner, Rahul made a statement with a high-quality 55 off 35 balls before Hardik smashed an unbeaten 71 off just 30 balls, including five sixes. Suryakumar Yadav also played some breathtaking strokes in his 46 off 25 balls. After Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli fell cheaply, Rahul and Suryakumar shared a 68-run stand off 42 balls. It was raining sixes when they were in the middle. Rahul's walk across the stumps to dispatch Josh Hazlewood over the cow corner made his intent clear before he whipped Cameron Green for a massive six over deep square leg. Suryakumar's style of play is often awe-inspiring and the Mohali crowd got to see him at his lethal best. Out of his four sixes, his swat over fine leg off a good length ball from Cummins stood out. India was able to maintain their tempo in the middle overs as Suryakumar picked up leggie Adam Zampa for two successive sixes in the long on and deep midwicket.

ROHIT SHARMA DISAPPOINTS, YET REACHES MILESTONE TO RECORD MOST T20I SIXES

Rohit Sharma had yet another forgettable day at the office after he was dismissed for just 11 of nine deliveries in the first T20I between India and Australia. Despite the disappointing note, Rohit created history by going level with Martin Guptill for most sixes at the international level in the T20 format. The Indian skipper now has 172 sixes to his name along with Guptill and could have gone past him before Hazlewood got the better of him. Before the match, Rohit needed two sixes to go level with the Kiwi batter as he was residing with 171 sixes. On the fourth ball of the second over Rohit did not sit back and smashed pat Cummins for six that was misjudged by the fielder. This resulted in the 35-year-old going level with Guptill on 172.

NEW T20I JERSEY FOR TEAM INDIA UNVEILED



The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) and MPL Sports, the official kit sponsor of the national cricket team, here on Sunday unveiled the official jersey of the side for all India T20I men's and women's matches. For the first time in Indian cricket history, the jersey was unveiled not by the national team, but by the Mumbai Under-19 women's cricket players along with some of the 'superfans' of the game. The jersey comes in shades of the iconic and fan-favourite blue colour for a look befitting the champions of the game. Termed as 'One Blue Jersey', it will make its debut on the pitch during the first match of the upcoming T20 series against Australia on September 20. The new one replaces the Billion Cheers Jersey at all T20 International competitions. However, the players will continue to sport the Billion Cheers Jersey in ODIs. "The jersey pays homage to the legions of fans that span different genders and age groups, and transcend geographical borders," the kit sponsor said in a release. "It is styled with a pattern of equilateral triangles – a universal symbol of the blend of energy, spirit and power – that celebrates the unswerving support of the fans who have stood behind the team through thick and thin," it added. Combined with petals found in the BCCI's official insignia, the jersey embodies the loyalty and merit that the game demands. It will be available for purchase at kit sponsor's official website and at all leading e-commerce and retail outlets.

SUNIL GAVASKAR FEELS DEATH BOWLING IS MAJOR CONCERN FOR TEAM INDIA

The Rohit Sharma-led Indian team clashed with the Aussies at Mohali on September 20, 2022, in the series opener of the three-match T20I series. India got off to a flyer and they ended up scoring 208 runs courtesy of Suryakumar Yadav, KL Rahul, and Hardik Pandya's brutal striking of the cricket ball. Even on a batting-friendly wicket, it looked like a total that was challenging, but the Indian bowlers and fielders made a complete mockery of it. Australia won the match by 4 wickets and with 4 legal deliveries left. Cameron Green who was opening the batting with Aaron Finch in the absence of David Warner scored 61 off 30 deliveries. But it was the last-minute assault by Matthew Wade that acted as the final nail in the coffin. India leaked runs and at no stage, Australia looked in any kind of difficulty and they chased the target down with ease. Bhuvneshwar Kumar, the spearhead of the Indian attack in particular conceded 52 runs in 4 overs. This performance hasn't gone down too well with Indian batting legend Sunil Gavaskar. He has addressed Bhuvneshwar's performance as an area of concern for team India.

SURYAKUMAR YADAV SAILS PAST BABAR AZAM IN T20I RANKINGS, KL RAHUL MAKES INROADS

In the recently MRF Tyres ICC Men's Player Rankings India's Suryakumar Yadav has sailed past Pakistan's skipper Babar Azam in the men's T20I batter's list. Yadav has now reached the third spot in the rankings while Azam has slipped down to the fourth spot. Suryakumar Yadav has 780 points in his name, 9 more than Azam and is now only behind South Africa's Aiden Markram (792 points) and Pakistan's Mohammad Rizwan (825 points). Moreover, India's opening batter KL Rahul has also made inroads in the rankings released on Wednesday as the right-handed batter has raised five spots to now rank 18th in the batter's tally. Rahul now has 587 points in his name, two more than 19th placed Brandon King and two less than 17th placed Afghanistan's Rahmanullah Gurbaz.

JASPRIT BUMRAH DESERVES SOME MORE RECOVERY TIME FEELS HARDIK PANDYA

It was carnage, absolute carnage from the Aussies in the series opener of the three-match T20I series that is currently underway. An injury-plagued Australian team pulled off a miraculous chase leaving the men in blue stunned. On a batting-friendly pitch at Mohali, India had amassed a total of 208/6 by the end of 20 overs. But once Australia started their innings, they made a complete mockery out of a total that certainly didn't look that easy to chase. Apart from Axar Patel, every bowler was smacked for runs and registered an economy over 10. That sums up the story of India's bowling in the first T20I against World Champions Australia. To add more salt to the injury, it was the display of sloppy fielding from the Indian team that cost them the game. Suddenly, there is a lot of conjecture around Bumrah's fitness and the latest developments in his recovery process. As of now, without Jasprit Bumrah the Indian bowling looks timid and the pace attack is in dire need of some firepower.
